## DETERMINATION OF THE QUARRY BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 26th March, 1920, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of quarrying, not including agriculture," has made the following Determination, namely:—

Note.—The powers of the Board were extended by the Governor in Council to enable it to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in carting or driving, or assisting in carting or driving, in connexion with or incidental to the trade or business of quarrying (not including agriculture)."

(1) That on the 26th March, 1920, the last and all previous Quarry Determinations shall be revoked and replaced by this

<sup>(3.)</sup> Overtime.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours, and thereafter time and a half.

<sup>(4.)</sup> Special Rates for Sundays and Public Holidays.—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Good Friday, or Easter Monday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

Pitchers or cubes tied to any definite length which exceeds the average of the lengths specified in any particular item shown above shall be paid for at the rate of 2s. 6d. per hundred in addition to the respective prices specified opposite the said item.

All stone for pitchers or cubes shall be plugged and placed on the banker ready for persons engaged knocking out and dressing.
