PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the *Acts Interpretation Act* 1919 it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may declare what date is to be treated as the date of the termination of the war (at the passing of the said Act then subsisting between His Majesty and among others the State of Germany) between His Majesty and any particular State which date it is provided shall be as nearly as may be the date declared by His Majesty in Council under the provisions of the Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom in the said section named: And whereas by notice in the *London Gazette* of the 10th day of January, 1920, it is notified that His Majesty has by and with the advice of His Privy Council declared under the provisions of the Act referred to that January the 10th, 1920, is to be treated as the date of the termination of war between His Majesty and the State of Germany:

Now therefore I, Sir William Hill Irvine, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare under and for the purposes intended by the *Acts Interpretation Act* 1919, that Saturday, the 10th January, 1920, is to be treated as the date of the termination of war between His Majesty the King and the particular State of Germany without reference to the status resulting in the case of other belligerents.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid this sixteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty, and in the tenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

ALTERATIONS TO BY-LAWS AND CONSTITUTION.

NEW By-law 9a.—Members residing outside the metropolitan area (which, for the purposes of this Constitution, shall mean the suburban area as defined by the Victorian Railways Commissioners), and also clergymen, shall be charged half the annual fee.

Substitute for By-law 10.—The business of the Association shall be conducted by a Board of eighteen members. Substitute for By-law 15.—The Board shall have power to elect and employ a General Secretary for the Association and such other officers as may be required, including branch or executive secretaries, and to fix and from time to time alter the remuneration to be paid such officers. All persons so appointed must be qualified as active members, and shall only hold office during the pleasure of the Board.

Alteration of By-law 16.—After the word "for" in the second line add the words "the establishment of branches." After the word "of" in the third line add the words "Branch of Executive Secretaries or Assistants." After the word "Association" in the fourth line add "or Branch." At the end add the words "no contract, debt, or obligation shall be binding on the Association unless contracted by the authority of the Board."

SECTION IV. (A).—BRANCHES.

New By-law 18a.—The Board of Directors may establish and maintain Branches within the metropolitan area as hereinbefore defined, and may organize and discontinue such Branches when it seems to it advisable.

New By-law 18b.—Branches shall be under the control of the Board of Directors, the work of each Branch being determined in detail by a Branch Committee appointed by the President, with the consent of the Board of Directors.

New By-law 18c.—The Board of Directors may from time to time prescribe general rules by which Branch Committees shall be governed.

New By-law 18d.—No organization shall be formed within or in connexion with any Branch except by the Branch Committee thereof, and all such organizations shall be under the control of the committee, and their Constitutions and Rules shall be subject to the approval of the committee, which shall have power to control or overrule any action of any such organization which it deems detrimental to the interest of the Branch.

New By-law 18e.—Members of the Branch Committee of each Branch shall be members *ex officio* of all organizations within such Branch.

DETERMINATION OF THE BEDSTEADMAKERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination, on the 2nd day of April, 1920, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts: the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to “determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (including the moulders of bedsteads and excluding the moulders of fenders) employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof,” has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 2nd day of April, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

DEFINITION.—*Juvenile Workers*.—Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) who, if females, are employed as wrappers, or, if males, are employed in (a) chipping or casting; (b) wrapping, packing, or moving material; or (c) cleaning, heating, or closing tubes, angle or bar-iron.

(3) *Overtime*.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

(4) *Special Rates*.—That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, Good Friday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(5) *Piece-work*.—The Board determines, under the provisions of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates fixed by the Board for such work.
