Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE ELECTRICAL SUPPLY BOARD.

Note.—This Determination, on the 9th April, 1920, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in—

(a) the generation or distribution of electricity,
(b) the manufacture, repair, or maintenance of electrical appliances when such work is done by generators, distributers, or installers."

has made the following Determination, namely:-

(1) That on the 9th April, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
