Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE COUNTRY SHOP ASSISTANTS BOARD.

Nores.—(a) This Determination, on the 16th April, 1920, applied to the whole of the State outside and excepting the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

\_(b) The following are Fourth Schedule Shops :-

Confectionery and Pastry shops, Eating-houses, Fish and Oystershops, Flower shops, Fruit and Vegetable shops, Booksellers' and News Agents' shops, Cooked Meat (other than tinned meat) shops.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in or in connexion with a shop (other than a Fourth Schedule Shop) as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter," has made the following Determination, viz.:—

(1) That on the 16th April, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this
