REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO DEFENCE OF DESTITUTE PERSONS CHARGED WITH CAPITAL CRIMES AND OF ABORIGINALS CHARGED WITH INDICTABLE OFFENCES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of April, 1920.

THE Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in lieu of the Regulations dated the nineteenth day of October, 1915, make the following Regulations:—

1. When any person charged with an offence punishable by death, or any aboriginal accused of an indictable offence, requires assistance from the Crown for his defence, he shall, seven days before the first day of the gaol delivery, Circuit Court, or Court of General Sessions at which he is to take his trial, or so soon as he shall know that he is to be tried for such offence, apply to the Sheriff for such assistance, and shall show to the satisfaction of such Sheriff that he is without sufficient means wherewith to employ legal assistance.

2. Upon the Sheriff being convinced of the truth of the allegations contained in such application, and having ascertained from the Crown Solicitor of the Clerk of the Peace, as the case may be, that the applicant is to be tried on a capital charge, or in the case of an aboriginal, that he is to be brought to trial, he shall—if the applicant nominate one legal practitioner to conduct his whole defence—communicate to such legal practitioner the desire of the applicant to be defended by him, together with the amount of fees to be allowed, and forward notice of the same to the Attorney-General. If, however, the applicant nominates two legal practitioners, one to act as solicitor and one as counsel, the Sheriff shall communicate to each of the legal practitioners so nominated the desire of the applicant, together with the amount of the fees to be allowed, and shall forward notice of the same to the Attorney-General.

3. If the applicant shall intimate to the Sheriff that he desires the person or persons so nominated to agree not to withdraw from the defence before the trial is concluded, the Sheriff shall request the said person or persons to agree accordingly.

If the said person or persons shall refuse to agree accordingly the Sheriff shall forthwith inform the applicant of such refusal, and shall require the applicant to nominate another or others in the place of the person or persons so refusing to agree, and shall proceed in the case of second and all subsequent nominations as in the case of the person or persons first nominated.

Provided that the applicant shall be at liberty to withdraw the said intimation and may re-nominate the first nominated person or persons.

4. If any person or persons so nominated shall make such agreement as aforesaid and shall break the same without cause or excuse appearing to the Attorney-General to be sufficient, then such breach shall be sufficient to justify the Attorney-General in not agreeing to pay or not paying the said person or persons should he or they be at any subsequent time nominated under these Regulations to defend any accused person.

5. The fees shall not (except in special cases, to be approved of by the Attorney-General before the trial) exceed the sum of £10 10s. where such barrister and solicitor conducts the whole case himself, or £14 14s. where the defence is conducted in Court by another barrister and solicitor briefed for the purpose. But if such barrister and solicitor is instructed by another barrister and solicitor who is his partner or employee, the fee shall not exceed £10 10s. in all, except in special cases to be approved by the Attorney-General before the trial.

6. The above sums are exclusive of the expenses of any witnesses whom the Judge or the Chairman of General Sessions presiding at the trial shall certify to have been material and necessary (which expenses shall be paid at the same rate as those of Crown witnesses).

7. The barrister and solicitor so engaged shall, after the trial, present his claim to the Sheriff by whom he was so engaged, and shall, when the claim is £14 14s. (or upwards), produce to the Sheriff a receipt for the fee paid to the barrister and solicitor who has conducted the case in Court.

8. Only those persons who comply with these Regulations shall be entitled to receive aid from the sum voted by Parliament.

9. Every gaoler shall, as soon as possible after the commitment for trial of any prisoner to whom these Regulations apply, communicate the purport of them to such prisoner.

And the Honorable H. S. W. Lawson, His Majesty's Solicitor-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC
RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF OUYEN.

WE, Henry Warren Pickering, Joseph Edwin Don, Bennett Oke, James Patrick O'Keefe, George Dickson Brown, William Maybell Gillespie, and George Rowe, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the township of Ouyen, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

(1) The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty-six in any year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

(2) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(3) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

(4) No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in and around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; and

(5) No person shall put in any reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall

be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(6) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(7) No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(8) No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(9) No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

(10) No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

(11) No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

(12) Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

(13) No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the Land Act 1915, on conviction by any Justice of Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against these Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable does not desist from so offending may forthwith be apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF RESERVE FOR RECREATION
PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF TUTYE.

WE, Matthew Magrath, Noel Smith Sharrock, Edwin H. Jones, Albert G. Parker, Walter H. McLeod, Albert B. Wedding, Fred Mossop, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Recreation purposes in the parish of Tutye, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

(1) The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

(2) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(3) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

(4) No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

(5) No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(6) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(7) No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(8) No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(9) No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

(10) No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

(11) No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

(12) Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall

be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by order given by the Committee of Management.

(13) No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAWS of The Melbourne Convalescents' Home for Men, a charitable institution incorporated under the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915*.

1. The name of the Institution is "The Melbourne Convalescents' Home for Men."
2. The object of the Institution is to assist male convalescents from public hospitals or elsewhere by affording them the benefit of country residence and rest, with a view to restoring their strength and fitting them for their daily work.
3. Males between the ages of 16 and 65 may be admitted to the Home, but the Council may in any particular case admit an applicant over the age of 65 years, but no person under the age of 16 years shall be eligible for admission under any circumstances.
4. The Council reserves the right to refuse to admit any applicant to the Home, and/or may at any time, without assigning any reason, compel any inmate to leave the Home.
5. Persons of unsound mind or those suffering from chronic or incurable disease, or who from any other reason shall be deemed by the Council to be unfit for a convalescent home, shall not be eligible for admission to the Home.
6. The Institution shall not provide medical attendance or nursing, but in an emergency a case may be referred to one of the honorary medical officers of the Institution till the inmate can be safely removed to a public hospital or his home.
7. Admission to the Home shall be regulated as follows:—
 - (a) Applications shall, in the first instance, be made to the Matron of the Home, who may admit or reject applicants.
 - (b) Applicants shall only be admitted when there is room at the Home.
 - (c) The Matron shall refer all doubtful or rejected cases to the President, who may admit or reject the applicant, or may refer the case to the Council to deal with.
 - (d) Applicants must produce a certificate from a medical practitioner in a form to be approved of from time to time by the Council, and such certificate shall be indorsed with a recommendation signed—
 - (i) by the President, or
 - (ii) by a life governor or member, or
 - (iii) by the secretary of any public hospital in which the applicant shall have been receiving treatment.
 - (e) Members may not recommend more than four applicants in any one year. Life governors may recommend six applicants during any one year. The President shall be unlimited as to recommendations.
 - (f) Admissions shall, in the first instance, be for a fortnight only (or less), but in any particular case the Council may in its absolute discretion extend the period of admission, but in no case shall such period (including any extension) exceed four weeks, and no applicant shall (unless with the consent of the Council) be eligible for a second period of admission during the same convalescence.
 - (g) Admissions shall be made regardless of nationality, creed, or religious belief.
8. A contribution of £1 1s. or upwards in any financial year shall constitute membership for that year only.
9. The Institution shall be managed by a Council (consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, and twenty members), a Secretary and a Treasurer, which two last-named offices may be combined. The President and Vice-Presidents shall be elected annually by the members at the annual meeting on a show of hands, but five members may demand a poll, in which event a poll shall be taken, at a time and place to be fixed by the Council, as near as may be in the same manner as is hereafter provided in the case of election of members of Council. The President and Vice-Presidents shall be *ex-officio* members of all Committees, and, failing the President, either Vice-Presidents may preside at all meetings of the Council and Committees.
10. Retirement of members of the Council and extraordinary vacancies shall be governed by sections 14 and 15 of Act 2660, which sections shall be deemed to be embodied in these By-laws.
11. The Council shall meet at least once a month, and five members shall form a quorum.
12. The Council shall be elected by ballot in the manner following:—
 - (a) A poll shall be taken at the annual meeting* of members, and shall remain open from a quarter of an hour before the time appointed for the meeting till a quarter of an hour after the close of the meeting.
 - (b) Candidates must be members of the Institution, and must be nominated by a member, in writing, addressed to the President, not later than the ordinary meeting of the Council next preceding the date appointed for the annual meeting.

- (c) If the number of nominations shall not exceed the number of vacancies, the President shall, at the annual meeting, declare the candidates nominated to be duly elected, and no poll shall be taken.
- (d) In the event of a poll, the Council shall, at its ordinary meeting next before the annual meeting of members, appoint a sub-committee of three of its members to conduct the election, and such sub-committee shall make all arrangements therefor, and provide ballot-papers, and make up a return of the votes at the conclusion of the poll.
- (e) At the close of the poll, the President, or a member of the Committee, shall announce the names of the candidates elected.
- (f) The declaration of the poll shall be final and binding, unless a notice of objection, in writing, giving full reasons for the objection, and accompanied by a fee of £1 ls., be handed to or left at the office of the Secretary within 24 hours after the election. The Council shall consider any objection and hear the objector and the candidates affected in person only, and any evidence the Council may desire. The decision of the Council shall be final and binding, and no reason for any decision need be given. The fee may be retained or returned at the discretion of the Council.
- (g) Before the annual meeting of members, the Council shall cause a voters' list to be made out containing the names of persons entitled to vote and the number of votes to which each is entitled.
- (h) Contributors who shall have paid their contributions for the financial year next preceding the date of the election, and members who shall have paid their contributions for the current financial year, shall be entitled to vote in proportion to their contributions as follows:—
Contributions of £1 ls., one vote; contributions of more than £1 ls. and less than £5 5s., two votes; contributions of £5 5s. or over, three votes.
Provided that no new member who has paid his or her contribution less than fourteen days before the date appointed for the annual meeting shall be entitled to have his or her name on the voters' list or to vote.
- (i) Life governors shall be entitled to three votes.
- (j) Ballot-papers shall contain the names of candidates arranged alphabetically. The voters shall strike out the name of the candidate he does not desire to vote for, and he shall leave on the paper as many names as there are vacancies to fill. A ballot-paper which shall have less or more than the required number of names on it shall be informal, and shall be rejected.
13. The Council may from time to time appoint as life governors persons who in any one year shall have contributed to the funds of the Institution £10 10s. or upwards, or who, in the opinion of the Council, shall have conferred on, or rendered to, the Institution some substantial benefit or services.
14. The present Treasurer, also the present Secretary, shall continue in office, and shall remain in office during the pleasure of the Council. These officers shall be *ex-officio* members of all Committees. The Council may appoint an Acting or Assistant Secretary or Treasurer, who shall hold office during the pleasure of the Council.
15. The solicitor to the Institution shall continue in office, and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Council.
16. The Council may appoint honorary medical officers annually, to whom all questions as to the state of health of the inmates may be referred, and who may be called in to attend any emergency cases of illness at the Home, and to advise the Council as to the desirability or otherwise of admitting or retaining at the Home any particular applicant or inmate, or as to any matter on which the Council may require medical advice. The present honorary medical officers shall continue in office till the first meeting of the Council after the annual meeting of members.
17. The Council may from time to time—
- Formulate rules for its own proceedings and for the management of the Home.
 - Assess the contributions to be made by an applicant before or after admission, and fix the conditions of free admissions.
 - Appoint Visiting Committees and define their duties.
 - Appoint matrons and other officers at the Home and fix their remuneration.
 - Fix the remuneration (if any) of the Treasurer and Secretary, and any assistants.
 - Convene extraordinary general meetings of members.
18. The Secretary shall convene an extraordinary general meetings of members on the requisition of sixteen subscribers, in writing, stating the nature of the business to be dealt with at such meeting. Seven clear days' notice of any extraordinary general meeting, and the business to be dealt with, shall be given by circular.

19. The quorum of members at any general or extraordinary general meeting of members shall be nine.

20. The Institution shall have a common seal, which shall be kept by the Secretary, and which shall be affixed to any document by the authority of the Council only, and the affixing of the same shall be attested by the President (or one of the Vice-Presidents) and the Secretary.
