Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE WOOLLEN TRADE BOARD.

Norg.—This Determination on the 1st May, 1920, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, Castlemaine, and Sebastopol; and such portion of the shire of Bungaree as is within 10 miles of a city or town.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business carried on in a woollen mill" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st May, 1920, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(b) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by any employee before or after his shift shall be time and a quarter for the first two hours, and thereafter time and a half, calculated on the rates fixed for the

(4) SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, Boxing Day; but if any day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work

(5) PIECE-WORK.--The lowest piece-work prices to be paid to any person for doing work of the description referred to in the following Schedule shall be :-

LEARNERS. 15 per cent. off piece-work rates for first 6 months. 10 per cent. off piece-work rates for second 6 months.

The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has not fixed piece-work prices, but has fixed a minimum wage provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.

(6) Definition.-A "string" means 10 feet of warp.
