REGULATION OF HAIRDRESSERS' SHOPS AND TOBACCONISTS' SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF BOORT.

FORM OF INDENTURE PRESCRIBED BY THE COUNTRY PRINTERS BOARD.

THIS indenture made the day of 19 between employer apprentice parent or guardian for themselves their executors administrators or assigns.

Witnesseth that the said the employer doth hereby covenant with the said apprentice and the said parent or guardian that he the said employer will—

- Take and receive the said apprentice as his apprentice for the full term of years from the day of 19
- To the best of his power knowledge and ability teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the said apprentice in the process trade or business of and all things incident or relating thereto.
- Pay to the said apprentice (during such time as he shall observe and perform the terms of this indenture) wages at the rate following (that is to say):—
During the currency of this indenture—

1st year +	per week of	hours
2nd "	"	"
3rd "	"	"
4th "	"	"
5th "	"	"
6th "	"	"

- Pay to the said apprentice such further rates for overtime worked as may be fixed by the Country Printers Board.
- Provide all plant and materials necessary to enable the said apprentice during the term of this indenture to perform his work.
- On the execution of these presents by all parties hand over to the said apprentice a copy of this agreement.
- On completion of the term herein named hand over to the said apprentice this copy of agreement with a certificate thereon to the effect that the said term has been served. Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.
- If at any time during the said term he shall die or cease to carry on the business aforesaid in all its branches as now carried on by him he or his executors administrators or assigns or one of them will within one month thereafter find and provide some other employer or employers carrying on the business aforesaid in all its branches and will assign

and transfer the said apprentice to such employer or employers upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are hereinbefore provided.

- (i) Throughout the term of the apprenticeship keep at his place of business and use in and for the purposes of the said process trade or business at least one cylinder machine.

And that the said apprentice and parent or guardian covenant with the said employer that he the said apprentice during the said term (unless the employer shall remove his business to some place beyond the radius of three miles from his present place of business in which case the parent or guardian may if he so elect claim to have this indenture assigned to some other employer within the radius if any there be or if there be none such to have this indenture cancelled) will—

- (a) Well faithfully and honestly serve the said employer as an apprentice in his trade or business aforesaid.
- (b) Willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of the said employer or of such of his representatives as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business.
- (c) Not do or commit nor suffer to be done or committed any waste damage or other injury to the property or goods of the said employer or any firm or company of which he may be a member or lend them to any person without the consent of the said employer.
- (d) Not unlawfully absent himself from the service of the said employer during business hours.
- (e) Not by word or action induce other apprentices to disobedience.

And it is hereby specially agreed by all the parties to this indenture that in case any of the covenants hereof are broken by any party hereto the Secretary for Labour or any Police Magistrate of Victoria shall have power to cancel and make an end of this indenture of apprenticeship if he is satisfied that any covenant or covenants have been broken and that it is desirable to do so.

It is hereby further agreed—

- (1) That the said apprentice shall be paid for all days named as public holidays in the Determination of the Country Printers Board.
- (2) That the said apprentice shall not be paid for any time he shall be absent from his said duties through his own wilful default and neglect or through illness or through absenting himself from his said employer's service without leave or licence.
- (3) That the said apprentice shall not be entitled to a higher rate of pay until he has actually worked for a period of twelve months at the next preceding rate.
- (4) That in computing the period of twelve months all time worked as overtime shall be allowed as a set off against any absence during the said period.

And for the true performance of all and every of the said covenants and agreements each of the said parties bindeth himself to the other by these presents.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE DAIRY PRODUCE ACT 1919.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of April, 1920.

WHEREAS by the Dairy Produce Act 1919 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, make Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned and generally for the carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. In the interpretation of these Regulations the following definitions shall apply:—

"Act" means the Dairy Produce Act 1919.

"Board" means the Milk and Cream Graders Board under the Dairy Produce Act.

"Butter-fat" means the pure fat of milk.

"Check-grading" means the checking of the grading of dairy produce and re-grading the same when necessary and confirming the marks on such dairy produce or on the packages containing the same, or altering such marks so as to indicate the correct grade (as the case may require).

"Dairy Farm" means any premises where cows are milked or kept for the purpose of producing milk either for sale or for preparing any dairy produce for sale, and includes the animals thereon.

"Dairy Produce" means milk, cream, butter, cheese, or any article derived or prepared from milk or cream.

"Factory" means any premises where any dairy produce is received from any person other than the owner of such premises for the purpose of manufacture, and includes any premises owned or controlled by a body corporate or unincorporate where dairy produce is received from any person whomsoever, including any member of any such body, for such purpose.

"Grade" or "Grading" means the classification according to quality of dairy produce in the prescribed manner, and "to Grade" and "Graded" respectively have a corresponding interpretation.

"Grader" means a person holding a certificate from the Board as a grader of milk and cream.

"Inspecting Officer" means an officer of the Department of Agriculture appointed as an Inspecting Officer under this Act.

"Mark" includes any brand, stamp, tag, or label.

"Officer" includes Inspecting Officer.

"Owner" includes occupier or person in charge, owner's agent or manager, and in the case of a body corporate or unincorporate the manager, secretary, or other controlling officer thereof.

"Package" means box, case, can, crate, tank, basket, tin, cask, keg, barrel, tub, flask, bottle, jar, dish, drum, capsule, wrapper, covering, or container of any material or description whatsoever.

"Prescribed" means prescribed by the Dairy Produce Act or any Regulations thereunder.

"Receptacle" includes any vessel, can, utensil, or other receptacle for the storing or conveying of milk or cream.

"Regulations" means Regulations made in pursuance of the Dairy Produce Act.

"Sell" includes barter or exchange, and also includes agreeing to sell or offering for sale or exposing for sale, or having in possession for sale or sending, forwarding, or delivering for or on sale, or causing, suffering, or attempting any of such acts or things, and "Sale" has a corresponding interpretation.

"Ship" includes any hulk, lighter, or boat.

"Store" means place where any dairy produce is sold otherwise than solely by retail or stored (whether in a cool chamber or otherwise), and includes a creamery or collecting depot.

"Test" means to determine in the prescribed manner the contents or constituents of dairy produce.

"Tester" means a person holding a certificate from the Board as a tester of milk and cream.

2. The owner of every factory shall employ and continue to employ a sufficient number of certificated testers and graders to carry out the provisions of the Act and the Regulations thereunder.

3. Every person who desires to obtain a certificate as a tester of milk and cream shall satisfy the Board by means of a written and practical examination concerning his knowledge on the following subjects:

The secretion of milk and factors which influence the same.
The composition of milk and cream and factors which induce variation therein.

Estimating by the Babcock method the quantity of butter-fat in milk and cream.

Estimating solids in milk.

Errors which may occur in testing and how to correct or avoid the same.

The collection of samples and means of preserving the same.

Recording and computing results of testing.

Methods of testing for acidity, moisture, and preservatives.

The over-run and factors which influence it.

The Regulations under the Act.

4. Every person who desires to obtain a certificate as a grader of milk and cream shall satisfy the Board by means of a written and practical examination concerning his knowledge on the following subjects:—

The secretion of milk and factors which influence the same.
The composition of milk and cream, and factors which induce variation therein.

The collection of samples and means of preserving the same.

Methods of testing for acidity, moisture, and preservatives.
Bacteria, their development and their influence in milk and cream.

The neutralization and pasteurization of milk and cream.

Grading milk and cream.

The Regulations under the Act.

5. A candidate for a certificate as a tester or as a grader must make application in writing to the Chairman of the Board and must forward with each such application a fee of Twenty shillings. Applications must be accompanied by testimonials in regard to character and experience.

6. Examinations of candidates for certificates will be held at such times and places as the Board shall determine and advertise in the *Government Gazette* or other newspaper.

7. A certificate as a tester shall be issued by the Board to every person who has passed the prescribed examination and paid the prescribed fee and as to whose general conduct and character the Board is satisfied, and such certificate shall be in the following form:—

The owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for each head of cattle, and any Justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner as "Owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected; or if such owner appear then as in other cases, and the Justices may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses to be estimated and assessed by the Justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund, and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the amount falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by Justices are recovered.

If such cattle by reason of having been found at large have been impounded by the Council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly, and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle are not sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or so much as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in a like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by Justices by law to be recovered, and if the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give adjudicating Justice jurisdiction shall apply.
