## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

## BY-LAW NO. 1051.—QUAMBATOOK URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE AVOCA WATER TRUST DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Quambatook Urban District within the Avoca Water Trust District:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. Every person using or supplied with water for other than domestic purposes solely shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Commission or its proper officer.

3. No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

4. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any meter or any service-pipe to any pipe of the Commission, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any meter or pipe of the Commission, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Commission, he shall obtain from the Commission a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such meter, pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Commission, without giving three days' notice to the Commission or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Commission, without the permission, in writing, of the Commission or its proper officer, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work the property of the Commission, shall be guilty of an offence.

6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commission or its proper officer, shall be guilty of an offence.

7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch meter, or meter of smaller size, Ten shillings;  
For any meter of larger size than  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

9. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Commission, he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Commission,

and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Commission who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Commission of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

10. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Commission may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

11. Meters, other than such as are hired from the Commission, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Commission, at Quambatook, and a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

12. The Commission, by its officers, may, at any time, after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service-pipes of any consumer; either inside or outside the premises of such consumer; and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

13. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Commission, on which such waste is continued.

14. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Commission does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commission may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

16. The charge to be paid for water supplied by measure from the pipes of the Commission shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

17. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be as follows:—

(1) Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making, and levying rates, if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) Where the supply is solely for other than domestic purposes, a quantity which, if charged as provided by the last preceding section, would give a sum of Twenty shillings for any continuous period of three months.

18. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commission authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commission.

19. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

GLENROWAN WATERWORKS TRUST.  
By-LAW No. 10.

THE Commissioners of the Glenrowan Waterworks Trust, constituted under the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the By-law following:—

The following are the rates for 1921 which the occupiers or owners of lands, tenements, or vacant allotments within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect to every such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling shall be paid.
2. For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence on municipal valuation shall be paid.
3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land fronting a street in which a main shall have been laid shall be Ten shillings.
4. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water and being within a quarter of a mile of a main, one half of the beforementioned rate, and where tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a main one quarter the beforementioned rate to be paid.
5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.
6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1921.
7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

AMENDMENT IN RATES OF CHARGE FOR A SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY UNDER THE SHIRE OF ROCHESTER ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDER No. 29, 1907 (TRANSFERRED TO THE COMMONWEALTH ELECTRIC CO. PTY. LTD. ON 17TH MARCH, 1914; FOR 21 YEARS).

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby vary the rates of charge for a supply of electricity under the above-mentioned Order No. 29, 1907, by substituting the following section for section 1 of the Fourth Schedule thereto, viz.:—

SECTION 1.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the actual amount of energy supplied to him, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

- For energy supplied for Lighting purposes.—
  - For the first Fifty units per month, Ten pence per unit.
  - For the second Fifty units per month, Eight pence per unit.
  - For the third Fifty units per month, Six pence per unit.
- For energy supplied for Power purposes.—
  - For the first Fifty units per month, Six pence per unit.
  - For the second Fifty units per month, Four pence per unit.

And the Honorable Arthur Robinson, His Majesty's Attorney-General for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Health Act 1919.—No. 3041.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO PRIVATE HOSPITALS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of May, 1921.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Lawson | Mr. Barnes  
Mr. Robinson | Mr. Angus.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Act 1919, No. 3041, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- Citation. 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Private Hospital Regulations 1921" and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- Repeal. 2. Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations all Regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed.
- Interpretation. 3. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Inspector" means any person authorized by the Commission to inspect private hospitals.

"Manager" means the person who resides on the premises of a private hospital and has with the approval of the Commission the management, control, or conduct thereof.

"Room" includes bedroom, ward, or compartment.

4. Every private hospital shall be of one or other of the following classes, that is to say, for the reception of cases which are:—

- (a) Medical; or
- (b) Surgical; or
- (c) Medical and surgical; or
- (d) Medical, surgical, and lying-in; or
- (e) Lying-in; or
- (f) Infectious diseases.

Classes of Hospitals.

5. Every person who, on the coming into operation of these Regulations, is carrying on or using or conducting any private hospital or who proposes thereafter to open carry on or use or conduct any private hospital shall apply for registration thereof in the form and manner prescribed by the Registration (*Health Act 1919*) Regulations in force at the time being. Such registration shall be renewed every year in accordance with the aforesaid last-mentioned Regulations.

Hospitals to be registered in accordance with Regulations.

6. For every private hospital there shall be a manager to be approved by the Commission. Such manager may be either the proprietor or some person thereto appointed by such proprietor and may be:—

Manager to be appointed.

- (a) a medical practitioner; or
- (b) a trained nurse, in the case of a hospital receiving medical or surgical or medical and surgical or infectious diseases cases; or
- (c) a registered midwife, in the case of a lying-in hospital; or
- (d) a trained nurse who is a registered midwife, or a trained nurse having, as resident assistant, a registered midwife in the case of a hospital receiving medical, surgical, and lying-in cases; or
- (e) any other person approved by the Commission.

The full name and qualifications of every person intended to be so appointed shall be submitted by the proprietor of such hospital to the Commission for approval.

7. The manager of every private hospital shall enter or cause to be entered in the "Case Book" such particulars relating to each patient as are hereunder prescribed:—

Case Book.

- (a) Full name, sex, and marital state.
- (b) Address.
- (c) Date of admission.
- (d) Name of medical attendant.
- (e) Nature of disease or condition.
- (f) Clinical history prior to admission and during stay in the hospital.
- (g) In case of confinement the date of birth, sex and condition of child at delivery and during its subsequent stay in the hospital; or in case of its death the cause thereof.
- (h) Date of discharge or death.

The particulars prescribed in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) of this regulation together with the patient's clinical history prior to admission shall be entered in the case book within twenty-four hours after such admission.

The patient's clinical history while in the hospital and the remaining particulars in this regulation prescribed shall be entered not later than the day next following the events recorded.

8. No cases of more than one kind of infectious disease shall be received at one and the same time in any private hospital unless adequate provision be therein made for efficiently isolating patients suffering from different kinds of infectious diseases one kind from the other.

Isolation of infectious cases.

9. Subject to these Regulations the manager of any private hospital may receive therein any patient suffering from puerperal fever or typhoid fever provided that such patient is accommodated in a room not otherwise occupied or if occupied then occupied only by a patient or patients suffering from the same disease.

Puerperal and Typhoid fever cases.

10. The manager of every private hospital shall provide maintain and use such appliances as may be approved by the Commission for the destruction of infective matters.

Provision to be made for destruction of infective matters.

11. Immediately a room which has been occupied by any patient or patients suffering from infectious disease becomes vacant the manager shall cause complete disinfection thereof to be made to the satisfaction

Room to be disinfected after infectious cases.

of a medical practitioner whose certificate to that effect shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Commission within forty-eight hours after such disinfection has taken place.

12. No person managing a private hospital shall:—

- (a) Accommodate or allow to be accommodated any patient in a room not specified in the certificate of registration as a room for the accommodation of patients.
- (b) Allow for other than the prescribed purpose the use of any room specified in the certificate of registration as being for the accommodation of patients.
- (c) Suffer or permit a number of patients to be in the hospital or in any room thereof greater than the number specified in the certificate of registration.
- (d) Suffer or permit a number of nurses to be accommodated in any room specified in the certificate of registration as a nurse's bedroom in excess of the number allowed in the said certificate.
- (e) Let or sublet any room or any portion of a private hospital or receive boarders or lodgers or take in other than patients:

Provided that this restriction shall not apply to the members of the household of a patient for whom accommodation is not otherwise available or desirable nor to the members of the household of the manager.

13. No person managing a private hospital shall be absent from the premises over night while there is any patient therein unless a registered midwife (in the case of a hospital receiving lying-in-cases) or a competent nurse (in the case of any other hospital) be left in charge.

14. No person managing a private hospital shall be absent from such hospital for more than a week at a time while there is any patient therein without first appointing a registered midwife (in the case of a hospital receiving lying-in cases) or a trained nurse (in the case of any other hospital) to take charge during his absence and notifying the Commission of the full name of such midwife or trained nurse.

15. Every person managing a private hospital shall maintain in such hospital at all times to the satisfaction of the Commission a sufficient staff including those engaged in ordinary household duties.

16. Every person managing a private hospital shall:—

- (a) Cause to be flushed and disinfected all drains upon the premises at least once every day, and cause all such drains to be maintained in good order and sanitary condition.
- (b) Cause to be provided and at all times to be kept upon such premises in efficient order and condition all materials and appliances necessary for the use of the patients inmates and staff, and all appliances and apparatus required by the Commission to be provided and kept thereon for the prevention control or extinction of fire and for the saving of life at fires.
- (c) At all times exercise a close personal supervision of the premises and the persons employed thereon and cause all orders of the medical practitioner in charge of any patient to be diligently carried out.
- (d) Forthwith carry out all orders or directions that may be given from time to time by the inspector relating to sanitary arrangements, the collection or disposal of excrementitious matter, refuse, liquid or other wastes: or other orders or directions given by such inspector.
- (e) At all times cause all household linen, beds, bedding, furniture, cutlery, crockery, cooking and other utensils, and all other things used in the management or conduct of such hospital, to be duly cleansed, and shall when required by the inspector cause all bedding clothing or other articles which have been exposed to or are believed to be contaminated with the infection of any infectious disease or which are dirty or verminous to be disinfected. When an article is of such a nature that it cannot be disinfected it shall be destroyed in such a manner as may be directed by the inspector.
- (f) Cause to be provided separate approved covered receptacles into which all used surgical dressings, human tissues, or fluids, other than those elsewhere provided for in these Regulations, shall be placed, and cause all such special refuse to be burnt.

- (g) Cause every room to be sufficiently furnished and every room, out-building and yard connected with such premises to be kept clean and free from any accumulation of rubbish, filth, or waste matters which may become offensive or injurious to health, or matter calculated to facilitate outbreak of fire. Furnishings.  
Cleanliness of rooms, &c.
17. The Commission shall cause every private hospital to be inspected from time to time as occasion may require, and the management, conduct and sanitary condition to be reported on. Inspection.
18. No application for registration shall be granted unless the premises in respect of which such registration is sought comply to the satisfaction of the Commission with the conditions specified in Schedule A hereto. Conditions of registration.  
Schedule A.
19. Every application for the Commission's approval of plans and specifications for the erection, building or re-building of any private hospital or any addition to or alteration or extension of a private hospital or any existing building with the view of using the same as a private hospital shall be in the form in Schedule B hereto and shall be accompanied by the said plans and specifications and the said plans shall conform to the requirements of the said Schedule so far as the same may be applicable. Application for approval of plans, &c.  
Section 158.  
Schedule B.
20. Unless licensed under the law for the time being in force relating to the reception of insane persons no manager of any private hospital shall receive any case of mental disease into such hospital. Mental cases not to be taken.
21. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and in case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds; but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds. Penalties.

#### SCHEDULE A.

##### *Private Hospital Regulations 1921:*

No application for registration of a private hospital shall be granted unless the premises in respect of which registration is sought comply to the satisfaction of the Commission with the following conditions, that is to say:—

- (1) The situation and site of the premises shall be satisfactory. There shall be a clear air-space, free from any erection thereon or thereover of at least 10 feet between any part of the hospital buildings and the boundaries of the adjacent allotments. There Site.
- (2) Premises for the reception of persons suffering from infectious disease (anchoylostomiasis, bilharziasis, hydatids, malaria, puerperal fever and typhoid fever excepted) shall have a clear air-space free from any erection thereon or thereover of at least 40 feet between any part of the hospital buildings and the boundaries of the adjacent allotments. Site of infectious diseases hospital.
- (3) Damp sites shall be drained by agricultural drain pipes properly laid to a suitable outfall but not directly communicating with any sewer or cesspool or drain containing sewage. The Commission may require the site of a new house to be entirely covered with a layer of impervious material such as asphalt or concrete. Damp sites to be drained, &c.
- (4) No building of more than the ground story, if constructed of wood or of wood and iron, nor any apartment situated under or over a shop or store or over a cellar, shall be used as a private hospital. Use of certain premises prohibited.
- (5) The building or buildings shall be substantially constructed and in a good state of repair, dry internally throughout, and in a clean state. Quality of premises.
- (6) In all brick, masonry, or concrete foundation walls, a damp-proof course of approved kind shall be laid at least 6 inches above the level of the ground immediately adjoining the exterior of the building and below the ground-plate level. Walls to be damp-proof.
- (7) Floor-boards shall have tongued and grooved joints and be well cramped together, and the space under every wooden floor shall be abundantly ventilated to the external air; the ventilation openings wherever possible being located on at least two and opposite sides of the building. Floors.
- (8) Every room of the building or buildings shall be efficiently lighted by means of glazed openings. Every room intended to be occupied by one or more patients shall be provided with windows in the external walls, having in the aggregate a ratio of not less than 1 square foot of clear glass to each 10 square feet of floor. All windows throughout the building or buildings shall be freely openable to the fullest extent practicable. Light and ventilation.

- Internal surfaces of rooms.
- (9) Internal surfaces of walls, partitions and ceilings of the building or buildings accommodating the patients and staff shall be smooth, even, impervious and capable of being frequently disinfected without injury.
- (10) In no part of the building or buildings shall hessian or scrim and paper, or distemper or calcimine or "kalsomine" or other composition containing decomposable organic matter, be used. Wooden lining shall have tongued and grooved joints well cramped together, be closely affixed to walls and ceiling timbers, and be coated with sanitary paint or varnish; *in the case of a building to be newly erected beading of lining-boards shall not be allowed.* Ordinary wall-paper shall not be used unless impervious at the surface or covered with impervious material such as varnish, and closely adherent to the surfaces of the walls or ceilings.
- Roof.
- (11) No readily inflammable material shall be used as a roof covering for any of the buildings.
- Accommodation.
- (12) There shall be sufficient accommodation for the staff and inmates other than patients.
- Air-space.
- (13) Every room accommodating any patient shall be at least 10 feet high. The floor area for each patient shall be at least 100 square feet, and the cubic air space for each patient shall be at least 1,000 cubic feet. The sleeping accommodation for the staff shall be such as to provide at least 80 square feet and 800 cubic feet of air-space for each individual.
- Floor and air-spaces for infectious cases.
- (14) For cases of infectious disease the floor area for each adult patient shall be at least 120 square feet and the cubic air-space at least 1,200 cubic feet.
- Identification marks for rooms.
- (15) On the outer face of the entrance door of every room accommodating one or more patients or members of the staff shall be painted or otherwise legibly marked in prominent permanent character in consecutive order the distinguishing letter or number of such room as registered by the Commission, and under such letter or number the number in figures of the beds allowed by the Commission in such room, thus:—

- The word "Ward" conjointly with a capital letter of the alphabet being adopted for rooms accommodating patients, and the word "Room" conjointly with a progressive numeral for staff rooms.
- Ventilation of rooms.
- (16) Means shall be provided for the admission of fresh air to every room of the building or buildings and for the escape of vitiated air from every such room. The net sectional area of the inlet openings and likewise of the outlet openings thus required shall be reckoned upon the basis of at least 24 square inches for each occupant of a room accommodating patients or staff, and at least 1 square inch for every 40 cubic feet of its capacity for every other room.
- Ventilation of roof space.
- (17) Any means provided for exchange of air of the roof space shall be entirely independent of that provided for any room of the building, and no opening into the roof space for access or other purpose shall be provided or retained if it permits communication between such space and the interior of the building.
- Temperature of patients' rooms.
- (18) Whenever required by the Commission means satisfactory to it for maintaining a proper temperature in every room occupied by patients shall be provided.
- Protection against fire.
- (19) Gas brackets shall not have movable joints. Oil lamps shall have metal fonts or receivers, and shall either be supported on and properly secured to fixed metal brackets, or be suspended by metal chains or metal rods. All gas lights and oil lights shall be placed at least 6 ft. 8 in. above the floor; and if within 4 feet vertically or 2 feet horizontally of any inflammable material, shall be adequately protected by metal shields.
- Ventilation of gas-areas.
- (20) Every gas-fire, gas cooking stove, or bath-heater shall be provided with a vent pipe not less than 3 inches in diameter, extending in as direct a line as practicable to a height of at least 12 inches above the roof, fitted with an approved hood and insulated from all inflammable material by an air-space of not less than 1½ inch.
- Water supply.
- (21) The water supply shall be abundant and wholesome.
- Sanitary conveniences.
- (22) Sanitary conveniences, including closets, urinals, and receptacles for deposit of refuse or rubbish, shall be provided in situation, number, construction, and arrangement to the satisfaction of the Commission.
- (23) Closets and urinal compartments must be well lighted and ventilated, and shall not be provided with water direct from a water-service-pipe but through some suitable appliance, such as a small flushing tank placed in such a position as to be well ventilated. In the case of a pan-closet the orifice in the closet seat must be at least 3½ inches behind the riser or casing more or less surrounding the pan; the space under the seat must not allow of a larger interval than 1½ inch between the pan and the seat, and it must be so fitted with guides and stops that the pan may easily be introduced into its proper position. *The floor of the whole closet, in the case of every new closet, must be of approved material, such as asphalt, or concrete, or flagstone, having its surface impervious, horizontal beneath the seat, but sloped forward from the riser to the front wall ¼ inch per foot and nowhere less than 3 inches above*



*the surrounding ground level.* Access to the pan for purpose of removal shall be from the exterior of the closet building. The space beneath the seat shall be provided with a fly-proof air-grating situated in the lowermost part of an external wall and having a clear air-way of at least 24-square inches and an upcast outlet ventilator 5 inches in diameter extending from beneath the soffit of the seat to above the roof. The orifice in the closet seat shall be provided with a hinged lid or cover. The entrance door of the closet shall be 3 inches short of floor and of lintel. There shall be an adequate supply of effective deodorant together with means satisfactory to the Commission for its application to the contents of the pan in use.

- (24) A laundry, with all necessary appliances, sufficient to cleanse and disinfect all bedding, body-clothing, linen, napery, and other similar articles, shall be provided in cases where such provision is explicitly required by the Commission to be made. Laundry.
- (25) Hand fire-buckets or alternatively an equal number of such buckets and of approved hand chemical fire-extinguishers shall be provided in number and position as shall be determined by the Commission, but not less than one bucket or extinguisher for each 200 square feet of floor area. Each such bucket shall be of strong but light make, have a convex bottom rendering it incapable of standing alone, of capacity of not less than 2 nor more than 2½ Imperial gallons, shall be placed in a fixed stand or hung from a fixed bracket in such position as shall be directed by the Commission, and kept filled with clean water ready for instant use for extinction of fire. Chemical fire-extinguishers shall be only such as provide for the forcible ejection of fire-extinguishing liquid of neutral or slightly alkaline reaction, and of about 2 gallons apiece. Fire extinguishing apparatus.
- (26) An approved bath shall be provided and placed in a suitable position. When the aggregate numbers of patients and necessary resident staff exceeds ten there shall be two such baths, and when such aggregate exceeds twenty there shall be one additional bath for every increase of ten over and above such number of twenty persons. The floor of bathroom shall be impervious or be covered with impervious material, and drained to a suitable outlet. *Linoleum shall not be used as a covering for the floor of a bathroom in any new building.* Nor shall such material be used for such purpose in any building already erected unless the edges of the linoleum at the walls be turned up against the walls, and turned over a roll at the doorway and all perforation openings, so as to form a continuous seamless tray covering the whole floor. Provision of baths. Bathroom floors.
- (27) Efficient drainage shall be provided for carrying off all foul water and all rain water from open surfaces, such as roofs and yards, to a proper outlet or outlets. There shall be no open foul-water drains near the windows or near the inlet ventilators or perflators of any of the buildings. Drainage.
- (28) No drain beneath any building shall unless absolutely necessary be used. Where the use of such a drain is unavoidable it shall be properly ventilated and constructed of impervious cast-iron pipes, having caulked lead joints and embedded in cement concrete extending at least 6 inches all round the pipe.
- (29) All drains shall be laid with sufficient and even gradient, and present smooth and impervious internal surfaces and water-tight joints.
- (30) All closed foul-water drains shall be effectually ventilated so as to discharge all foul vapours well above the levels of chimneys, window ventilators, and other openings of habitable buildings or stores for food for human consumption. All waste and overflow pipes from baths, lavatory basins, sinks, and like fittings shall be air-disconnected from any foul-water drain by an approved method, as, e.g., by causing such pipes to discharge over a watertight channel at least 12 inches long, and leading to a trapped inlet to the said drain, or to discharge in the open air over a well-ventilated and trapped gully. Overflows from rain-water tanks shall discharge into the open air and shall be placed so that no drain vapours or gases can enter the tank through such overflow. All waste pipes shall be trapped, the trap being located as near as practicable to the bath, lavatory, basin, sink, or like fitting.
- (31) Strong metal receptacles furnished with closely fitting covers shall be provided for the temporary storage pending removal of all kinds of kitchen and hospital refuse. Receptacles for refuse.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO BUILDINGS OF MORE THAN THE  
GROUND-FLOOR STORY.

- (32) In case any person or patient is or is intended to be accommodated on any story above the ground story, there shall be provided for such upper story alternative means of escape readily and safely accessible for such person or patients, so that, should exit by one means of escape be prevented another means of escape shall be available for such upper story. Alternative means of escape.
- (33) In case any patient is or is intended to be accommodated on any story above the ground story, all stairs required in compliance with the foregoing condition in the case of a new building, and any new stairs required in the case of an existing building, shall be in straight flights, shall have half-space or quarter-space landings, as the case may require at intervals of not more than fifteen steps. Stairs and landings. Hand-rails treads and risers.

Landings between doorway and first step.

Dimensions of landings.

Lift, situation of.

Certain patients on ground story only.

shall have proper balusters, continuous hand-rails, steps having treads of not less than 11 inches wide, exclusive of the nosing, and rises not more than 6 inches high.

(34) No door shall open immediately on to a flight of steps; a landing at least as long and as broad as the width of the doorway shall in all cases be provided between the doorway and the first step of such flight, if practicable.

Every such landing shall, when in connexion with a stairway provided as a means of escape for any patient, be of such dimensions as will allow of a patient being easily carried on a stretcher in a horizontal position to the said stairway.

(35) No lift or elevator shaft shall be provided inside the building except under conditions approved by the Commission.

(36) Accommodation of any patient requiring continuously the prone or recumbent position shall not be allowed, except on the ground story, unless the doorways, passage-ways, landings, and staircases conducting to the ground are of such design and dimensions as will, in the opinion of the Commission, allow of such patient being removed from the building, in such a position on a stretcher to the ground

- (d) the position of each closet, urinal, wash-house, or other fixed sanitary convenience;

**RESCISSION AND RE-MAKING OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF QUEENSLIFFE.**

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be effected, doth hereby—

I. Revoke the Regulations made on the 20th day of January, 1915, directing that all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the municipal district of the borough of Queenscliffe shall be exempted from the Saturday Half-holiday and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

II. Make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

(1) all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the municipal district of the borough of Queenscliffe during the months of December, January, February, and March in each year shall be exempted from the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 98 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* so far as the closing hours on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays are concerned.

(2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the said months from the hour of—

- (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
- (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
- (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

**RESCISSION AND RE-MAKING OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF QUEENSLIFFE.**

Under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the municipal district of the borough of Queenscliffe of the particular classes to be effected, doth hereby—

I. Revoke the Regulations made on the 20th day of January, 1915, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1912* as amended by the *Factories and Shops Act Amendment Act 1914*) within the municipal district of the borough of Queenscliffe, shall be exempted from the Saturday Half-Holiday and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

II. Make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

(1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, tobacconists' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the municipal district of the borough of Queenscliffe during the months of December, January, February, and March in each year shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.

(2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the said months from the hour of—

- (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
- (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
- (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

**APPOINTMENT OF BOARDINGHOUSES BOARD AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF SUCH BOARD AND OF THE RESTAURANT BOARD.**

Under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

(1) declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in a boarding-house with accommodation for seven or more boarders;

(2) order that a Wages Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in a boarding-house with accommodation for seven or more boarders; also that such Wages Board may in any regulation, determination, order, or instrument, or legal proceedings be described for all purposes as the Boardinghouses Board; and the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria;

(3) adjust the powers of the Restaurant Board and of the Boardinghouses Board by depriving the said Restaurant Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in a boardinghouse with accommodation for seven or more boarders and conferring such power exclusively on the Boardinghouses Board.

**CONSTITUTION OF COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS TO DECIDE AN APPEAL AGAINST DETERMINATION OF THE CORDAGE BOARD.**

Whereas the Wages Board (herein referred to as the Cordage Board) appointed under the Factories and Shops Acts to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of rope, twine, cordage, halters, coir mats, or coir matting, did by a certain Determination made on the tenth day of March, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the fifteenth day of March, 1921, following, determine the lowest prices or rates to be so paid: And whereas a majority of the representatives of the employees on the said Board have in the prescribed manner appealed against the said Determination to the Court of Industrial Appeals under the Factories and Shops Acts: Now therefore it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf vested in him by the said Acts, that a Court of Industrial Appeals, consisting of the President His Honour Mr. Justice Mann and Edward H. Kinnear, of Ballarat-road, Footscray, a person who has been *bonâ fide* and actually engaged in the trade concerned for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination duly nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employers on the Cordage Board to represent the employees, and James Fagin, of 12 Waratah-street, Geelong West, a person who has been *bonâ fide* and actually engaged in such trade for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination duly nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employees on the said Board to represent the employees, be and the same is hereby constituted to consider and deal with the appeal aforesaid against the Determination of the Cordage Board, and to revise or alter the said Cordage Board's own Determination from time to time in form and manner as provided by law.

And the Honourable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

doth re-subdivide the city of Ballarat as now re-constituted into four separate wards, the names and boundaries of which also shall be those severally hereunder set forth and described, and doth hereby further order that a council consisting of twelve members shall be elected accordingly that is to say:—

The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference

9. 10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

17. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of

the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.*

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. If any alteration of the price of any item included in any Schedule be made by the Commonwealth or State Government between the date fixed for receiving tenders and the termination of the contract period, a corresponding allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the article affected will be made by the Tender Board. The contractor shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Tender Board before an increase in price is allowed.

22. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Commonwealth Government; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

23. For the purpose of the contracts entered into under these conditions, it is hereby expressly provided that in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter at his last-known place of business or abode.

24. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 23 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. 25. 26. Where specially indicated in the schedules no sub-letting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in the schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any way engaged in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in the schedules under this contract, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated), and every such person shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by any Wages Board under the Factories and Shops Act to which such persons are subject as employees, and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

Security will be required, in the sum of £25 for burials, £25 for removals, Melbourne District; and £5 Bourke District, either in cash, Victorian Government debentures, Bank deposit receipt, or Savings Bank deposit book in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenders, indorsed "Tender for Funerals or Removals" (as the case may be), are to be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury; or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and tenders addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, which office they must reach by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The services are to be performed upon an order signed by a member of the Police Force. Under the *Cemeteries Act 1915* (No. 2626), section 50, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of poor persons buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while availing themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.

4. The body shall be taken direct to the Necropolis, or to the New Melbourne Cemetery, as the case may be, by rail. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 16.

5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the seams to prevent leakage. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

6. In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctively offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water, or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor, of timber 1 inch in thickness.

7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the New Melbourne Cemetery, Fawkner, for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the Yarra, excepting bodies buried from the Morgue, and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Morgue.

8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and Cemetery Regulations.

9. In the event of the Contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the Contractor. Should any circumstance, however, make it necessary in any particular case that an immediate removal to the Morgue be effected, the hiring of another vehicle for the purpose will not be an infringement of the contract.

10. When burials or removals are required to take place on Sunday, or in the case of any lunatic asylum, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the Necropolis or cemetery authorities in the case of burials will be repaid to the Contractor.

11. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the Contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the Contractor gives the order for interment. The Contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

12. Bodies to be removed to the Morgue shall be placed by the Contractor before removal in shell coffins, zinc lined, and water-tight, securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles. The Contractor shall send two men for the purpose of removing the body to the vehicle, and from the vehicle to the Morgue.

13. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the post-mortem examination.

14. Under no circumstances will the Contractor be permitted to use any undue or improper influence with the friends or relatives of, or any other person connected or associated with, the deceased person for the purpose of obtaining any concession or privilege whatsoever in regard to the funeral of such person. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, on report of the Tender Board, to the immediate cancellation of his contract. The decision of the Board as to whether any breach of the condition has taken place to be final and conclusive.

15. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

16. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect, or delay in conducting the funerals or removals will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, impropriety, neglect, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

17. Under no circumstances will a Contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the Contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and, in addition, the Contractor may be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

19. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the Contractor. Every person engaged in the burials or removals tendered for in this schedule shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Undertakers Board under the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory or shop (and in each part of the factory or shop where several rooms are in use) in which funerals are arranged or prepared under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

CONDITIONS OF TENDERING.

Contract for Supply of Stores at Scheduled Rates.

1. Interpretation.—In these conditions and in the tender the word "Government" shall mean The Victorian Government, and where the circumstances require, the word "Tenderer" shall be deemed to include two or more persons or a company; and the word "his" to include "her," "their," "its"; and the word "he" to include "she," "they," "it"; and the word "him" to include "them," "it." The words "Government Printer" shall mean the officer bearing that title or the officer for the time being performing the duties of Government Printer of Victoria. The word "Schedule" shall mean and include the Schedule or Schedules and Supplementary schedule or schedules (if any) hereto annexed.

2. Official Form to be Used.—Each tenderer must send in his tender on the printed form of tender, having attached thereto the Conditions of Tendering, Conditions of Contract, and Schedule, having such schedule filled up IN INK, with the rates at which he tenders: Except where provided to the contrary in the schedule the tenderer may tender to supply any one or more items specified in the schedule. 9. *Notice to Tenderers.*—Every notice to be given to the tenderer may, if the Government think fit, be posted to the tenderer's address given in the tender, and such posting will be deemed good service of such notice, and the time mentioned in these conditions for doing any act after notice shall be reckoned from the time of posting the same.

10. *Additional Conditions of Tendering.*—Any Conditions of Tendering or directions to the tenderer embodied in the advertisement inviting tenders or in any note appearing in the schedule hereto annexed shall be deemed to be Conditions of Tendering the same as if they were included in these Conditions of Tendering.

(A) The tenderer is to insert in the appropriate column of this schedule, and opposite the items to which the particulars refer, the following information, viz. :—

1. The name of the country or State and the name of the mill in which the stores tendered for will be manufactured or produced.
2. Whether, in the case of stores of Australian manufacture or production, the whole of such manufacture or production will take place in Australia.
3. As regards stores which will be only partly manufactured or produced in Australia (if any), the parts which will be so manufactured or produced are to be named where provided for in the schedule.
