Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FLOCK BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 13th June, 1921, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the town of Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to “determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of making flock or mungo,” has made the following Determination, namely:—

- (1) That this Determination shall be operative on and after the 13th June, 1921.
