COMMISSION OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF
CERTAIN PREMISES USED IN CONNEXION WITH
CERTAIN TRADES AND CALLINGS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of
June, 1921.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1919 (No. 3041) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say) :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Registration (*Health Act* 1919) Regulations 1921," and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*. Citation.
2. Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations all regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed. Repeal.
3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter— Interpretation.
"The Act" means the *Health Act* 1919.
4. Every person required by the Act to register premises whether with the Commission or a Council shall make application therefore in the form prescribed for that purpose in the Schedule hereto. Application for registration. Forms 1 to 8.
5. When the Commission or a Council (as the case may be) after such inquiry as it deems proper has finally decided upon the application the Secretary or Municipal Clerk (as the case may be) shall forthwith notify the applicant of its decision. Commission or Council to decide.
6. An application for renewal of registration shall be in the form prescribed for that purpose in the Schedule hereto and shall be lodged with the Secretary or Municipal Clerk (as the case may be) on or before the 15th day of November in each year, and the Certificate of Registration then in force shall be lodged with the said application. Applications for renewal. Forms 1 to 8.
7. If an application for registration or renewal of registration of any premises has been granted and the prescribed fee for the same paid, the Secretary or Municipal Clerk (as the case may be) shall cause such premises to be registered or the registration thereof renewed (as the case may be) subject to any conditions that may be imposed by the Commission or Council (as the case may be) and these conditions together with the particulars set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be entered in a book to be kept for the purpose (hereinafter called a register). The Secretary or Municipal Clerk (as the case may be) shall forthwith issue to the applicant a certificate of registration or of renewal of registration (as the case may be) in the form prescribed for the purpose in the Schedule hereto, setting forth therein the conditions (if any) imposed as aforesaid. Procedure when registration or renewal granted. Forms 9 to 12.
8. Every application for the transfer of any registration made in pursuance of these Regulations shall be in the form prescribed for the purpose in the Schedule hereto, and the Certificate of Registration then in force shall be lodged with such application. Transfer of registration. Forms 13 and 14.

Procedure when transfer granted. Form 15.

9. If an application for transfer of registration from one person to another has been granted and the prescribed fee for the same paid, the Secretary or Municipal Clerk (as the case may be) shall enter in the appropriate register the date of such transfer and the full name, address and occupation of the transferee, and shall cause an endorsement in the form prescribed for that purpose in the Schedule hereto to be made on the certificate then in force relating to the transferred registration.

10. If an application for transfer of registration from registered premises to other premises has been granted, the Secretary or Municipal Clerk (as the case may be) shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, and on the lodgment with him of the certificate superseded, cause a fresh entry of registration to be made in the register in respect to the premises to which the registration has been so transferred and shall issue to the applicant a certificate as in the case of an original registration.

Applications for original registration and transfers from premises to be accompanied by plans.

11. With every application for original registration and with every application for transfer of registration from one set of premises to other premises there shall be lodged in respect of the premises for which registration or to which a transfer of registration is applied for—

- (1) Such plans, drawings and particulars as may from time to time be prescribed by any regulation in that behalf.
- (2) Where the application relates to a private hospital or a public building a block plan of the premises drawn to a scale of not less than 1 inch to 20 feet and showing in figures the frontage and depth of the site the positions on the latter relatively to the boundaries thereof and to all thoroughfares upon which such site abuts of all buildings or enclosures existing on such site or proposed to be erected or formed thereon, the class of premises adjoining the boundaries of such site and the cardinal points.
- (3) Where the application relates to dangerous trade premises a block plan as required by paragraph (2) of this Regulation in the case of a private hospital or public building and a key-plan of the locality drawn to a scale of 1 chain to 1 inch and showing the buildings and streets within 100 yards of the premises.
- (4) And such other or further plans, drawings and particulars of the premises as may be required or the applicant may be called upon by the Commission or a Council (as the case may be) to supply.

Plans, &c. to form part of application for registration.

12. Where plans and specifications for the erection of any premises have been approved by the Commission or a Council (as the case may be), and such plans and specifications have been lodged with the Commission or the Council (as the case may be), they shall in connexion with the application for registration of the premises to which they relate, be deemed to form part of such application.

Applicant for registration of private hospital to lodge certificate of character and fitness.

13. Every applicant for registration of a private hospital and the proposed transferee in the case of an application for the transfer of any such registration shall with his application lodge two certificates as to character and fitness to carry on a private hospital, one of which shall be from a medical practitioner.

Registers to be kept. Forms 14 to 24.

14. Registers for the purposes of all registrations under these Regulations shall be in the forms prescribed for the purpose in the Schedule hereto and shall be kept by the Secretary or Municipal Clerk (as the case may be). In addition to the particulars required by the preceding regulations to be entered therein the Secretary or Municipal Clerk (as the case may be) shall cause to be made in such registers a minute or memorandum of every temporary registration, and every suspension, revocation or refusal of registration.

Certain applications to be lodged in duplicate.

15. Every application under these Regulations for an original registration or transfer of registration and every application for the renewal of registration of an offensive trade being a private abattoir in a meat area, shall be lodged in duplicate and where such application is made to the Commission the Secretary shall cause one such application to be forwarded to the Council of the municipality wherein the premises in respect to which the application is made are situated.

Where such application is made to the Council the Municipal Clerk shall cause one such application to be forwarded to the Commission.

Applications how addressed.

16. All applications for registration, renewal of registration, or transfer of registration under these Regulations, shall where under the Act such registrations are required to be made with the Commission be addressed to the Commission of Public Health and may be left with the Secretary to the said Commission, and where registrations are required to be made with the Council all applications relating thereto shall be addressed to the Council of the municipality having authority to make such registration and may be left with the Municipal Clerk thereof.

17. Every Council shall on or before the last day of February in each year forward a return to the Commission of Public Health in the form prescribed for that purpose in the Schedule hereto of every registration (other than a renewal) and every transfer, suspension, or revocation of registration made by the said Council under the Act and these Regulations during the year ending on the 31st day of December preceding the date of such return.

REGULATION REDUCING WEIGHTS TO BE CARRIED ON THE SYDNEY, EUROA-MANSFIELD, EUROA-STRATHBOGIE, EUROA-ARCADIA, ARCADIA, AND MURCHISON-SHEPPARTON ROADS IN THE SHIRE OF EUROA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 59 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* and section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1915* His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby make the following Regulation, viz. :—

No person shall in or by means of a vehicle carry on the main roads following, namely, the Sydney, Euroa-Mansfield, Euroa-Strathbogie, Euroa-Arcadia, Arcadia, and Murchison-Shepparton roads, in the shire of Euroa, a greater weight than the next mentioned (that is to say)—For each wheel of any two-wheeled vehicle a total weight of 2½ hundredweight avoirdupois and for each wheel of any four-wheeled vehicle a total weight of 3 hundredweight avoirdupois for each half-inch of width of bearing surface of the tyre or felloe. The weight of the vehicle shall in all cases be reckoned as part of the weight which may be so carried.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the constitution of an urban water trust, and doth hereby direct the severance from the District of the First Mildura Irrigation Trust so much of such District as at the commencement of the Mildura Irrigation Trust Act 1920 (No. 3107) forms an urban section under section three of the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1909 and doth order and appoint as follows:—

1. That the number of Commissioners of the Water Trust to be elected shall be six (6). The provisions of Part V. of the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895 as amended by any Act shall as far as applicable extend and apply to the election of the said Commissioners. The Commissioners first elected of the said Urban Water Trust shall hold their first meeting on the first day of July, 1921.

On from and after the day so appointed—

- (a) The Mildura Urban Water Trust shall be deemed to be duly appointed, created and incorporated under the said Acts.
- (b) The said urban section shall cease to exist.
- (c) The three additional Commissioners elected for the said urban section pursuant to section four of the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1909 shall go out of office.
- (d) The three Commissioners of the First Mildura Irrigation Trust appointed pursuant to the said section to act with the said additional Commissioners shall cease to so act.

(e) Sections three, four, and five of the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1909 are repealed.

2. That the limits of the land within which the said Water Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries, and which shall constitute the Mildura Urban Water Trust District.

REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of June, 1921.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth, under the Mildura Irrigation Trust Acts, make the regulations following:—

- 1. Interpretation of Terms.*—In these regulations "the Acts" shall mean the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Acts; "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Mildura Urban Water Trust; "the District" or "the said District" shall mean the Mildura Urban Water Trust District as described in the Order in Council constituting the same.
- 2. These regulations shall apply to the first election of the Commissioners for the said Urban Trust as authorized by the said Acts. Provided that clause number 7 herein shall also apply to subsequent annual elections of Commissioners.*
- 3. Period for which Commissioners shall hold Office.*—Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained for securing the annual retirement of two Commissioners, the period during which the Commissioners of the said urban trust shall hold office shall be three years.
- 4. Annual Retirement of Commissioners.*—Two Commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring Commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, be eligible for re-election.
- 5. Term of Office of Persons Elected Commissioners at the First Election.*—Two of the persons elected Commissioners at such election shall hold office as such Commissioners for one year only from the date of such election, two others of such persons shall hold office for two years only from the date of such election, and the remaining persons elected as such Commissioners shall hold office for three years only from the date

of such election, and the particular term for which each such person so elected a Commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following (that is to say):—

- (a) How Term of Office is Ascertained when no Poll Taken.*—If the election is made without a poll, as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a Commissioner shall hold office shall, immediately upon such election, be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as Commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.
- (b) How Term of Office Ascertained when Poll Taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be taken as in these regulations provided, then of the six candidates elected as such Commissioners the two candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as Commissioners for three years only from the date of such election, and the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for two years only from the date of such election, and the remaining candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for one year only from the date of such election, and if three, or more than three, candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot the term or terms as aforesaid during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

6. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 17 of the regulations of the twenty-third day of May, 1916, relating to the election of Commissioners and Auditors of the Trust, it shall be sufficient for the first election of such Commissioners as aforesaid if eight clear days' public notice by advertisement be given, and nominations of candidates for election as provided in such clause shall be made not less than four nor more than seven clear days after the time of giving public notice as aforesaid.

7. The said regulations made under the said Acts, and dated the twenty-third day of May, 1916, together with the forms set forth in the schedule thereto shall where applicable and not otherwise provided by these regulations, apply to the first and annual elections of Commissioners under the said Mildura Irrigation Trusts Acts.

And the Honorable Harry Sutherland Wightman Lawson, His Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

BY-LAW NO. 44.

A By-law of the Borough of Hamilton made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered forty-four, for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings in portion of the borough of Hamilton, and for other purposes appearing in the said By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the borough of Hamilton, order as follows:—

PART I.

Definitions.

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context:—

"Builder."—"Builder" means the master builder or other person employed to execute any work or if there is no master builder or other person so employed then the owner of the building or other person for whom or by whose orders such work is to be done.

"Building."—"Building" means any structure capable of affording protection or shelter either roofed or intended or adapted to be roofed and whether enclosed by walls or not; but does not include any greenhouse aviary fence or other similar building or erection.

"Cross Wall."—"Cross wall" means any internal wall built in connexion with any external or party wall and bonding them together.

"Dwelling House."—"Dwelling house" means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.

"External Wall."—"External wall" means an outer wall or vertical enclosure of any building not being a party wall.

"Factor of Safety."—"Factor of safety" means the ratio of ultimate load to safe load.

"First Story."—"First story" means that story of a building which is next above the ground story, the successive stories above the first story being the second story, the third story, and so on to the topmost story.

"Foundation."—"Foundation" applied to a wall means the solid ground or artificially-formed support.

"Level of the Ground."—"Level of the ground" means the mean level of the ground as determined by the Surveyor.

"Person."—"Person" shall include a corporation unless there is something repugnant to or inconsistent with that interpretation.

"Surveyor."—"Surveyor" means the engineer or building surveyor or other proper officer for the time being of the municipality.

PART II.

(1) Notice of Intention to Build or Demolish and Lodgment of Plans.

1. Notice to be given—Plans and Specifications.—No builder or other person shall save with the consent under seal of the Council of the municipality of the borough of Hamilton commence any building erection or structure or any addition or alteration to any building erection or structure without first delivering at the office of the surveyor a written notice of such intention three days before so commencing and until the plans have been approved in writing by the surveyor and producing to the surveyor properly prepared plans and specifications of such building erection structure addition or alteration together with a tracing or copy of the plans of such building erection structure addition or alteration and also details and dimensions sizes and qualities of all materials and enumerating any old materials proposed to be used in the construction of same.

2. Original Plans to be returned: Tracings to be retained.—The original plans and specifications when approved shall be returned to the owner or his agent but the tracing or copy of the plans and details of materials shall be retained by the surveyor.

3. Demolition or removal of buildings.—When a building is to be demolished or removed the owner, or contractor shall give twenty-four hours' notice to the surveyor of such intended demolition or removal.

4. Method of demolition.—In carrying out the work of demolition story after story shall be completely removed. No material shall be placed upon the floor of such building in course of demolition: but the bricks, timbers and other structural parts of each story shall be lowered to the ground immediately upon displacement and removed unless special permission is granted by the surveyor.

5. External walls.—No person shall pull down any portion of any external wall abutting on any street between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the afternoon except by consent of the surveyor.

6. Nuisance to be avoided.—The builder pulling down or demolishing any building shall make provision sufficient to avoid all nuisance from dust or falling refuse by playing water on same by means of a rose or by other method approved by the surveyor.

(2) Payment of Fees and Permit.

7. Permit—Fees.—No builder shall commence any building erection or structure or any addition or alteration to any building erection or structure without first having obtained from the surveyor a written permit for the commencement of same and having paid to the Town Clerk of the borough of Hamilton such sum as is demanded by him on account of fees in respect thereof not exceeding in the whole the maximum fixed by the scale of fees set forth hereunder:—

(3) Duties of Surveyor.

8. Surveyor to cause By-law to be observed.—The surveyor shall upon the receipt of any such notice as aforesaid and also upon any work being observed by or made known to him which is affected by the provisions of this By-law, but in respect of which no notice has been given and also from time to time during the progress of any work affected by such provisions as often as may be necessary for securing the due observance of such provisions survey any such building structure erection or work and cause all such provisions to be duly observed.

9. Power to enter and inspect.—The surveyor at all reasonable times during the progress and during the thirty days next after the completion of any building structure erection or work affected by any of the provisions of this By-law or by any terms or conditions on which the observance of any such provisions may have been dispensed with may enter and inspect such building structure or work.

10. General power of entry.—The surveyor may for the purpose of ascertaining whether any building structure or erection is in such a situation or possesses such characteristics as are required in order to exempt it from the operation of any of the provisions of this By-law at all reasonable times and after reasonable notice enter any premises and he may do therein all such things as are reasonably necessary for that purpose.

PART III.

Materials, &c.

No builder or other person shall after the coming into force of this By-law erect any building or structure or make any addition to any building erection or structure unless the following conditions and specifications are complied with:—

The outer walls shall be built of brick, stone, concrete, steel framing covered with corrugated galvanized iron or other non-combustible material approved by the surveyor and the internal walls shall be composed of similar material.

The thickness of the walls must be not less than that set out in the following schedule and where a wall is over twenty feet in length without cross walls or lateral support it must be stiffened with piers at least four and one-half inches thick and eighteen inches wide, placed at intervals of not less than fifteen feet.

For a Single-story Building—

Brick nine inches for external walls, for internal walls four and one-half inches.
Stone fifteen inches for external walls, for internal walls six inches.
Concrete six inches piers and three inches screen walls, for internal walls three inches.

For a Two-story Building—

The lower external walls to be for brick fourteen inches, internal walls nine inches.

The upper external walls to be for brick nine inches, internal walls four and one-half inches.
Concrete both upper and lower walls may be six inches piers, and three inches screens providing they are reinforced to provide for the strains caused by the class of building and its use, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

For a Three-story Building—

The lower external walls for brick to be eighteen inches.
The first story walls for brick to be fourteen inches.
The second story walls for brick to be nine inches.
The internal walls to be for ground floor nine inches.
The internal walls to be for first floor nine inches.
The internal walls to be for second floor four and one-half inches.

For concrete or steel framing all walls shall be of such dimensions and of such reinforcements as the Surveyor of the Council shall approve.

For any additional stories the walls shall be of such thickness as the Engineer or Surveyor may decide.

All walls must be built on foundations of concrete, stone, brick or other material approved by the Engineer or Surveyor and must be of a depth and thickness sufficient in the opinion of the Engineer or Surveyor to carry the weight of the buildings and its maximum loading and must be designed so that the building will in the opinion of the said Engineer or Surveyor be safely carried by the soil upon which it is built without undue or uneven settlement. The builder or person submitting the plans must produce evidence to enable the Surveyor to be satisfied on this point.

The roofs shall be framed of wood of a suitable quality to satisfy the Surveyor and covered with iron, slate, tiles or other non-combustible material approved by the Engineer to the Council. The under side of ceiling joists shall be covered with plaster on metal lathing, or fibro cement sheets screwed on and the joists covered with strips of the same material.

Floors at the several stories shall be framed of hardwood approved by the Surveyor and covered with boards at least seven-eighths of an inch thick. The under side of floor joists forming first or other floors shall be covered with plaster or metal lathing or fibrous cement sheets screwed on and the joints covered with strips of the same material. Where it is necessary to use girders they must be of iron steel or reinforced concrete protected by asbestos or coke breeze concrete.

All columns needed to carry upper walls or floors or both must be of iron brick concrete or other non-combustible material designed to carry the maximum loads that may occur with a factor of safety of five of the breaking strains of the materials of which they are composed and must be approved by and erected to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

All girders carrying brick walls must be of steel or reinforced concrete and of such dimensions as will carry the maximum loads likely to occur with a factor of safety of five.

All chimneys and fireplaces must be built in brick stone or concrete the flues being carried at least twelve inches higher than the highest part of the roof. An outer hearth must be provided to each fireplace at least sixteen inches wide and nine inches longer than the opening of the fireplace.

All external walls dividing one building from another must have parapet walls at least nine inches thick for brick or stone and four inches thick for reinforced concrete and must be carried up at least three feet above the gutter of the roof abutting on such parapet and the parapet must be rendered in cement on both sides and along the top when constructed of brick or stone.

Within the boundaries set out in this By-law small sheds or outbuildings may be erected of wood framing covered with galvanized corrugated iron provided they are not within one hundred and fifty feet of any street or within twenty feet of any building fronting any street or within ten feet of any other such shed save where a solid wall of some non-combustible material is built between such sheds and carried up three feet above the roof of the highest shed where it abuts on to the said wall.

PART IV.

Enforcement, Penalties and Administration.

1. The officer to administer this By-law shall be the Surveyor to the Council or such other officer or officers as the Council of the municipality may from time to time appoint.

2. The provisions of this By-law shall apply to any building or buildings to be altered or repaired as well as to new buildings.

3. Where any building or erection is after the coming into force of this By-law partly or wholly erected built altered repaired or constructed contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law—

- (a) the Council may give to the owner or builder or leave upon the site of such building or erection two clear days' notice in writing (which notice may be signed by the Surveyor or other officer on behalf of the Council) to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions or may require the pulling down or removal of such building or erection; and

(b) if default is made in complying with such notice and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty it shall be lawful for the Council through its Surveyor to enter upon such building or erection and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen and to demolish and pull down the said building or erection or any part or parts thereof and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purposes and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place; and if the Council in their discretion think fit the Council may sell the same in such manner as the Council think fit; and

(c) all expenses incurred by the Council or Surveyor in demolishing and pulling down the said building or erection or any part thereof or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same and in doing such other acts as aforesaid and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale; and

(d) the Council shall pay over any surplus arising from such sale on application being made by the person entitled thereto.

4. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence from the Council.

PART V.

Scope of Operation of By-law.

This By-law shall have operation throughout the following part or parts of the Municipal District that is to say:—

The whole of allotments ten to nineteen both inclusive of section one, the whole of allotments one to nine both inclusive of section two, allotments eighteen, nineteen and twenty of section two, allotments one, eighteen, nineteen and twenty of section three, the whole of section four, the whole of section five, allotments eight, nine, ten and eleven of section six, the whole of section eight, and the whole of section nine all in the township of Hamilton parish of North Hamilton county of Dundas.

PART VI.

Repeal.

Regulation number 30 made under By-law number 15 of the borough of Hamilton shall be and is hereby repealed.

A By-law of the Borough of Hamilton made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act* 1915 and numbered 45 for prescribing the minimum area minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which dwelling houses may be erected and for other purposes mentioned in the said section.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Hamilton order as follows:—

1. Save where the Council of the Borough expressly consents no person shall within the Borough of Hamilton build or erect any dwelling house unless the land on which such dwelling house is to be erected has a minimum frontage of fifty feet and a minimum depth of one hundred feet and unless such dwelling house shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof an area of not less than one thousand five hundred square feet of open land.

2. Where a dwelling house in existence at the time of this By-law coming into force is wholly or partly destroyed by fire or where the owner desires to replace such dwelling house existing at the time of this By-law coming into force a dwelling house may be erected or such dwelling house may be replaced notwithstanding that the land has not the frontage or depth provided in clause 1 of this By-law.

3. Where an allotment of land does not comply with the provisions of clause 1 of this By-law the Council may notwithstanding on the application of the owner thereof grant permission for a dwelling house of such kind as may be approved by the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Hamilton or its surveyor to be erected on such allotment.

4. This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

Thrice a week for each pan per annum ... 6 0 0

Such charge shall be payable half-yearly in advance.

4. Failure to pay the said annual charge or any part thereof shall be a breach of this By-law.
