Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE PHOTOGRAPHERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination, on the 2nd July, 1921, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the town of Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process of making photographs" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 2nd day of July, 1921, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVERTIME.—All work done in excess of 44 hours in any week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(4) CASUAL LABOUR.—Any person casually employed for not more than 22 hours during any week shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday; and time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Eight Hours Day (21st April), Easter Monday, King's Birthday (3rd June), or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
