SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.

BY-LAW No. 68.

Greensborough Park Regulations.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg made under the provision of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 68, for regulating charges of admission to and the conduct of persons at or within the reserve known as the Greensborough Park.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in the said park, reserve, land, or ground, or throw stones or any missile, beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave bottles therein, paper, orange peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in or around the said park, reserve, land, or ground, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences, gates, or trees, or cut letters or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

3. No person except those in the employ of, or authorized by, the Council, shall bring into the said park, reserve, land, or ground any horse vehicle, or enter plots of ground therein closed for plantation or other purposes.

4. All dogs, goats, and all poultry found within the said park, reserve, land, or ground shall be destroyed, and the owner shall be liable to make compensation for any damage done.

5. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the said park, reserve, land, or ground unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.

6. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the said park, reserve, land, or ground any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the Council, or by a constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

7. No person except those in the employ of, or authorized by the Council, shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or other vehicle in the said park, reserve, land, or ground.

8. The Council shall have power to hold entertainments or performances in the park, reserve, land, or ground, and to make a charge for admission thereto.

9. The Council shall have power to let the park, reserve, land, or ground to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto.

10. No charge or fee for admission to such park, reserve, land, or ground shall exceed Two shillings for each adult person, and One shilling for each child under the age of twelve years, unless the Council previously authorize higher charges.

11. No person except the members of the Council, the shire secretary, shire engineer, and employees of the Council on duty shall enter any portion of such park, reserve, land, or ground when a charge is made for admission, without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Council.

12. No person unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission, until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.

13. No person shall carry firearms in or through the park, reserve, land, or ground, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds therein, unless by authority of the Council.

14. No person shall engage in training, or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in the park, reserve, land, or ground, without the written authority of the Council, and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council.

15. No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within such park, reserve, land, or ground.

16. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work any of the Council's employees engaged in the park, reserve, land, or ground by conversation or otherwise.

17. No person shall sell or offer for sale within such park, reserve, land, or ground any article of food or drink, or any other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement, without the written permission of the Council.

18. No person shall remain in such park, reserve, land, or ground at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Council to leave the same.

19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in such park, reserve, land, or ground.

20. No persons shall assemble in the park, reserve, land, or ground for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission, in writing, of the Council.

21. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary hereto shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

22. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the enclosure known as the Greensborough Park.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 19th day of April, 1921, and confirmed on the 17th day of May, 1921.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Fourteen pounds (£14) and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1921.

2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Fourteen pounds (£14) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to what the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be Ninepence (9d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the municipal charge shall be not less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation of the shire of Shepparton for the year 1921 of the property so supplied.

6. For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, public gardens, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show grounds, cattle yards, sheep dips, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works, or the erection of new buildings, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust, and shall be fixed by the Trust's officer or officers. The applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this clause shall first notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purpose until authorized, in writing, so to do. The Trust's officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.

10. Such rates are hereby payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1921. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Chairman and the Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust under and by virtue of the powers contained in the Water Acts, on the evening of Tuesday, the tenth day of May, 1921.

No ballast, rubbish, gravel, earth, stone, wreck, filth, refuse, oil, tar, or any compound thereof, or any other material whatsoever (except ashes from the fires of steam-ships plying within the port of Port Phillip, which may be discharged in a depth of not less than 11 fathoms of water), shall be thrown by any person into any port, river, or anchorage, or be placed, landed, or shipped in any port, except at the places and in the manner pointed out by the Port Officer, and all such ballast, rubbish, gravel, earth, stone, wreck, filth, refuse, oil, tar, or any compound thereof, or other material shall be removed at such times and to such places as the Port Officer may direct.

No. 2748) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time if he thinks fit (either with or without a request from the Council of any of the boroughs or shires constituting such union) and shall at the request of not less than half of such Councils, dissolve the same by a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the Council of the borough of Ararat has requested that the Weights and Measures Union of the borough and shire of Ararat be dissolved: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation dissolve the "Union" of the borough and shire of Ararat as aforesaid.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRADO.

WE, John Francis Chalmers, William Allen, Josiah Richards, Albert Edward Huckstepp, William Herbert Emmins, Ashton Woolley, and Elijah James Stranger, the duly appointed Committee of Management of land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 27th January, 1920, for Recreation purposes in the township of Morradoo, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :-

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

2. It shall not be lawful between the hours of six o'clock in the forenoon and twelve o'clock at night to drive into or through any part of the City of Fitzroy any cattle intended for sale slaughter or shipment or travelling from one part of Victoria or of any other State to any other part.

Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to horses driven in harness or to oxen in the yoke or to dairy cows.

NOTE.—The word "cattle" includes horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, and swine.—(*Local Government Act* 1915, section 3.)
