Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 4.—BUTCHERS, COUNTRY.

NOTE.—(a) This Determination, on the 11th July, 1921, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrambool, the town of Sandringham, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

(b) On the 16th day of March, 1914, the power given to the Country Shop Assistants Board to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in or in connexion with a butcher's shop as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter," was conferred exclusively on this Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a butcher or seller of meat, or maker or seller of small goods" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That this Determination shall come into force and be operative on and after the 11th July, 1921.

3. OVERTIME.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 48 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time, and a half.

4. SPECIAL RATES.—Time and a half shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
