(1) No person shall build erect or construct or commence to build erect or construct or convert or alter any building or structure to be used or that is adapted to be used as a public hall, church, chapel, theatre, school-house, private hospital, charitable institution, factory, workshop, store-house, laundry, forge, motor garage (other than a private garage appurtenant to a dwelling-house) livery or other stable (containing more than two stalls) or any wholesale or retail shop or any premises to be used for manufacturing purposes or for the storage of timber or other material or for carrying on any trade or business unless in addition to all the other requirements of the Building Regulations and By-laws of the Council being complied with the person on whose behalf such aforesaid building or structure is being built erected or converted or altered shall have first obtained the consent in writing of the Council to the site thereof. And it shall be within the discretion of the Council to withhold such consent if in its opinion the erection

construction alteration or conversion of such building on the proposed site would prove detrimental to surrounding dwelling-houses or for any other good and sufficient reason.

(2) The foregoing provisions shall however not apply to any premises or buildings used or occupied as consulting rooms or chambers by medical men or members of other learned professions provided such buildings are not nearer than 20 feet to the building line of any street or road.

(3) This By-law shall come into force immediately on its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette* and shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city of Camberwell.

SHIRE OF MORWELL.

By-Law No. 11.

A By-law of the Shire of Morwell made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1919, for the purpose of prescribing the fees for the registration of premises, and the renewal or transfer of such registration.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1919, and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and the Ratepayers of the Shire of Morwell order as follows:—

Health Act 1919.

SHIRE OF NEWHAM AND WOODEND.

BY-LAW No. 12.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1919 and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Newham and Woodend, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Woodend.

4. The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the township of Woodend shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent material, and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish, or garbage produced or accumulated in and about such house, building, or premises to be from time to time deposited in such receptacle or receptacles.

5. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

6. Once a week, on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building, or premises, such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the Council.

7. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

8. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
