Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation to apply within the shire of Newham and Woodend, viz.:—

DIVISION 14 OF PART V. WITH REGARD TO COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING MADE APPLICABLE TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS OF COUNCILLORS OF THE CITY OF ESSENDON UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 148 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1915 (No. 2686) AS AMENDED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1918 (No. 2981):

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the City of Essendon, doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

*The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.***COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.**

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the Ward) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each Ward to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
- (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
- (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
- (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.

(4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—

- (a) ascertain from the certified list received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole Ward the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

(12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
- (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the City of Essendon of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

DECLARATION OF DEVELOPMENTAL ROADS UNDER THE DEVELOPMENTAL ROADS ACT IN THE SHIRE OF RIPON.

WHEREAS by the resolution set out below and dated the twenty-first day of July One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) being of opinion that the roads set out or described in the Schedule to the same are of sufficient importance and will serve to develop areas of land (whether alienated from the Crown or not) by providing access to railway stations or to main roads leading to railway stations and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* (No. 2944) declared such roads to be developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such resolution whereupon any road or part thereof mentioned in the said resolution shall be a developmental road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such resolution of the Country Roads Board developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

The Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the roads set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance and will serve to develop areas of land by providing access to railway stations or to main roads leading to railway stations, acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* (No. 2944) doth by this resolution hereby declare such roads to be developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Developmental Roads Act 1918*.

SCHEDULE.

Shire of Ripon.

1. *Trawalla-road* (14151).—Commencing at its junction with the Ballarat-Ararat (main) road at the north-western angle of allotment 1, section A, parish of Brewster, at the northern boundary of the shire; thence generally south-easterly and southerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 46, Trawalla Estate, parish of Lillirie.

2. *Trawalla East Road* (14152).—Commencing at its junction with the Trawalla-road at the north-western angle of allotment 20, Trawalla Estate, parish of Brewster; thence easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 16 of the said estate and parish.

3. *Trawalla West-road* (14153).—Commencing at the most northerly angle of allotment 51, Trawalla Estate, parish of Lillirie; thence south-westerly and generally southerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 84 of the said estate; thence westerly to the Emu Creek.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the 29th day of October, 1909, under the provisions of the *Tramways Act* (No. 1148), and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th day of November, 1909, the Councils of the municipalities of the city of Geelong and the boroughs of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell were authorized to construct tramways within the municipal districts of the city of Geelong and the boroughs of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell: And whereas by a further Order in Council, made on the 19th day of August, 1913, under the provisions of the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 27th day of August, 1913, the Order in Council made on the 29th day of October, 1909, was amended in the manner set out in such Order: And whereas the Councils of the city of Geelong and the boroughs of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell have now made application under the provisions of the *Tramways Act 1915* to have the said Order made on the 29th day of October, 1909, amended and extended in the manner hereinafter referred to: And the said Councils having duly complied with the requirements of the said Act and the regulations made thereunder with regard to the publication of its intention to so apply, and no objections having been lodged thereto within the time provided by the said rules, and the Governor in Council being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions set out in the Order in Council of the 29th day of October, 1909: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say:—

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the clause in the said Order in Council of the 29th October, 1909, headed "Tolls and Charges," shall be, and is hereby, amended by deleting therefrom the following words:—"Every passenger travelling by the workmen's cars over the said tramway shall be entitled to a return ticket at the price of Threepence (3d.) per ticket."

ADDITIONAL FARES ON SUNDAYS, ETC.

That the Councils shall, in addition to the fares prescribed in Order in Council made on the 29th day of October, 1909, be authorized, on Sundays and any day on which, under any award, the Councils are bound to pay increased rates of wages to their employees, to charge an additional fare of One penny (1d.) for the whole or any part of the journey. Children under twelve (12) years of age, half fare, and children in arms, free of charge.

And the Honorable Frank Clarke, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Tramways Act 1915, as amended by section 3 of the Tramways Act 1918 (No. 2995), it is provided that tramways (other than tramways within the meaning of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1918) may be constructed in any municipal district including the city of Geelong when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Council of the municipality of the city of Geelong has made an application under the common seal of the said municipality in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said city of Geelong: And whereas the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said Council to make the said application, in which notice the route proposed to be followed was described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided by the said Rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following (that is to say):—That the Council of the municipality of the city of Geelong shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the city of Geelong.

ROUTE.

Commencing at the intersection of Moorabool-street and Ryrie-street; thence easterly along Ryrie-street to Garden-street; thence southerly along Garden-street to Ormond-road; thence south-easterly along Ormond-road to Boundary-road.

GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans numbered from 1 to 8 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans so deposited as the plans referred to in this Order, and which plans are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

BRAKES.

That each car shall be fitted with three brakes, viz.:—

- (1) A wheel handbrake.
- (2) A slipper of track brake gripping the rails.
- (3) A rheostatic electric emergency brake.

MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be fifteen (15) miles in the hour, excepting on curves, where the speed must be reduced sufficiently to insure the safety of the public.

TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within the period of two years from the date of delegation by the Council of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

TRAFFIC.

That such tramway shall be used for passengers, passengers' luggage, light goods, and parcels.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of the passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Council of the said municipality.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTLING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop, for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers, at such points upon the route of the said tramway as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be, but shall not exceed, the sum of Threepence (3d.) for the whole or any part of the journey. Children under twelve (12) years of age, half fare; and children in arms, free of charge.

ADDITIONAL FARES.

On Sundays and any day on which under any award the Council is bound to pay increased rates of wages to its employees, the Council is authorized to charge an additional fare of One penny (1d.) for the whole or part of the journey. Children under twelve (12) years of age, half fare; and children in arms, free of charge.

FOR THE CARRIAGE OF LUGGAGE, LIGHT GOODS, AND PARCELS
THE CHARGE SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:—

If in charge of passenger, when the weight exceeds 28 lbs. or size exceeds 18 inches by 18 inches by 18 inches, the like fares as for one passenger for each article or package or luggage taken on the car. Where no passenger, but sent in charge of conductor, the like fares as per passenger for each article or package so sent. On Sundays and such other days as aforesaid similar increased fares as for adult passengers may be charged.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and, for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the reference made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of, or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall in his adjudication state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said municipality of the city of Geelong shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Council of the said municipality finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than the work provided for in this Order, the Council of the said municipality shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government or upon the Board of Land and Works for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure or to provide funds therefor.

County of Bendigo, parish of Eppalock: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 6, bounded thence by lines bearing respectively—E. 336 7-10th links; N. 56 deg. 33 min. WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purpose therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order revoke sub-clause (1) of clause 5 of Chapter 1 of the Regulations made on the third day of February, 1920, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

DOORS AND GATEWAYS.

(i) Doors and gates forming exits from a factory shall, if so required by the administrators, be hung to open outwards towards the nearest road, street, or right-of-way, or to open both inwards and outwards.

No door or gate shall be hung so as to open immediately on to a flight of steps, or to obstruct when open any exit.

No door or gate shall during the working hours of the factory be secured with fastenings other than such as will allow such door or gate to be readily opened from the inside without a key.

No door or gate across a passage shall have any other fastening except such as will allow the door to be readily opened from each side without a key. Knobs and handles of all bolts and locks must be firmly secured.

No door to a fire-isolated stairway shall during the working hours of the factory be—

(a) kept open for a longer time than is necessary for the passage of persons or goods;

(b) prevented from closing by wedges or other means.

CONSTITUTION OF COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS TO CONSIDER A REFERENCE OF THE DETERMINATION OF THE JAM TRADE BOARD.

WHEREAS the Wages Board (herein referred to as the Jam Trade Board) appointed under the Factories and Shops Acts "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of manufacturing jam, fruit jelly, pickles and sauces, or (a) preparing, canning, or preserving lemon or other peel, fruit, or vegetables; (b) preparing or putting up any of such articles for sale," did by a certain Determination made on the third day of June, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fourteenth day of June, 1921, following, determine the lowest prices or rates to be so paid: And whereas the Minister of Labour has referred the said Determination for the consideration of the Court of Industrial Appeals under the Factories and Shops Acts: Now therefore it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf vested in him by the said Acts, that a Court of Industrial Appeals consisting of the President, His Honour Mr. Justice Mann, and Henry Madren Leggo, of Bendigo, a person who is *bonâ fide* and actually engaged in the trade concerned, duly nominated by the Minister of Labour (default in nominating an eligible person having been made by the representatives of the employers) to represent the employers, and John Gourlay, of 25 Chambers-street, South Yarra, a person who has been *bonâ fide* and actually engaged in such trade for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination, nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employees, be and, the same is hereby constituted to consider and deal with the reference aforesaid of the Determination of the Jam Trade Board and to revise or alter the said Court's own Determination from time to time in form and manner as provided by law.

EXTENSION OF THE POWERS OF THE CHAFFCUTTERS' BOARD.

6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any watercourse, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground.
