NOTICE OF INTENTION RE NETTING AT GIPPSLAND LAKES ENTRANCE.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette* to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to repeal the Proclamations made the sixteenth day of May, 1911, the second day of December, 1912, the third day of September, 1918, and the second day of July, 1920, re netting at Gippsland Lakes Entrance, and to make a Proclamation prohibiting during the whole year the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the waters of Gippsland Lakes Entrance eastward of an imaginary line running south from the Rocky Point at Maringu Creek to a post on the northern foreshore of Rigby Island and eastward of an imaginary line running north 67 deg. 30 min. west from the most northerly point of the Stone Training Wall (which extends from the western pier at the Lakes Entrance) to a post on the eastern foreshore of Rigby Island (all bearings magnetic), including a portion of Reeves Channel and the whole of Cunninghame and North Arms; provided that from the sixteenth day of May to the thirtieth day of November in each year such trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines may be used in Cunninghame Arm eastward of an imaginary line running approximately north-north-west (magnetic) from the inner end of the Eastern Pier of the "Lakes Entrance" to the inner end of the pier at Bullock Island; provided further that so far as Cunninghame Arm is concerned such trammels, trawls, or other nets or fixed engines shall not be used between Ten o'clock in the morning of each Friday and sunrise of each Sunday following nor within one hundred feet of any wharf, pier, or jetty in such arm.

NOTE.—Cunninghame Arm does not include the chain of lagoons at the eastern end of the arm and partly connected therewith: in such lagoons and connecting waters the use of nets and fixed engines is prohibited during the whole year. Privately-owned jetties will not be considered jetties for the purpose of the intended proclamation.

AMENDMENT OF "THE PASSENGER (SAILING AND MOTOR) BOAT REGULATIONS 1915."

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Marine Act 1915* to make and amend Regulations for the licensing of all boats plying for hire or let out for hire or valuable consideration in any port in Victoria, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of the said State in Council, doth make the amending Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations 1921" and shall take effect from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these Regulations the expression "Principal Regulations" shall mean the Regulations made and passed by the Marine Board of Victoria on the twenty-seventh day of August One thousand nine hundred and fifteen and approved by the Governor in Council on the 31st day of the same month.

3. Clause 22 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended in the manner following (that is to say):—

(1) In sub-clause (a) thereof by the insertion after the words "on board" of the words "including the person or persons in charge, two (2) approved life-buoys."

(2) In sub-clause (b) thereof by the insertion after the words "life buoys" of the words "an approved life-belt for every person licensed to be carried on board including the person or persons in charge."

(3) By the insertion after sub-clause (d) thereof the following new sub-clause:—

"(e) Every boat the depth of which amidships exceeds three (3) feet shall be provided with means for bailing consisting of at least one (1) approved hand bilge pump."

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this twenty-eighth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

RATES OF PILOTAGE ON SHIPS WITHOUT THE HEADS NOT PROCEEDING UP PORT PHILLIP BAY AND ON SHIPS LEAVING HOBSON'S BAY BUT WHICH DO NOT PROCEED EITHER TO CORIO BAY OR TO THE HEADS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Marine Act 1915* on the Marine Board of Victoria to from time to time, with the approval of the Governor in Council, fix the rates of pilotage on ships arriving at or departing from any of the ports of Victoria, or from any one part of such port to any other part, the said Board (as items additional to those provided for in the existing scale) doth hereby, with the approval of the Governor in Council, fix and appoint in relation to Port Phillip that the rates of pilotage to be paid in respect of the services below indicated shall be as follows (that is to say):—

PORT PHILLIP.

1. In the case of a steam-ship from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage off the Quarantine Station, Portsea, which vessel it is intended thereafter shall resume her voyage without proceeding up Port Phillip Bay, as well as in the case of such a steam-ship subsequently from such anchorage proceeding outside Port Phillip Heads, the rates of pilotage to be paid in respect of such services shall be an amount equal to one-half of the total amount that would be payable in respect of a vessel from without Port Phillip Heads proceeding to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay and *vice versa*.

2. When the services of a pilot have been received in respect of any ship in relation to a service not expressly provided for by the existing scales the pilotage shall be computed and paid at such rate (calculated on the net registered tonnage of the vessel, but not in any case to be higher than the rate prescribed by the existing scales for a vessel of like tonnage in respect of some service provided for in such scales which in the opinion of the Board most closely resembles the service in question) as the Marine Board of Victoria may fix as just having regard to the nature of the service and the circumstances of the case.

The foregoing rates were fixed and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this twenty-eighth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 25th November, 1912, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.
- (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying, for

the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]
(Signed) _____ A.B.

(Date.) _____

NOTE.—For this purpose a “qualified surveyor” shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by “Balfour Stewart’s Elementary Physics,” Fourth Edition; omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by “Geikie’s Class-book of Geology,” Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st

January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 ls.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1915*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

KERANG WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 22, Making a Rate for 1921.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the district of the Kerang Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house or tenement of the annual value of over Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in the cases of special agreement.

For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if in the absence of a contract, on the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. Minimum charge, One pound.

The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the first day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1921, and shall be due and payable on the first day of September, 1921. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the rates and charges hereby made.

BY-LAW NO. 35.

By-law No. 35.

No person shall trespass on the Trust's Reservoir or fish or angle or net for fish in the said Reservoir without having first obtained a licence from the Trust for that purpose, and no person shall light any fire within such Reservoir or Reserve or shall damage any of the Trust's property thereon. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to prosecution by the Trust or any person authorized in that behalf by the Trust and the penalty for any such offence shall not exceed Five pounds.

ROSEDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 1.

THE Rosedale Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks District:—

1. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

2. Before any such licence is granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber.

3. The Trust may at any time cancel any such licence if, in the opinion of the Trust Commissioners, the holder thereof, by himself or his employees, commits any breach of this By-law.

4. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice in writing to the Trust or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work, the property of the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust or with any service pipe connected therewith, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence. Galvanized wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

Diameter of Pipe.	Weight of Pipe per Yard.
$\frac{3}{4}$ inch	5 lbs.
$\frac{1}{2}$ inch	6 lbs.
$\frac{3}{8}$ inch	7 $\frac{1}{2}$ lbs.
$\frac{1}{4}$ inch	9 lbs.
1 inch	12 lbs.
1 $\frac{1}{4}$ inch	20 lbs.
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch	28 lbs.

All fittings must be of good quality, and of strength to bear with safety the maximum pressure to which they may be subjected. Connexions with the pipes of the Trust must be with proper stop-cock screwed ferrules. One service pipe only, for domestic supply, to each tenement will be permitted. The maximum size of service pipes, unless by special consent of the Trust, shall be for tenements of annual value not exceeding £40, $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. bore; for tenements exceeding £40 annual value, 1-in. bore. All service pipes on private property shall be at a depth of not less than 10 inches below the surface of the ground.

6. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed to each service at a distance of not more than 3 feet from the building line, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

7. The service pipes from the mains being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the occupier or owner shall, in every instance in which any damage is caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be guilty of an offence.

8. If any person neglect to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from the proper officer of the Trust that such service pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise, as the Trust may see fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected.

9. The Trust may at any time, when found necessary, repair or renew any pipes and stop-cocks laid for conveying a supply of water to any tenement, and may charge the owner thereof with the cost and expense of providing and laying, repairing, or renewing the same; and such cost and expense shall be a debt due by such owner to the Trust, and shall be recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

10. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be guilty of an offence.

11. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be guilty of an offence.

12. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Trust. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

- For $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. meter, Four shillings;
- For $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. meter, Five shillings;
- For any meter of larger size than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch, 6 per cent. upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of the months of January and July in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Trust, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

13. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of the meter hired from the Trust, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust, who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

14. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and re-fixed, by taking it as equal to the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

15. Meters used for measuring the water supplied to consumers, other than such as are hired from the Trust, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Trust; a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

16. The Trust, by its officers, may, at any time, after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer, and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of ten in the forenoon and four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

17. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Trust, on which such waste is continued.

18. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Trust shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair.

19. Any person, whether licensed or not, connecting any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing the self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be guilty of an offence.

20. Water closets and urinals will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the pipes of the Trust, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continually, and that not more than two gallons can escape at one flush; the supply thereto shall be by measure.

21. Any person, having received a supply of water from the Trust allowing any other person who has not agreed to be supplied by the Trust to use such water, shall be guilty of an offence; and any such last-mentioned person so using such water shall be guilty of an offence.

22. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, the Trust may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

23. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

24. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole. The expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Trust authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Trust.

ROSEDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 2.

Standing Orders

For regulating and appointing the place and hour of meetings of the Rosedale Waterworks Trust, and providing for the management and conduct of business thereat.

WHEREAS by the Water Acts power is given to any authority (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council) from time to time to make, amend, and repeal By-laws relating

(*inter alia*) to the appointment of the place and hour of meetings, whether periodical or special, and providing for the due management and conduct of business thereat: Be it therefore ordered and directed (subject as aforesaid) by the Commissioners of the Rosedale Waterworks Trust, such Trust being an authority under the said Acts, as follows, viz.:—

1. In all cases not provided for by Acts of Parliament of Victoria relating to authorities, or by this By-law, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Place, Hour, and Adjournment of Meetings.*—Meetings of the Trust shall be held periodically at the offices of the Trust on the third Monday in the month, to date from 18th December, 1916, at the hour of Three o'clock p.m., and the Commissioners thereof may from time to time by adjournment from any such meeting, or for any subsequent adjournment thereof, meet together at any convenient place, and at such hour to be from time to time appointed by them for that purpose.

3. *Meetings, Special.*—A special meeting of the Commissioners may at any time be called by the Chairman or by the Minister, and shall be called by the Chairman as so requested, in writing, under the hands of any two Commissioners. No special meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given to each Commissioner. Such notice shall be in writing, and shall specify the time of the meeting and the object thereof, and shall be delivered or sent through the post office or otherwise to the place of abode or the usual place of business (if any) within the Waterworks District of such Commissioner. No business shall be transacted at any special meeting except what is stated in the notice thereof.

4. *Powers Vested in Commissioners.*—All powers vested in a Waterworks Trust may be exercised by a Waterworks Trust at any meeting held in pursuance of the Water Acts at which there is a quorum of the Commissioners present, but not otherwise.

5. *Quorum.*—A quorum of the Commissioners shall consist of one-half of the whole number of Commissioners. If there is not a quorum of Commissioners present within a quarter of an hour after the time appointed for any meeting, the Commissioners present, or the major part of them, or any one Commissioner, if there is only one present, may adjourn the meeting until another hour or another day; if no Commissioner is present the Secretary may so adjourn the meeting. Except where a meeting is so adjourned to a subsequent hour of the same day the Secretary shall forthwith deliver or send through the post office to each Commissioner notice, in writing, of the time to which the meeting has been adjourned.

6. *Who is to Preside at Meetings.*—At any meeting of the Commissioners, the Chairman, if present, shall preside, and if the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding of meeting, the Commissioners present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

7. *Majority to Decide.*—All questions at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be decided by a majority of the vote of the Commissioners present, and in case of an equal division of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

8. *Meetings, Notice of.*—A notice of every regular meeting of the Commissioners shall be by the Trust Secretary, delivered or sent by post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each Commissioner, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held, except in cases of emergency, when a special meeting may be called as hereinbefore provided.

9. *Meetings, Resolutions at, not to be Revoked.*—No resolution at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given by the Trust Secretary to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting; if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

10. *Business, &c., Order of—Minutes.*—At every meeting of the Commissioners the first business thereof shall be the reading; and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the previous meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman of such meeting; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Commissioners at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting if required by any Commissioner present at such meeting.

11. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Commissioners at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

(1) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Commissioners, if called for.

(2) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.

(3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.

(4) Receiving deputations from the ratepayers.

(5) Presentations of reports of committees and officers.

(6) Payments.

(7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceeding of former meetings, and any business the Chairman may think desirable.

(8) Other motions of which previous notice had been given.

(9) Notices of motion and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

12. *Titles, Official.*—The Commissioners, in meeting, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman, or Commissioner, as the case may require.

13. *Who to Speak.*—If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

14. *Chairman to Rise when Addressing Meeting.*—The Chairman shall rise when addressing the Commissioners to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

15. *Commissioners not to Speak Twice on Same Question.*—No Commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation, when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

16. *Points of Order.*—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

17. *Commissioners not to Digress or Impute Improper Motives.*—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other Commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed disorderly; and every Commissioner so doing shall, upon being called to order by the Chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections, as the case may be.

18. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

19. *Persons not Commissioners to Leave when Requested.*—No person not being a Commissioner, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Commissioners, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when requested by the Chairman to do so.

20. *Call of the Commissioners.*—No Commissioner shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Commissioners without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.

21. *Documents to be Produced.*—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Commissioner applying to the question under discussion.

22. *Motions, Amendments, and Notice thereof.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Trust Secretary at the close of the meeting of the Commissioners, or, if not given at a meeting, then four clear days prior to the day upon which the next meeting of Commissioners is to take place; and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

23. *No motion without Notice.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

24. *Motions on Petitions, &c.*—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of Commissioners after that at which it has been presented.

25. *Motions to be Moved in Order.*—Except by leave of the Commissioners, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Trust Secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

26. *Motions not to be Proceeded with in Absence of Mover.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

27. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.

28. *Mover of Motion or Amendment not to be Interrupted.*—Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question or other matter disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

29. *Nature of Motion to be Stated.*—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Commissioners thereon.

30. *Leave to be Obtained before Motion Withdrawn.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Commissioners.

31. *Motions to be Seconded Prior to Discussion.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Commissioners unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Commissioners by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

32. *Mover and not the Seconder held to have Spoken.*—A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a Commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

33. *Motions to be in Writing.*—At every meeting of the Commissioners, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall, if required by the Chairman, be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

34. *Amendments re Motion in Writing.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

35. *Amendment to become the Question.*—If an amendment be carried, the question or amendment as amended shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question coming after such first mentioned amendment may be moved.

36. *Second Amendment may be Moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for discussion at a time.

37. *Right of Mover to Reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but of no amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

38. *Adjournment, Motion for.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Commissioners, but if on the subject being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

39. *Protest, Commissioners may.*—Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Commissioners, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners by the protesting Commissioner, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Trust Secretary's office, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners.

40. *Legal Questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

41. *Order of the Day to be Restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day, on motion upon notice; and then such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. *Voting.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner, those voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the Chairman. The Chairman shall have a deliberative vote and a casting vote, and every Commissioner present shall vote except he be disabled by law from so doing.

43. *Questions to be Put.*—The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Commissioners, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

44. *Contents of Petitions.*—It shall be incumbent on every Commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Commissioners, and that the contents do not violate any By-law or any provision hereof.

45. *Name at Beginning of Petition.*—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

46. *Petitions to be in Writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioner at the end thereof, and shall be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

47. *How Signed.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

48. *No letters, &c., to be Attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

49. *Presentation of Petition.*—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall confine himself to a statement of the person from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

50. *Deputations.*—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners in support of any petition or otherwise must send in an application, in writing, to the Trust Secretary the day before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.

51. *Correspondence Committee.*—There shall be two permanent Committees of the Commissioners, one to be called the Works Committee, and the other the Finance and Correspondence Committee. Each Committee shall consist of four Commissioners, three to form a quorum. The Chairman shall be a member of all Committees.

52. *Minutes of Committee.*—Minutes of all proceedings of Committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the Committees' minute book, and being signed by the Chairman, shall be presented to the Commissioners; and the Trust Secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the Committees.

53. *Committees to be Convened.*—The Trust Secretary shall convene every Committee at any time by order of the Commissioners, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of a Committee.

54. *Cheques to be Signed.*—That all cheques shall be signed by two Commissioners, and countersigned by the Secretary.

55. *Appointment to Permanent Office.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers, circulating in the town of Wahgunyah inviting application from qualified candidates for the same.

56. *Salaries to be Fixed.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.

57. *Commissioner, &c., not to be Surety.*—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or auditor shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners.

58. *Contracts.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

59. *Plans, &c.*—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time except in case of emergency.

60. *Secretary to Expend Moneys.*—It shall be lawful for the Trust Secretary and a member of the Finance Committee from time to time, on the written order of the Chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Commissioners for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the Commissioners the sum of Ten pounds.

61. *Common Seal.*—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks the Chairman shall keep the key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the Trust Secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Chairman and one other member of the Commissioners, or, in the absence of the Chairman, unless two Commissioners be present.

62. *Addresses to the Governor, &c.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Trust Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.

63. *Suspension of Regulations.*—Any one or more of the rules and provisions herein contained may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice being given, and shall not otherwise be suspended unless by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

64. *Penalty.*—Every person who shall offend against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-LAW No. 2.

THE Woodend Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks District:—

(1) All former By-laws and Regulations, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

Connexions with Trust's Mains.

(2) Except with the consent of the Trust, one service pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement shall be permitted, and not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may, in special cases, consent to two or more houses or tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house or tenement shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such service.

(3) No private service shall be extended, except with the consent of the Trust.

(4) Upon any person giving notice of his desire to lay a pipe, to connect with the tap the pipes of the Trust, he shall be informed on behalf of the Trust whether it is or is not desired that such tapping should be made by an officer of the Trust, and if it be so desired such person shall not tap any such pipe, but shall provide for and bear the cost of all labour and material necessary for such connexion, and for the restoration of the ground to the satisfaction of the local authority, and be liable for the consequences of failure in so doing, and shall pay in advance to the Trust the expense of such tapping, including the stop-cock and ferrule as follows:—For ½-in. pipe, Ten shillings; ¾-in. pipe, Thirteen shillings; 1-in. pipe, Eighteen shillings.

(5) All service pipes laid in the ground on private property shall be laid at a depth of not less than 10 inches below the surface. The portions of the service pipe laid along or across any public street, lane, or right-of-way, or where it may be exposed to wheel traffic, shall be laid not less than 24 inches below the surface of the ground.

(6) Connexions with the Trust's mains shall (except where otherwise directed) be made with proper stop-cock ferrules to which, for iron services, a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe must be attached. The bore of such service pipe shall not exceed ⅜ inch, unless permission for a larger service shall have been received in writing from the Trust and the supply be taken through a meter.

(7) The maximum tapping allowed (except by special permit of the Trust) for each size of main shall be as follows:—

For 1½-in. and 2-in. pipes, ½-in. tapping with approved clip.

For 3-in. and 4-in. pipes, ¾-in. tapping.

For 5-in. and 6-in. pipes, 1-in. tapping.

(8) A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron top, shall be fixed on each water service between the main and building line.

Material for Private Services, &c.

(9) Lead piping of the following weights:—
 For piping ½-in. diameter, weight 6 lbs. per yard;
 for piping ¾-in. diameter, weight 9 lbs. per yard;
 for piping 1-in. diameter, weight 12 lbs. per yard;
 for piping 1½-in. diameter, weight 20 lbs. per yard;
 for piping 2-in. diameter, weight 28 lbs. per yard;

and galvanized wrought-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services.

(10) The quality of the material required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

(a) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (excepting those connecting the service pipes and mains) bends, reducing couplings, plugs, (and the like, shall be of best galvanized wrought-iron.

(b) All pipes and pieces shall be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, clear in bore and properly coated throughout, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

(c) All ends of pipes, bends, and the like shall be properly and truly threaded and capable of being properly screwed into thimbles, tees, or fittings.

(d) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, cocks, and fittings shall be sound and free from all defects and of strength to bear with safety the maximum hydrostatic pressure to which they may be subject, and if required by the Trust shall be tested.

(11) No person shall use any tap, stop-cock, bib-cock, ball-cock, valve, closet cistern, service box, waste-not regulator, bath tap, or valve or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the Trust, which is not of the best quality and approved by the Trust.

(12) No person shall use any stop or bib cocks which are not screw-down high-pressure cocks made of hard brass or gunmetal and in every respect of the best quality and workmanship and approved by the Trust.

(13) All connexions between lead and iron pipes shall be made with brass union couplings.

(14) All joints connecting lead pipes shall be "wiped joints," and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence of the plumber who by himself or his workman shall break these regulations.

(15) No person, whether licensed as hereinafter set out or not, shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

(16) No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball valve, and the overflow pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner open to inspection and in a position approved by the Trust.

(17) No person shall construct or use any urinal or water closet fitting not approved by the Trust, nor unless the same be supplied with water from the service pertaining to a tenement through a proper closet cistern or service box fitted with approved waste preventing apparatus. No person shall fix or use any service pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with the basin or trap or otherwise than with the cistern of a urinal or water closet. Urinals shall be provided with 2-gallon and closets with 3-gallon cisterns.

(18) All baths, sinks, lavatory and other basins, closets, and urinals served from the Trust's mains shall be of approved sanitary construction, and mounted to the satisfaction of the Trust.

(19) No bath shall be allowed which has a holding capacity when full of more than 100 gallons, except with the permission of the Trust. Overflow pipes to baths will not be permitted, except where the supply is by measure.

(20) All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Trust shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically, and for preventing overflow.

Licensing of Plumbers.

(21) Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

(22) Each licence shall be for the period ending 31st December next ensuing after the issue thereof, but may be renewed by the Trust at its discretion from time to time in each case to the following 31st December. The Trust shall have power at any time to cancel a licence in the event of the holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner, or committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, and in such matters the Trust shall be sole judge. For each original licence the licensee shall pay to the Trust a fee of One pound, and for each renewal Five shillings.

(23) Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Trust relating to water supply, and with the Water Acts so far as they apply to town supplies. The Trust may, if it so sees fit, refuse to grant such licence.

(24) Each licensed plumber shall report to the Trust Secretary the completion of any new work, extensions, or repairs in connexion with any service, within twenty-four hours of effecting same.

Meters.

(25) No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees or plants, or washing house walls or carriages or horses or other animals, or for any similar purpose, except the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

(26) No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons, and each $\frac{1}{2}$ -in., $\frac{3}{4}$ -in., and 1-in. meter must be capable of registering any flow not less than 10, 15, and 20 gallons per hour respectively, and each meter must be fixed with approved lead connexions above ground in a conveniently accessible position, and properly protected. Wherever washers are necessary for meter connexion couplings, leather washers shall in all cases be used.

(27) If any meter in use cease registering, or be reported by a duly authorized officer of the Trust as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust will estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year on the basis of subsequent consumption after repairing, or the Trust may insert a check meter on the service pipe and charge upon estimates from the registering thereof.

(28) The Trust will, if it so think fit but not otherwise, let for hire water meters the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

- For $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. meter, Seven shillings.
- For $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. meter, Eight shillings.
- For 1-in. meter, Nine shillings.

For any meter of larger size than 1 inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year, the first payment to be made as from the date of installation to the end of the then current half-year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Trust, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

(29) Meters, other than such as are hired from the Trust, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Trust; a fee of Five shillings shall be charged for each test.

(30) In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Trust, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

Waste or Misuse of Water.

(31) No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste.

(32) No person receiving water from the Trust shall, without the written permission of the Trust, take or carry away such water or shall sell the same to any other person.

(33) No person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust shall take or carry away water from the premises of any other person so supplied, or from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe.

(34) No person, other than an employee of the municipal Council, shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrant and hose attached to fire-plugs.

(35) The water supply of all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Trust, and no person unless duly authorized shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply.

(36) Channel flushing and filling of public baths will be permitted only between the hours of Ten o'clock p.m. and Six o'clock a.m.

Miscellaneous.

(37) In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice in writing addressed to the Secretary of the Trust, and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Acts or in this By-law, and in no case less than two days prior to the time

proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work commenced save upon the Trust's consent in writing and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the Chairman of the Trust, the Secretary, or the Engineer, who severally shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto, and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the Trust for confirmation.

(38) In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the meaning which in the Water Acts is assigned to any word, shall be the meaning of the same word where occurring in this By-law unless inconsistent with the subject matter or context.

(39) Any person who does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, shall be guilty of an offence, and for every such offence the offender shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 45.

A By-law for the Making and Levying of Rates for the year commencing the 1st day of July, 1921.

The Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called the "Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the Water Acts and of any other powers and authorities in anywise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works, or any extension of such works:—

1. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area, and supplied with water for domestic purposes other than by measure:—

- (1) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £16—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (2) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £16—Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (3) On lands on which there is no building—Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1921, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1922, and shall be payable in two equal instalments, on the 1st day of September, 1921, and the 1st day of January, 1922.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being for all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal districts of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

That the undermentioned apportionment for irrigation of the water assigned to the Merbein Irrigation Area as Water Rights to the homestead allotments or to portions of the homestead allotments within such Irrigation Area, is hereby made under the provisions of the said Acts, and that By-law No. 934 is hereby amended accordingly as on and from the 1st day of August, 1921:—

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the said State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

1. That the Gannawarra Irrigation and Water Supply District be extended by adding to the same the lands set out and described in the First Schedule hereto, and as on and from the first day of July, 1921, such district shall be deemed to be so extended.

2. That there shall be excised from the Gannawarra Irrigation and Water Supply District that portion of the same set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto, which portion, as from the thirtieth day of June, 1921, shall be deemed to be excised accordingly:—

south-western boundary of allotment 75A to a point in line with the north-western boundary of allotment 86A of the same section; thence south-westerly by a line and the north-west boundaries of allotments 86A and 89A to the most westerly angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence generally easterly by a road to the south-eastern angle of allotment 93; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that allotment to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 94; thence easterly by a line and the southern boundaries of allotments 94 and 95 to the western boundary of allotment 105; thence southerly by that boundary and easterly by the southern boundary of the same allotment and a line in continuation of that boundary to the eastern boundary of the channel reserve forming the eastern boundary of allotment 105; thence northerly by that channel reserve boundary and a line in continuation of that boundary to the southern boundary of allotment 56; thence generally north-easterly by the road forming the southern boundaries of allotments 56, 53, 52, 51, 50, and 47, all of said section A, to the most southerly angle of allotment 46 of that section; thence generally northerly by McEdward-street to the most easterly angle of allotment 6A; thence generally northerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 5A and 2A to the north-eastern angle of said allotment 2A; thence westerly by the northern boundary of that allotment to its north-western angle; thence northerly by an unnamed road $\frac{1}{4}$ chains wide to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 2; thence north-westerly by the road forming the northern boundaries of allotments 2 and 1, all of said section A, parish of Mildura, to the point of commencement. Excepting thereout allotments 179 and 180, parish of Merbein, allotments 79 and 80, section A, parish of Mildura, and the State school site adjoining the north-western boundary of allotment 99 of that section, and the lands between the road forming the western boundaries of allotments 68 and 68A and the channel reserve along the north-eastern and northern boundaries of allotment 168, part of the northern boundary of allotment 167, the south-east and eastern boundaries of allotment 164, the eastern boundary of allotment 163, and the south-eastern boundary of allotment 162, all in the parish of Merbein.

DECLARATION OF DEVELOPMENTAL ROADS UNDER THE DEVELOPMENTAL ROADS ACT IN THE SHIRE OF KOWREE.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the second day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one the Country Roads Board incorporated under the Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635) being of opinion that the roads set out or described in the Schedule thereunder written are of sufficient importance and will serve to develop areas of land (whether alienated from the Crown or not) by providing access to railway stations or to main roads leading to railway stations and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Developmental Roads Act 1918 (No. 2944) declared such roads to be developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Developmental Roads Act 1918: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the Government Gazette confirm such Resolution whereupon any road or part thereof mentioned in such Resolution shall be a developmental road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Developmental Roads Act 1918.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

The Country Roads Board incorporated by the Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the roads set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance and will serve to develop areas of land by providing access to railway stations or to main roads leading to railway stations acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Developmental Roads Act 1918 (No. 2944) doth by this Resolution hereby declare such roads to be developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Developmental Roads Act 1918.

6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any watercourse, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. By-Law No. 46.

A By-law of the borough of Mentone and Mordialloc made under the *Health Act 1910* and numbered 46.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1910*, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the borough of Mentone and Mordialloc, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councilors, and Burgesses of the said borough for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 40 and all former by-laws of the shire of Moorabbin, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed in so far as they apply to the borough of Mentone and Mordialloc.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the borough of Mentone and Mordialloc.

4. The occupier of every house, building or premises within the borough shall cause to be provided and cause to be kept within the fences or walls enclosing such house, building or premises a receptacle with a properly fitting cover not exceeding four cubic feet in contents, constructed of 24-gauge galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight with handle thereto so that the same may with the contents thereof when there are any be readily and conveniently removable by such person or persons as the said Council may appoint for the purpose.

5. Every such occupier shall cause all dust, ashes or other house refuse produced, collected or accumulated on such premises to be from time to time placed in such receptacle.

6. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

7. The occupier of every house, building or premises within the area or abutting on the streets set out in the first schedule hereto shall on the days from time to time appointed for the removal of garbage cause such receptacle to be placed and kept between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. in the yard of such house, building or premises at a distance not exceeding ten feet from the entrance to such yard from a street, lane or right-of-way so that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the person or persons appointed by the Council for the purpose and no such occupier shall place any such receptacle or permit same to be placed in or on any street, lane or right-of-way.

8. The occupier of every house, building or premises outside the area and not abutting on the streets set out in the first schedule hereto shall as often as required and at least once in every week remove the contents of such receptacle and dispose of the same by burning or burying or both to the satisfaction of the Council's Health Officer, Inspector or other person appointed for the purpose by the Council.

9. No person shall place or deposit any house refuse or garden refuse in any street, road or right-of-way.

If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
