PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B.,
C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in
the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation, fix Tuesday,
the sixth day of September, 1921, as the time for the commencement and holding of the next Session
of the Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch of business, at the hour of Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, in the State
Parliament Houses, situate in the Carlton Gardens, in the City of Melbourne: And the Honorable the Members of the
Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said
time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of August,
in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and in the twelfth year of the reign of
His Majesty King George V.
