RESCISSION AND RE-MAKING OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF HADDON.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping

shops within the township of Haddon, within the municipal district of the shire of Grenville, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby—

I. Revoke the Regulations made on the 9th day of October, 1916, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915) within the township of Haddon, within the municipal district of the shire of Grenville, shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

II. Make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

(1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, tobacconists' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915) within the township of Haddon, within the municipal district of the shire of Grenville, shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915.

(2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—

- (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
- (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
- (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Thursday.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN PORTION OF THE TOWN OF SANDRINGHAM (FORMERLY PORTION OF THE SHIRE OF MOORABBIN).

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Hampton Ward and the Sandringham Ward of the municipal district of the town of Sandringham, doth hereby revoke in so far as they relate to the area which was formerly portion of the municipal district of the shire of Moorabbin, but is now known as the Hampton Ward and the Sandringham Ward of the town of Sandringham, the Regulations made on the 6th day of January, 1915, directing that all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within a certain portion of the municipal district of the shire of Moorabbin shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN PORTION OF THE TOWN OF SANDRINGHAM (FORMERLY PORTION OF THE SHIRE OF MOORABBIN).

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Hampton Ward and the Sandringham Ward of the municipal district of the town of Sandringham of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke, in so far as they relate to the area which was formerly portion of the municipal district of the shire of Moorabbin, but is now known as the Hampton Ward and the Sandringham Ward of the town of Sandringham, the Regulations made on the sixth day of January, 1915, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915) within a certain portion of the municipal district of the shire of Moorabbin shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

REGULATION OF TOBACCONISTS' SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF SEYMOUR.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the shire of Seymour, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for the shop of any tobacconist within the township of Seymour, within the municipal district of the shire of Seymour, to be kept open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week until Eight o'clock.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
