Factories and Shops Acts. DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 12 (FUEL AND FODDER).

Note.—This Determination, on the 7th October, 1921, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the town of Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

On the 10th September, 1913, this Board was deprived of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons, or classes of persons, employed in any business or occupation connected with the sale or distribution of coal or coke by any—

- (a) coal importer,(b) coal mine owner,(c) gas company;

and such power was conferred exclusively on the Coal and Coke Board,

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

(a) employed in the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;

(b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the business of a hay, corn, or chaff

- dealer; (c) employed in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of wood, coal, or soke,"

has made the following Determination, namely :---

(1) That on the 7th day of October, 1921, the last previous Determination of the Fuel and Fodder Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
