#### PROCLAMATION

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Common-wealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Five hundred and eleven thousand nine hundred and eighty-three pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one."

"An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Irrigation
Works and Water Supply Works and for Drainage and
Flood Protection Works in Country Districts and for
Works under the River Murray Waters Acts."

"An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Irrigation Works and Water Supply."

"An Act to authorize the Temporary Application out of 'The Public Account' of certain Moneys for the purposes of the Railways Stores Suspense Account."

Public Service Act 1915 (No. 2713), Section 71 (XI.). REGULATIONS.—TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.—CHAPTER IX.

PART III.-MISCELLANEOUS.

, Transfers and Exchanges.

Clauses 76 and 79, Read

76. Travelling expenses of officers, their wives and children, and reasonable cost of removing furniture, shall be allowed when such officers are promoted from one station to another, or are removed not by way of punishment.

79. When in response to an advertisement an officer applies for transfer, and is transferred, he shall be allowed travelling expenses as in clause 76 only if the Permanent Head considers that the circumstances are such as to warrant the payment of the whole or part of such expenses.

Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the State Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Tuesday, the 1st November, 1921. An application on the proper form must also, on or before such date, be made to the Registrar of the Melbourne University, and candidates must state therein that they have entered for the Public Service Examination, and indicate the subjects they desire to be examined in for that examination. that examination.

The examination will be conducted by the Melbourne University, and will comprise subjects prescribed for the School-Leaving (Pass standard) or School Intermediate Examination,

as set out in the Public Service Regulations, copies of which, and forms of application (both Public Service and University), may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination, and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Tuesday, the 22nd November, 1921, a postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Fifteen shillings (15s.). No fee is payable to the University if a candidate enters for the Public Service Examination only.

Sixty (60) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks (30 from those who pass the School-Leaving, and 30 from those who pass the School Intermediate Examination). Candidates must, on the first day of the examination, be between the ages of fifteen and twenty-one years of age at last birthday, but a candidate twenty-two years of age or over cannot be appointed. The commencing salary is £72, rising to a maximum of £264, a year.

The limitation as to maximum age does not apply to any eligible returned sailor or soldier. Provided his certificate of discharge is furnished with his application, he may apply at any age, and may be paid a salary on appointment not exceeding £192 a year.

Assistants in charge of departments will be required to organize courses of study in the groups of subjects mentioned above, and, under the Head Master, they will be required to direct the teaching and examination of their special subjects throughout the school. All assistant teachers, in addition to the teaching of their forms, will be required to undertake such extra-school duties (even outside the ordinary hours of teaching), e.g., in connexion with games, boards of studies, and the like, as may be assigned by the Head Master. Where school hostels are established, assistant teachers may be required to undertake residential duties connected with the studies and conduct of the boarders at such institutions.

In the case of the University High School, no applicant will be appointed who has not had at least two years' experience subsequent to training.

BY-LAW NO. 1965.—COHUNA URBAN DIVISION WITHIN THE COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Cohuna Urban Division within the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply District:—

- Water Supply District:—

  1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

  2. Every person using or supplied with water for other than
- 2. Every person using or supplied with water for other than domestic purposes solely shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Commission or its proper
- 3. No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by
- measure.

  4. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any meter or any service-pipe to any pipe of the Commission, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any meter or pipe of the Commission, or any service pipe, cock, or litting counected with the pipes of the Commission, he shall obtain from the Commission, a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such meter, pipe, Service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

  5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property.
- 5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Commission, without giving three days' notice to the Commission oracits proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of, the Commission, without the permission, in writing, of the Commission or its proper officer being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work the property of the Commission, shall be guilty of an offence.
- mission, shall be guilty of an offence.

  6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commission or its proper officer, shall be guilty of an offence.

  7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tance.
- 7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For 3-inch meter or meter of smaller size-Ten shillings.

For any meter of larger size than 2-inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 121 per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and he paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

- 9. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Commission, he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to he removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Commission, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Commission who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Commission of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.
- 10. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Commission may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.
- 11. Meters, other than such as are hired from the Commission, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Commission at Cohuna, and a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.
- 12. The Commission, by its officers, may, at any time, after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service-pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer; and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.
- 13. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Commission, on which such waste is continued.
- 14. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them utomatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.
- 15' If any person supplied with water by the Commission does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wifully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commission may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is mot remedied.
- 16. The charge to be paid for water supplied by measure from the pipes of the Commission shall be Fifteenpence per 1.000 gallons.
- 17. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure, in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission, shall be as follows:—
  - (1) Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Cor mission for making and levying rates, if such promises were supplied otherwise than by measure.

- (2) Where the supply is solely for other than domestic purposes, a quantity which, if charged as provided by the last preceding section, would give a sum of Five shillings for any continuous period of three months.

Marine Act 1915 .- Section 54. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF MOTOR VEHICLES BY SHIP.

1. Short Title.—These Regulations may be cited as "The Shipping of Motor Vehicles Regulations 1921."

2. Commencement.—These Regulations 1921."

2. Commencement.—These Regulations shall come into operation from the date of publication hereof in the Government Gazette, from which date "The Shipping of Motor Vehicles Regulations 1912" made by the Board on the twenty-eighth day of June, 1912, and published in the Government Gazette on the thirty-first day of July, 1912, shall be and stand repealed.

3. No person shall ship or send or attempt to ship or send in any vessel from any port in Victoria any motor-driven vehicle or boat using petroleum or other liquid fuel:

(a) unless the tanks thereof and all engine connexions are empty and free from inflammable vapours nor (b) unless the drain and filling pipes of all tanks thereof are left open and the openings effectively protected by fine wire gauze nor (c) if such vehicle or boat has stored placed or packed therein thereon or therewith any petroleum or other liquid fuel whether enclosed in a separate container or other receptacle whether detached or not.

4. Penalty.—Any breach of the foregoing Regulations shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this lifteenth day of September in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

#### BY-LAW NO. 15.

BY-LAW NO. 15.

A By-law of the Shire of Bright made under sub-sections 23, 30, and 37 of section 197 of the Hocal Government Act 1915, and numbered 15, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bright make this By-law and order as follows:—

Bars Spfies Grips or other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars spikes grips or other projections.

to use on any public nignway may may make the containing on its wheels any bars spikes grips or other projections.

This prohibition however shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist, only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(b) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches, provided in such last-mentioned case—

(i) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf

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a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

ways so specined.

(ii) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn has it.

vert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

(iii) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

(iv) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight including the weight of such vehicle.

(v) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundredweight for each half inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted Thereon.

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine Contains in Itself Sufficient Motive Power to move it.

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public bighway, although it is stationary.

Taking Engine Across or Along Bridges, Embankments, &c.

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge culvert or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse.

Engines Not to Halt on Certain Parts of Highway.

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions or such like but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water or for any other purpose whatever

Driving Engine Between Sunset and Sunrise.

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which shelt travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved. such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights one at each side on the front and one on the rear or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine then in the rear of the last vehicle.

Wooden Planks to be Carried on Engine.

8. No person-shall use or cause or procure to be used on 8. No person-shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks at least twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks. such planks.

Skidding of Wheels of Engine.

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

Penalties.

10. Any person shall, for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law, be liable to the following penalty:—
(a) For a first offence a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
(b) For the second offence a fine not exceeding Five

pounds.

(c) For any subsequent offence a fine not exceeding Ten

pounds.

Extent of Operation of By-law.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Bright.
