### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Five hundred and eleven thousand nine hundred and eighty-three pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one."

"An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Irrigation Works and Water Supply Works and for Drainage and Flood Protection Works in Country Districts and for Works under the River Murray Waters Act."

"An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Irrigation Works and Water Supply."

"An Act to authorize the Temporary Application out of 'The Public Account' of certain Moneys for the purposes of the Railways Stores Suspense Account."

76. Travelling expenses of officers, their wives and children, and reasonable cost of removing furniture, shall be allowed when such officers are promoted from one station to another, or are removed not by way of punishment.

79. When in response to an advertisement an officer applies for transfer, and is transferred, he shall be allowed travelling expenses as in clause 76 only if the Permanent Head considers that the circumstances are such as to warrant the payment of the whole or part of such expenses.

Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the State Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Tuesday, the 1st November, 1921. An application on the proper form must also, on or before such date, be made to the Registrar of the Melbourne University, and candidates must state therein that they have entered for the Public Service Examination, and indicate the subjects they desire to be examined in for that examination.

The examination will be conducted by the Melbourne University, and will comprise subjects prescribed for the School-Leaving (Pass standard) or School Intermediate Examination,

as set out in the Public Service Regulations, copies of which, and forms of application (both Public Service and University), may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination, and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Tuesday, the 22nd November, 1921, a postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for fifteen shillings (15s.). No fee is payable to the University if a candidate enters for the Public Service Examination only.

Sixty (60) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks (30 from those who pass the School-Leaving, and 30 from those who pass the School Intermediate Examination). Candidates must, on the first day of the examination, be between the ages of fifteen and twenty-one years of age at last birthday, but a candidate twenty-two years of age or over cannot be appointed. The commencing salary is £72, rising to a maximum of £264, a year.

The limitation as to maximum age does not apply to any eligible returned sailor or soldier. Provided his certificate of discharge is furnished with his application, he may apply at any age, and may be paid a salary on appointment not exceeding £192 a year.

Applicants should possess a University diploma or degree, or special qualifications in drawing and commercial subjects, and have had experience in secondary teaching, and should furnish evidence of qualification for teaching one or more of the following groups of subjects, stating the standard to which they are prepared to teach any particular subjects:—

- (a) English, history.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 1065.—COHUNA URBAN DIVISION WITHIN THE COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Cohuna Urban Division within the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply District:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. Every person using or supplied with water for other than domestic purposes solely shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Commission or its proper officer.

3. No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

4. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any meter or any service-pipe to any pipe of the Commission, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any meter or pipe of the Commission, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Commission, he shall obtain from the Commission a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such meter, pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Commission, without giving three days' notice to the Commission or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Commission, without the permission, in writing, of the Commission or its proper officer being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work the property of the Commission, shall be guilty of an offence.

6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commission or its proper officer, shall be guilty of an offence.

7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch meter or meter of smaller size—Ten shillings.

For any meter of larger size than  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

9. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Commission, he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Commission, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Commission who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Commission of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

10. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Commission may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

11. Meters, other than such as are hired from the Commission, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Commission at Coluna, and a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

12. The Commission, by its officers, may, at any time, after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service-pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer; and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

13. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Commission, on which such waste is continued.

14. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Commission does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commission may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

16. The charge to be paid for water supplied by measure from the pipes of the Commission shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

17. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure, in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission, shall be as follows:—

- (1) Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates, if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure.

- (2) Where the supply is solely for other than domestic purposes, a quantity which, if charged as provided by the last preceding section, would give a sum of Five shillings for any continuous period of three months.

18. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commission authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commission.

19. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

BY-LAW No. 1066.—URBAN DISTRICT SUPPLIED WITH WATER FROM THE COLIBAN SYSTEM OF WATERWORKS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District supplied with water from the Coliban System of Waterworks for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building), the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £13 6s. 8d.—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (2) Of any such tenement the valuation whereof exceeds £13 6s. 8d.—Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation not exceeding £300; Six pounds five shillings per centum of the amount of the valuation exceeding £300, and not exceeding £700; and Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation exceeding £700.
- (3) Of lands on which there is no building—Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1921, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1922, and shall be payable on the first day of October, 1921, at the office of the Commission, at Bentigo or Castlemaine.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said district, the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

## Marine Act 1915.—Section 54.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF MOTOR VEHICLES BY SHIP.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1915*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. *Short Title.*—These Regulations may be cited as "The Shipping of Motor Vehicles Regulations 1921."

2. *Commencement.*—These Regulations shall come into operation from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, from which date "The Shipping of Motor Vehicles Regulations 1921" made by the Board on the twenty-eighth day of June, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the thirty-first day of July, 1921, shall be and stand repealed.

3. No person shall ship or send or attempt to ship or send in any vessel from any port in Victoria any motor-driven vehicle or boat using petroleum or other liquid fuel:

(a) unless the tanks thereof and all engine connexions are empty and free from inflammable vapours nor

(b) unless the drain and filling pipes of all tanks thereof are left open and the openings effectively protected by fine wire gauze nor

(c) if such vehicle or boat has stored placed or packed therein thereon or therewith any petroleum or other liquid fuel whether enclosed in a separate container or other receptacle whether detached or not.

4. *Penalty.*—Any breach of the foregoing Regulations shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this fifteenth day of September in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF MORNINGTON AND PARISH OF MOOROODUC, THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MOOROODUC AND TOWN OF OSBORNE, AND THE PORTIONS OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF MOOROODUC, TOGETHER KNOWN AS "THE MORNINGTON FORESHORE RESERVES."

WE, George Flood, Leonard John Flanagan, John Gibbon Barrett, Peter, Kenneth McArthur, Robert Nunn, Peter Olson, and Charles Melbourne Griffiths, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Mornington and parish of Moorooduc, the Reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Moorooduc and town of Osborne, and the portions of the Reserve for Public purposes in the parish of Moorooduc, together known as "The Mornington Foreshore Reserves" (hereinafter called the Reserves), having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public at all times, free of charge, except for the purpose of camping.
2. No person shall enter or leave the Reserves except by means of the ramps or other openings provided, and no person shall climb the cliffs in the Reserves.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. The Committee of Management may provide and build such fireplaces on the Reserves as the Committee think necessary, and any person lighting or using fires or causing or permitting fires to be used on the Reserves save in such fireplaces, except by special leave or direction of the Committee of Management, shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

5. No person shall damage in any way the trees, marram grass, or other vegetation in the Reserves.

6. No person shall climb or jump over any fences in or around the Reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, destroy, or remove the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or any survey pegs or permanent marks therein.

7. No horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, save as herein-after provided, are allowed in the Reserves and the owner of any horses, cattle, sheep or other animals so wandering shall be liable to prosecution and in addition such cattle, horses, sheep or other animals may be impounded.

8. Certain portions of the Reserves have been set apart by the Committee of Management for the accommodation of vehicles and horses in the custody and care of those using the same provided that the owner or user for the time being shall tie up such horse in such a way as not to cause or permit any damage to any fences, trees, seats, or other improvements and the owner or user for the time being of any horse found wandering without restraint on any portions of the Reserves, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

9. No person shall tether or cause to be tethered, on any part of the Reserves except as otherwise herein provided, any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals.

10. Motor cars are allowed on the Reserves only in the places set apart for the purpose.

11. No person shall commit a nuisance on any part of the Reserves or in any public or private bathing-box, boat shed, or other building upon the Reserves.

12. No person shall use the closets or urinals, or any portion of such closets or urinals for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then only use such portions of such closets and urinals as are specially constructed for such purposes.

13. Certain portions of the Reserves have been set apart by the Committee of Management for the use of persons desirous of swimming or bathing horses in Port Phillip Bay under such conditions as the Committee may from time to time determine, and then only before 8 a.m. or after 6 p.m.

14. No person except workmen employed by the Committee of Management in the Reserves shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs or marram grass.

15. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter in any part of the Reserves except in the receptacles provided for that purpose.

16. No person shall camp on any portion of the Reserves between Beleurg and Balcombe's Creek, nor on any other portion of the Reserves except those specially set apart for the purpose and then and then only after obtaining a permit subject to such fees and conditions as the Committee may determine.

17. No person shall erect any booth or other structure or offer for sale any article in the Reserves without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing.

18. No person shall throw any stone or other hard substance, nor play cricket or any other game with a hard ball, within the Reserves.

19. No person shall break glass of any kind in the Reserves or leave therein on the beach anything which would injure bathers.

20. No person shall discharge any firearms or air-guns in any part of the Reserves.

21. No person shall erect any bathing-box or boat-shed in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such fees, terms, and conditions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.

22. No person shall bathe from the Reserves unless decently attired from the neck to the knee, and no person shall enter or leave the Reserves in bathing costume only.

23. No person shall use or cause to be used any bathing-box or boat-shed for residential purposes.

24. The Committee of Management may from time to time, notwithstanding any regulation herein to the contrary issue permits in writing to such persons and for such periods of time as they may deem fit for the purpose of enabling such persons to graze cattle, horses, or sheep on such portions of the Reserves and for such periods of time and under such conditions and the payment of such fees, as the Committee may determine; such conditions time and fees to be set out in such permits and the number of horses, cattle, or sheep permitted to be grazed named in such permits, and the holder of such permits shall not be liable to the penalties incurred under these Regulations as regards wandering cattle so far as the locality fixed in his permit is concerned during the currency of such permit and the payment of the fees in connexion therewith.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence, be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

For every sheep, lamb, or goat—3d.

For every head of swine—1s.

For every calf under 300 lbs.—9d.

And such sums shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner of all animals which may be brought into the Public Abattoirs, whether or not such animals have been examined, slaughtered, or branded.

4. That the fees hereunder mentioned shall be paid to the Inspector for examining and branding of carcasses of meat slaughtered at the Public Abattoirs, viz.:—

For every ox, cow, bull, heifer, or steer—9d.

For every sheep, lamb, or goat—1d.

For every head of swine—3d.

For every calf under 300 lbs.—3d.

##### Market Dues.

A Regulation of the Borough of Geelong West, numbered 7, made by Special Order under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for the purpose of fixing the amounts of stallages, rents, tolls, and dues payable in respect of the Geelong West Borough Market.

**I**N pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Council of the municipality of the Borough of Geelong West doth hereby order and direct that the following scale of stallages, rents, tolls, and dues shall be demanded, received, and had by the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West in respect of the Geelong West Borough Market, situate in the borough of Geelong West, that is to say:—

#### SHIRE OF BRIGHT.

##### BY-LAW No. 15.

A By-law of the Shire of Bright made under sub-sections 23, 30, and 37 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 15, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 504 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bright make this By-law and order as follows:—

##### Bars Spikes Grips or other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars spikes grips or other projections.

This prohibition however shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(b) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches, provided in such last-mentioned case—

(i) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf

a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

- (ii) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.
- (iii) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.
- (iv) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight including the weight of such vehicle.
- (v) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundred-weight for each half inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

*Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted Thereon.*

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

*Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine Contains in Itself Sufficient Motive Power to move it.*

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

*Taking Engine Across or Along Bridges, Embankments, &c.*

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge culvert or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse.

*Engines Not to Halt on Certain Parts of Highway.*

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions or such like but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

*Engines Not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.*

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water or for any other purpose whatever.

*Driving Engine Between Sunset and Sunrise.*

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights one at each side on the front and one on the rear or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine then in the rear of the last vehicle.

*Wooden Planks to be Carried on Engine.*

8. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks at least twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

*Skidding of Wheels of Engine.*

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

*Penalties.*

10. Any person shall, for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law, be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For a first offence a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
- (b) For the second offence a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
- (c) For any subsequent offence a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Extent of Operation of By-law.*

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Bright.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Bright the 12th day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and confirmed by the said Council the 9th day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.
