NICKEL WARE BOARD.

NOTE.—(a) This Determination, on the 31st October, 1921, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the town of Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of making nickel silver articles of table ware," and whose powers were, by Order in Council, dated 16th November, 1920, extended so that it may "fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of making articles of table ware of any base metal," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That this Determination shall come into force and be operative on and after the 31st October, 1921.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any person employed in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed, as a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(4) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be, by Act of Parliament or Proclamation, substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
