Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the State Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Tuesday, the 1st November, 1921. An application on the proper form must also, on or before such date, be made to the Registrar of the Melbourne University, and candidates must state therein that they have entered for the Public Service Examination, and indicate the subjects they desire to be examined in for that examination.

The examination will be conducted by the Melbourne University, and will comprise subjects prescribed for the School-Leaving (Pass standard) or School Intermediate Examination, as set out in the Public Service Regulations, copies of which, and forms of application (both Public Service and University), may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination, and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Tuesday, the 22nd November, 1921, a postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Fifteen shillings (15s.). No fee is payable to the University if a candidate enters for the Public Service Examination only.

Sixty (60) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks (30 from those who pass the School-Leaving, and 30 from those who pass the School Intermediate Examination). Candidates must, on the first day of the examination, be between the ages of fifteen and twenty-one years of age at last birthday, but a candidate twenty-two years of age or over cannot be appointed. The commencing salary is £72, rising to a maximum of £264, a year.

The limitation as to maximum age does not apply to any eligible returned sailor or soldier. Provided his certificate of discharge is furnished with his application, he may apply at any age, and may be paid a salary on appointment not exceeding £192 a year.

**PROPOSED SEVERANCE FROM SHIRE OF BALLAN AND ANNEXATION
TO SHIRE OF KYNETON.**

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the shire of Ballan described in the petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the East Riding of the shire of Ballan and annexed to the Trentham Riding of the shire of Kyneton.

Area described in Petition.

Commencing at a point being the south-west angle of allotment 8, section XI., parish of Blackwood; thence westerly by a straight line to the south-east angle of allotment 21; thence west by southern boundary of allotment 21 to its south-west angle; thence west by a straight line to the centre of a three-chain shire road; thence north by that road to the south-east angle of allotment N; thence west by south boundary of allotment N to its south-west angle; thence north by portion of west boundary of allotment N to the south-east angle of allotment P; thence west by south boundary and north by west boundary of allotment P to its north-west angle; thence south-east along Trentham and Blackwood parish boundary road to the south-west angle of allotment 103D, parish of Trentham; thence north-east and north by west boundaries of allotments 103D and 103F respectively to the north-west angle of allotment 103F; thence east by north boundary of allotment 103F to centre of a one-chain road; thence north by road forming boundary of allotments 103A and 103A1 to the north-west angle of allotment 103A1; thence east by road forming north boundary of allotments 103A1 and 103A2 to the north-east angle of 103A2; thence south by road forming west boundary of allotments 103P, 103E, and 1031, parish of Trentham; thence in the parish of Blackwood south and west and southerly by road forming western boundary of section XI. to the south-west angle of allotment 8, section XI., parish of Blackwood, being the point of commencement.

The petitioners state that the area proposed to be severed is isolated from the rest of the shire of Ballan, being joined on the east and north sides and partly on the west side by the Kyneton shire. The petitioners also state that they do no business with any part of the Ballan shire, and that all their produce is carted into Kyneton shire on the roads of that shire.

administrators and assigns to serve him as an apprentice from the date of these presents until the full end and term of years to be fully complete and ended to learn the process trade or business of a plumber and gasfitter.

And they the said apprentice and covenant with the said employer that he the said apprentice shall and will during the said term (unless the employer shall remove his business from _____ to some place beyond the radius of three miles from his present place of business in which case the apprentice may if he so elect claim to have his indenture assigned to some other employer within the radius or if there be none such to be released from these presents) well and faithfully serve the said employer as an apprentice in the process trade or business of a plumber and gasfitter aforesaid and his lawful commands willingly obey and shall also willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of such of the representatives of the said employer as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business or as the said employer shall specify or require and shall not wilfully do or commit nor wilfully suffer to be done or committed any waste damage or other injury to the property or goods of the said employer or any firm or company of which he may be a member or lend them to any person without the consent of the said employer and shall not unlawfully absent himself from the service of the said employer during business hours and shall not by word or action induce other apprentices to disobedience:

In consideration whereof the said employer doth hereby covenant with the said _____ and also with the said apprentice that he the said employer will take and receive the said apprentice as his apprentice during the said term and to the best of his power knowledge and ability teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the said apprentice in the process trade or business of a plumber and gasfitter as practised in the municipality where the said employer is engaged in business and will pay to the said apprentice (during such time as he shall observe and perform the terms of this indenture) wages at the rates prescribed for apprentices from time to time by the determination of the Plumbers Board and will also pay to the said apprentice such further rate or rates for overtime worked as may be fixed by the determination of the said Plumbers Board. Provided always and it is hereby agreed that the said apprentice shall not be paid for any time he shall be absent from his said duties through his own wilful default and neglect or through illness or through absenting himself from his said employer's service without leave or licence and also provided that the said apprentice shall not be entitled to a higher rate of pay until he has actually worked for a period of 12 months at the next preceding rate. In computing the period of 12 months all time worked as overtime shall be allowed as a set-off against any absence during the said period.

Provided also and it is hereby further agreed that the said apprentice will not at any time during the said term wilfully disobey the lawful and reasonable commands of the said employer nor without the leave or the licence of the said employer absent himself from the service of the said employer during business hours as fixed by the determination of the said Wages Board nor fail to work such reasonable overtime as the exigencies of the business may require and the law permits nor habitually neglect his duties nor fail to perform the same nor otherwise grossly misconduct himself.

Provided also and it is hereby further agreed and declared that if at any time during the said term the said employer shall die or cease to carry on the business aforesaid as now carried on by him within a radius of three miles from his present place of business at _____ then in such case the said employer or his executors administrators or assigns or one of them will within three months thereafter find and provide some other employer or employers carrying on the business aforesaid within such radius if any there be or if there be none such if the apprentice so require to some employer carrying on business beyond that radius and will assign and transfer at their own expense and cost the said apprentice to such employer or employers upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are hereinbefore provided. RE NETTING AT GIPPSLAND LAKES ENTRANCE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the said State.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamations made the sixteenth day of May, 1911, the second day of December, 1912, the third day of September, 1918, and the second day of July, 1920, re Netting at Gippsland Lakes Entrance, and hereby prohibit during the whole year the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the waters of Gippsland Lakes Entrance eastward of an imaginary line running south from the Rocky Point at Alaringa Creek to a post on the northern foreshore of Rigby Island and eastward of an imaginary line running north 67 degrees 30 minutes west from the most northerly point of the stone training wall (which extends from the western pier at the Lakes Entrance) to a point on the eastern foreshore of Rigby Island (all bearings magnetic), including a portion of Reeves Channel and the whole of the Cunningham and North Arms; provided that from the sixteenth day of May to the thirtieth day of November in each year such trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines may be used in Cunningham Arm eastward of an imaginary line running approximately north-north-west (magnetic) from the inner end of the eastern pier of the "Lakes Entrance" to the inner end of the pier at Bullock Island; provided further that so far as Cunningham Arm is concerned such trammels, trawls, or other nets or fixed engines shall not be used between Ten o'clock in the morning of each Friday and sunrise of each Sunday following nor within one hundred feet of any wharf, pier, or jetty in such arm.

NOTE.—Cunningham Arm does not include the chain of lagoons at the eastern end of the arm and partly connected therewith; in such lagoons and connecting waters the use of nets and fixed engines is prohibited during the whole year.

Privately-owned jetties will not be considered jetties for the purpose of this Proclamation.
