Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CEMETERY EMPLOYEES BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 3rd January, 1922, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in or about a cemetery as a grave digger, grave decorator, gatekeeper, labourer, or gardener" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That [this Determination shall come into force and be operative on and after the 3rd January, 1922.

(3) TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK—

Time of Beginning. Time of Ending.
7.30 a.m. .. 12 noon on the day on which the half-holiday is locally observed.
7.30 a.m. .. 5.15 p.m. on the other working days of the week.

(4) OVERTIME.—All work done outside the hours specified as the times of beginning and ending work, or for any work done within such hours in excess of 48 hours in any week, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(5) SPECIAL RATES—

Public Holidays.—Double time shall be the special rate payable to all persons for all work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

Sundays.—Double time shall be the special rate payable to all persons (excepting gatekeepers) for all work done on Sunday.
