PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Common-wealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands adjourned until Tuesday, the eleventh day of January, 1921:
Now I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Tuesday, the fifteenth day of February, 1921.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this seventh day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and in the eleventh year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

WHEREAS by the State Electricity Commission Act 1920 (No. 3104) it is among other things provided that except in so far as relates to any not matter or thing necessary or expedient to be done for the purpose of bringing the No. 3 .- JANUARY 7, 1921.-147.

same into operation on the appointed day that such Act should come into operation on the day fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council for the first meeting of the Commissioners of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria constituted by the said Act And, whereas it is deemed desirable that the said Act should come into operation on and from the 10th day of January now next Now therefore I the Licutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria under the powers by the said Act conferred in that behalf and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this Proclamation fix and appoint as the day for the first meeting of the said State Electricity Commission of Victoria, Monday the 10th day of January, 1921, upon which day the Commissioners of the Commission or the major part of them shall hold their first meeting accordingly.

State Electricity Commission Act 1920 (No. 3104).

H IS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the above-mentioned Act, has, by Order made on the sixth day of January, 1921, approved that the incumbent of the office of Chairman of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria be paid a salary at the rate of Three thousand pounds per annum, and that the other members of the said Commission be paid remuneration at the rate of Five hundred pounds (£500) per annum each: And His Excellency has by the same Order further approved that Lieutenant-General Sir John Monash, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., be appointed Chairman of the said State Electricity Commission of Victoria, at the salary aforesaid, to hold office as Commissioner and Chairman on and from the day appointed by Proclamation for the first meeting of the Commissioners for a term of seven years, and also that the tenure of office of the three other Commissioners, Thomas Ranken Lyle, Esquire, M.A., D.Sc., F.R.S., University Professor (retired), the Honorable George Swinburne, engineer, and Sir Robert Gibson, merchant, be fixed for a like term from the same date.
