Factories and Shops Acts.

# DETERMINATION OF THE CORDAGE BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 1st day of April, 1921, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong; the towns of Ballarat East and Warmambool; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sobastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of rope, twine, cordage, halters, coir mats, or coir matting," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st day of April, 1921, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this

The Board determines under the provisions of section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which this Board has not fixed piece-work prices, but has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.
