REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 25th November, 1912, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(e), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1915*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE FROM SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE AND ANNEXATION TO SHIRE OF FRANKSTON AND HASTINGS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the shire of Cranbourne described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said shire of Cranbourne and annexed to the shire of Frankston and Hastings.

Area described in petition—

Commencing at the north-east corner of lot 35, parish of Frankston, following Government road easterly to the north-east corner of lot 33c; thence south by eastern allotment line of lots 33c, 33A, and 34 to north boundary of lot 34c, south-westerly by such boundary to Cranbourne-road; thence by such road to north-east corner of lot 44; thence south by Government road to south-east corner of lot 75A; thence westerly by Government road to south-west corner of lot 75; thence north-westerly by Government road to south-west corner of lot 70B1, all in the parish of Langwarrin; thence northerly by eastern boundary of Frankston parish to commencing point.

The petitioners state that all their interests are centered in Frankston and Somerville, as they have to go there to reach their train, get household requirements, and buy and sell their produce. They also state that they travel on the roads within the shire of Frankston and Hastings and pay no rates towards their upkeep, as their rates go in the opposite direction towards roads that they do not use.

COBRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

By-law No. 17.

THE Commissioners of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-law:—

BY-LAW DETERMINING THE RATE PAYABLE FOR THE YEAR 1921 FOR WATER WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE COBRAM WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Fifteen pounds (£15) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1921.

2. The minimum rates for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Fifteen pounds (£15) sterling on the municipal value upon which are houses or tenements used wholly or partly as dwellings, shall be Thirty shillings (30s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land fronting Station-street; Queen-street, from Station-street to High-street; Main-street, from Station-street to High-street; Punt-road, from Station-street to High-street; Bank-street, from Punt-road to High-street; and High-street, from Queen-street to Pine-street—a minimum rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.

4. On all other unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District, and not rated under the foregoing clause, the minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) shall be charged.

5. On all unoccupied allotments or pieces of land not served with a water main, situated within half-a-mile of the Trust's stand-pipe, a minimum rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) shall be charged.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made, payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1921.

7. Where, in the opinion of the Trust, it is necessary that a meter be affixed to the water-pipe supplying any allotment, house or tenement, the same may, in the discretion of the Commissioners, be supplied by the Trust, and the cost shall be repaid by the owner of such allotment, house, or tenement, but the Trust may submit such repayment to be made at the rate of Thirty-two shillings (32s.) yearly, payable by quarterly instalments, with interest added.

8. The Trust may require an approved meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any allotment, house, or tenement, in any case where it may deem necessary.

9. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic or other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

10. For water supplied by measure a charge of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

11. For water supplied to bowling greens or other public or semi-public grounds the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the said Trust shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust, otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes:—

- (1) For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of less than £40, the sum of One pound five shillings.
- (2) For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of £40 and upwards, the sum of Sevenpence half-penny (7½d.) in the pound of such municipal value.
- (3) The rate to be paid in respect of vacant unoccupied allotments of land shall also be Sevenpence half-penny in the pound of such annual municipal value, provided that no rate be less than Twelve shillings and sixpence.
- (4) The minimum rate to be charged to livery stables shall be as follows —

Where there are not more than 6 horses, the sum of Two pounds.

Where there are more than 6 horses, the sum of Four pounds.

- (5) Where water is laid on to vacant land, the minimum charge if trough with ball tap is provided shall be Two pounds; without ball-tap, Four pounds.
- (6) The minimum charge for septic tanks shall be as follows:—

For private houses, the sum of One pound five shillings.

For boarding-houses, the sum of Two pounds.

- (7) Water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by special agreement at such price as may be fixed by the Trust.

The foregoing rates and charges are hereby made, payable half-yearly in advance, on the first days of January and July, 1921, respectively, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and receive such rates and charges.

ST. ARNAUD BOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1921.

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of powers conferred by Water Acts, do hereby make The following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

The rates and charges specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

- On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Nine pounds and under, the sum of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence per annum (£1 12s. 6d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Nine pounds, and not exceeding the annual municipal value of Fourteen pounds, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings per annum (£1 15s.).

On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Fourteen pounds, and not exceeding the annual municipal value of Nineteen pounds, the sum of One pound seventeen shillings and sixpence per annum (£1 17s. 6d.).

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Nineteen pounds, the sum of Two shillings in the pound sterling upon the amount of the annual municipal valuation.

On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated from the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District separately from any buildings, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling upon the amount of the municipal valuation.

On every house, tenement, or land situated otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which house, tenement, or land is not supplied with the water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such house, tenement, or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable in advance in one amount on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

In construction of this By-law the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WINCHELSEA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1921.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:—

By-law No. 9.

The following are the rates and charges which occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District thereof:—

1. For every house and tenement up to £16 annual municipal value and under, the sum of £2 (Two pounds) per annum.

2. For every house and tenement of £17 annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 upon the municipal value of such property.

3. Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months commencing on the first day of July shall be charged two-thirds rates.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land un-supplied or supplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Fifteen shillings sterling per annum.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land un-supplied or supplied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 upon the municipal value of such property.

6. Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs, and to Government grounds, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement at 1s. 6d. (One shilling and sixpence) per 1,000 gallons.

7. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons, or under, the sum of Sixpence.

8. For a supply during the erection of new buildings there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

9. Except hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rates which would be payable for the premises so supplied and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

10. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be £1, renewals 5s.

That the beforementioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, or in other cases as directed by the secretary, and shall be payable in two equal instalments. The first payment shall be made on the first day of January, 1921, for half year ending 30th June, 1921, and the second payment shall be made on the first day of July, 1921, for the half-year ending 31st December, 1921. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 1016.—FLOOD PROTECTION CHARGE.—LOWER KOO-WEE-RUP FLOOD PROTECTION DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

REGULATION OF CHEMISTS' SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF SWAN HILL.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the shire of Swan Hill, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for the shop of any chemist within the township of Swan Hill, within the municipal district of the shire of Swan Hill, to be kept open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week until half-past Eight o'clock.

REGULATION OF HAIRDRESSERS' SHOPS AND TOBACCONISTS' SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF COLERAINE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the shire of Wannon, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of each particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for the shop of any hairdresser or of any tobacconist within the township of Coleraine within the municipal district of the shire of Wannon to be kept open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week until Eight o'clock.

VARIATION OF ORDER APPOINTING A CHARWORKERS BOARD.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Resolution and the said Order so that wherever occurring the words "in any building" shall be altered to "in or about any building."

VARIATION OF ORDER APPOINTING A COUNTRY SHOP ASSISTANTS BOARD.

WHEREAS a resolution declaring that it is expedient to appoint a Special Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in or in connexion with a shop (other than a Fourth Schedule shop) as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter, was passed by the Legislative Assembly on the 12th December, 1911, and by the Legislative Council on the 21st December, 1911; and whereas the Governor in Council, by Order made on the 23rd January, 1912, appointed a Country Shop Assistants Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed as aforesaid:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said resolution and the said Order so that, wherever occurring, the words "(other than a Fourth Schedule shop)" shall be deleted.

A DRAPERS AND MEN'S CLOTHING SHOPS BOARD TO BE APPOINTED IN LIEU OF THE DRAPERS BOARD AND THE MEN'S CLOTHING BOARD.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council, by Order dated the second day of March, 1909, appointed the Drapers Board, and by Order dated the eleventh day of January, 1910, appointed the Men's Clothing Board, and whereas it is expedient to appoint the undermentioned Board in lieu of such Boards: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, doth order—

That a Wages Board consisting of ten members and a chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and five as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the business of a seller of—

- (a) any article of men's or boys' clothing, mercery, or wearing apparel, including underclothing, hats, and caps;
- (b) goods usually sold by drapers or haberdashers, including mantles, costumes, millinery, gloves, stockings, and underclothing.

Also that such Wages Board may in any Regulation, determination, order, or instrument, or legal proceedings, be described for all purposes as the Drapers and Men's Clothing Shops Board.

And that the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, all cities and towns, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

A WATCHMEN'S BOARD TO BE APPOINTED IN LIEU OF THE NIGHT WATCHMEN'S BOARD.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council, by Order dated the twentieth day of November, 1911, appointed the Night Watchmen's Board, and whereas His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the occupation of a watchman: Now therefore His Excellency doth hereby order that, in lieu of the said Night Watchmen's Board, a Wages

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR ORNAMENTAL PURPOSES IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CASTLEMAINE, KNOWN AS THE "WESTERN RESERVE."

WE, Arthur David Freeman, Samuel Mackay Cornish, Thomas Martin, David Andrew Ireland, John Bennett, Harold Ingamells Harrison, Matthew Thomas Fogarty, John Woolhouse Barnet Field, Jonathan Cameron, and Horace White Pedler, the duly appointed Committee of Management of such portion of the Reserve for Ornamental purposes in the municipal district of Castlemaine, situated in section 84 (known as the Western Reserve) having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling, plus tax, may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and no person shall remain within the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by an officer or employee of the Committee of Management or by any person duly authorized in that behalf to leave the Reserve.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale, nor sell or offer for sale therein any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall play or engage in cricket, football, tennis, or any game whatever or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided that any permission given in writing by the Committee of Management to any club shall include any member of such club.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on or in any structure or erections in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown lands, or by a member of the police force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Clause 8.
13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 14 and 15 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board to such mulct not exceeding fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.
14. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned, on a legibly written business label.
15. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other Department as shall be named therein. CITY OF FITZROY.

BY-LAW No. 83.

A By-law of the City of Fitzroy, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 83, for the purpose of—

- Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house may thereafter be erected;
- Providing that every dwelling-house thereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, a prescribed area of open land;
- Providing that every dwelling-house thereafter erected shall have a separate fixed bath, and every shop and dwelling-house a separate water-closet for the use of the occupiers;
- Regulating the height, area, and number of rooms;
- Regulating the material to be used in construction;
- Providing that certain areas may not be used for other purposes than dwelling-houses;
- Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council, by resolution, or by their building surveyor or other officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy order as follows:—

- Area Affected.**—This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the whole municipality.
- Operation.**—This By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.
- Dwelling-houses.**—No dwelling-house, nor any outbuildings thereto, shall be erected except on land having a frontage of not less than 20 feet to a street or road and an average depth of not less than 90 feet. Provided, however, that in any case where the depth of the land is less than 90 feet a dwelling-house may be erected thereon if the width or frontage is increased proportionately so as to give a total superficial area of not less than 1,800 square feet; but in no case whatever shall the depth of the land be less than 80 feet. Provided also that the frontage may be reduced to 18 feet when the minimum area is not less than 1,800 square feet and the land abuts on a right-of-way. Provided further that when any allotment of land smaller in area than that hereinbefore prescribed was, in the opinion of the Council, not part of an allotment of which a portion has been alienated or excised

since the coming into operation of this By-law, and in the opinion of the Council further land cannot be obtained to increase the area of such land, or such allotment is shown on any plan of subdivision heretofore approved by the Council, the Council, on application in writing, may, by resolution carried by a majority of the whole of the number of the members of the Council, at a meeting of which due notice has been given, permit a dwelling-house, which shall comply with the building regulations of the city, to be erected upon such land.

4. **Yard and Frontage Space.**—Every dwelling-house hereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, an area, exclusive of the dwelling, of at least 600 square feet, 500-square feet of which shall be yard area clear of all outhouses or buildings of whatsoever kind. No dwelling-house shall be erected within 4 feet of the front building line.

5. **Shops.**—No shop shall be built except on land having a frontage of not less than 18 feet to a street or road and an average depth of not less than 90 feet to a right-of-way 10 feet in width at the least, and a total area of not less than 1,620 square feet. Provided that in every case where dwelling rooms are attached to a shop there shall be an open space of yard free from all buildings of not less than 500 square feet for the exclusive use of the occupiers of such shop and dwelling rooms. Provided further that when any allotment of land smaller in area than that hereinbefore prescribed was, in the opinion of the Council, not part of an allotment of which a portion has been alienated or excised since the coming into operation of this By-law, and in the opinion of the Council further land cannot be obtained to increase the area of such land or such allotment, is shown on any plan of subdivision heretofore approved by the Council, the Council, on application in writing, may, by resolution carried by a majority of the whole of the number of the members of the Council, at a meeting of which due notice has been given, permit a shop, which shall comply with the building regulations of the city, to be erected upon such land.

6. **Reduction of Area.**—No land upon which any dwelling-house has been erected shall thereafter be reduced in area below the minimum area prescribed by this By-law. Frontages shall be measured at 90 deg. (square) to the depth and not on an oblique-angled road frontage.

7. **Water-closets and Baths.**—No shop or dwelling in separate occupation shall be erected without a separate water-closet and convenience being provided (M.M.B.W. pattern), and no place used as a dwelling without a separate fixed bath.

8. **Rooms.**—Every dwelling shall have rooms at least 10 feet 6 inches clear in height from ceiling to floor, and every shop, factory, or warehouse shall be at least 12 feet in height from floor to ceiling. Every dwelling shall have at least two main rooms with an area of 132 square feet each, and a total area of 500 square feet. In the case of a four or more roomed dwelling the area must be at least 600 square feet.

9. **Materials.**—No building shall be built of second-hand materials unless such materials are previously approved by the building surveyor, and any condemned materials must be forthwith removed from the site of the works. No dwelling, shop, or factory of wood and iron or partly of wood or iron shall be erected on land having a lesser frontage than 36 feet, or a lesser depth than 80 feet.

10. **Certain Areas may be Proclaimed.**—The Council may, at any ordinary meeting, after due notice, and by proclamation circulating in any paper in the neighbourhood, proclaim certain areas to be residential areas, and forbid the erection of shops, factories, or other prescribed buildings therein.

11. **Regulation of Procedure.**—The Council from time to time by resolution of which due notice has been given, may determine any matter in connexion with this By-law, regulate the procedure thereunder and authorize the course to be adopted, or action taken in any class of cases or in any particular case.

12. **Penalties.**—Every person who shall, by any wilful act or default, be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each such offence, and in addition, if such offence be a continuing one, a sum not exceeding £2 per day for each day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence is given by the building surveyor or other officer authorized on that behalf to the person or persons so offending.

13. **Surveyor's Duties.**—The building surveyor referred to in this By-law is the proper officer of the Council empowered on its behalf under sections 99, 100, 101, Reg. 135, made under Part V. of the 13th Schedule of *Local Government Act 1874* by the city of Fitzroy.

14. **Repeal.**—Such portions of said Regulation No. 135 and By-laws 50, 51, and 55 of this city as conflict with this By-law are hereby expressly repealed.

Resolution for passing this By-law No. 83 agreed to by the Council the eighth day of November, 1920, and confirmed the 6th day of December, 1920.

BOROUGH OF MENTONE AND MORDIALLOC.

REGULATION No. 5—HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

IT is hereby notified that the Council of the borough of Mentone and Mordialloc has passed a Regulation, No. 5, under section 48, of Part X., Subdivision (1) of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the borough by virtue of a By-law of the above-named borough made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 43.

For appointing, subject to the limits prescribed in the said Thirteenth Schedule, Part X., Subdivision 1, the several sums to be paid for licences for hackney carriages, municipal stage carriages, drivers, and conductors.

For regulating the manner in which the name of the municipality and the number of each carriage corresponding with the number of its licence shall be displayed thereon.

For regulating the conduct of the owners, drivers, and conductors of hackney carriages and of municipal stage carriages plying within the borough in their several employments.

For regulating either by relation to the nature and dimensions of the carriage and the number of horses required to draw the same or all or any of these or otherwise the number of persons to be carried by hackney carriages and municipal stage carriages and in what manner such number is to be shown upon such carriage and in what position and manner the lamp, when required by the provisions of the said Thirteenth Schedule, Part X., Subdivision 1 to be placed inside municipal stage carriages is to be placed therein.

For fixing the following local matters, namely, the standings of hackney carriages and municipal stage carriages whether separately or otherwise, and the number of such carriages to be allowed at any such standing and the mode in which such carriages are to stand thereon, and the routes and places of call for municipal stage carriages and the time during which each such municipal stage carriage shall be allowed to remain at any such place, and the times and succession for the starting and the running of such municipal stage carriages.

For fixing the rates or fares as well for time as for distance to be paid for hackney carriages and by passengers in municipal stage carriages and the mode in which such rates or fares are to be painted or marked on every such carriage.

A copy of the said Regulations is open for inspection at the office of the Council, Council Chambers, Mordialloc, during office hours.

2. Such fees shall be paid to the Shire Secretary or such other officer of the Council as the shire of Kyneton may from time to time appoint to collect the said fee.

(a) For every registration and for every annual renewal of registration of premises as described hereunder:—

Nature of Premises. Fees—payable in advance.

1. Offensive trades premises—Two pounds ten shillings.
2. Slaughtering premises—One pound.
3. Cattle sale yards—One pound.
4. Boarding houses—Five shillings.
5. Common lodging houses—Five shillings.
6. Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, or other mineral water or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings.
7. Premises on which is manufactured or prepared for sale, ice cream—Two shillings and sixpence.

(b) For the transfer of any such registration—Two shillings and sixpence.

(c) The above fee shall be for each year (or part of a year) ending on the 31st day of December of the said year.

(d) Failure to comply with this By-law renders such person liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20) and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5).

- For each offensive trade premises—Fifty shillings.
For each boarding house—Ten shillings.
For each common lodging house—Ten shillings.
For each premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings.
For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and sixpence.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell.

SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON.

REGULATION No. 4.

Regulation of the shire of Shepparton, numbered four, made under section 1 of Part V. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the shire of Shepparton by virtue of a By-law numbered 34 of the said shire for the purposes set out in this Regulation.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Shepparton make the following Regulation which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shepparton Riding of the Shire of Shepparton:—

1. For the purpose of this Regulation the following terms shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

"The Council" means the Council of the Shire of Shepparton.

"The Surveyor" means the engineer of the shire of Shepparton.

"The Secretary" means the secretary of the Council of the Shire of Shepparton.

"Person building" means either or all of the following:—Owner, mortgagee in possession, lessee, architect, builder or contractor.

"Approved" means approved by the Surveyor.

"Builder" means the master builder or any other person employed to execute any work or if there be no master builder or other person so employed then the owner of the building or other person for whom or by whose orders such work is to be done.

"Building" means any structure capable of affording protection or shelter either roofed or intended or adapted to be roofed and whether enclosed by walls or not, but does not include any greenhouse fernery aviary or other similar erection.

"External wall" means any outer wall or vertical enclosure of any building not being a party wall.

"Party wall" means a wall built to be used as a separation of two or more buildings or a wall forming part of a building built upon the dividing line between adjoining premises for their common use.

"Cross wall" means any internal wall constructed of any fire-resisting materials not being less than two-thirds the thickness of the external or party walls and in no case less than 9 inches in thickness built in connexion with any external or party wall and bonding the same together.

"Internal wall" means any internal wall other than a cross wall.

"Fire resisting" used with reference to any materials includes:—

(a) Brick work constructed of bricks well burnt hard and sound properly bonded and solidly put together with mortar compounded of lime or cement and sharp clean sand, hard clear broken brick broken stone grit or approved clinker.

(b) Granite and other solid and durable stone.

(c) Iron steel and other approved metal.

(d) Concrete composed of broken brick tile stone pumice or coke breeze with sand and lime cement or calcined gypsum in approved proportions.

(e) Reinforced concrete.

(f) Any material from time to time approved by the Surveyor.

"New building" includes—

(a) Any building commenced after the date of this Regulation coming into force, and

(b) Any building which for more than half its cubical extent has been taken down or destroyed by fire tempest or otherwise and is re-erected or commenced to be re-erected wholly or partially on the same site after the date of this Regulation coming into force, and

(c) Any space between wall and buildings which is roofed or commenced to be roofed after the date of this Regulation coming into force, and

(d) Any building or erection removed or transported wholly or in sections into the municipal district of the Shepparton Riding of the Shire of Shepparton or from one part of the said municipal district to another part of the same after the date of this Regulation coming into force.

Notice Permit and Fees.

2. No builder shall commence any building erection or structure or any addition or alteration to any building erection or structure without first delivering at the office of the Surveyor a written notice of such intention three days before so commencing and producing to the Surveyor proper plans and specifications of such building erection structure addition or alteration together with a tracing or copy of the floor plans of such building erection structure addition or alteration and also details of dimensions sizes and qualities of all materials and enumerating any old materials proposed to be used in

the construction of same, also block plan to show the relation of building to adjoining buildings and boundaries also to kerb line of channel or footpath edge of drain where no kerb exists.

3. The original plans and specifications when approved shall be returned to the owner or his agent but the tracing or copy of the plans and details of materials shall be retained by the Surveyor. Any such tracing or copy of the plans and details may be inspected by any interested party on payment of a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

4. When a building is to be demolished or removed the owner or builder shall give twenty-four hours' notice to the Surveyor of such intended demolition or removal and such demolition or removal shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

5. No person shall commence any building erection structure or other work without having first obtained from the Surveyor a written permit for the commencement of the same and having paid to the Secretary such sum as is demanded of him in accordance with the scale of fees in the first schedule hereto. Such permit shall only remain in force and effect for twelve months from the date of issue of same.

Duties of Surveyor.

6. The Surveyor shall upon the receipt of any such notice as aforesaid and also upon any work being observed by or made known to him which is affected by the provisions of this Regulation but in respect of which no notice has been given and also from time to time during the progress of any work affected by such provisions as often as may be necessary for securing the due observance of such provisions survey any such building structure erection or work and cause all such provisions to be duly observed.

7. The Surveyor at all reasonable times during the progress and during thirty days next after the completion of any building structure erection or work affected by any of the provisions of this Regulation or by any of the terms or conditions on which the observance of any such provisions may have been dispensed with may enter and inspect such building structure or work and if occasion shall arise shall thereupon direct the builder to do all such further works as shall or may in his opinion be necessary in order that the provisions of this Regulation may be fully observed and carried out.

Buildings in Brick Area.

8. Every new building within the township of Shepparton constructed upon land having a frontage to any of streets enumerated hereunder, viz.:-

High-street between Welsford-street and railway,

Wyndham-street between High-street and Nixon-street,

Fryers-street between Welsford-street and Harold-street, or upon land within a distance of 150 feet from any such frontage enumerated above which area is hereinafter called the "Brick Area" shall be enclosed with walls constructed of brick stone or other fire-resisting materials and the footings shall rest on the solid ground or upon concrete or upon other solid substance.

9. Every external wall in the "Brick Area" built within four feet of ground in other occupation or within four feet of any adjoining building or a street lane or alley shall be carried up so as to form a parapet wall in height one foot six inches at the least above the highest part of the adjoining gutter and the thickness of the parapet so carried up shall be at the least nine inches throughout.

10. Every party wall in the brick area shall be carried up for a thickness of nine inches above the roof flat or gutter so as to give a height of (18) eighteen inches above such flat or gutter measured at right angles to the slope of the roof.

11. Every parapet wall and every party wall shall be carried up of the thickness aforesaid at least twelve inches above any dormer lantern light skylight or other erection of combustible materials fixed upon the roof of any building within four feet from such parapet wall and shall project for at least twelve inches beyond each end of such erection.

12. Every cross wall shall be of not less thickness than nine inches and be constructed of brick stone or other fire-resisting material.

13. Every internal wall shall be of not less thickness than nine inches and be constructed of fire-resisting materials unless in the opinion of the Surveyor the cross walls in such building act as sufficient support thereto and form a factor of safety in which event internal walls of lath and plaster or other approved materials may with the consent of the Surveyor be constructed.

14. If it be at any time proposed to alter or remodel or reinstate premises in the "Brick Area" such alteration remodelling or reinstatement shall be carried out in strict compliance with this Regulation for building in the said area subject nevertheless to such alterations as may be sanctioned by the Council on the recommendation of the Surveyor after supervision thereof.

Other Buildings.

15. A builder shall not erect build or construct or cause to be erected built or constructed any wooden building or structure upon or within a distance of twenty feet from any street line unless the whole of the said building or structure covers an area of eight hundred square feet at least excluding all

detached buildings and unless the external walls of such wooden building or structure are at least six feet from the boundaries of the land upon which such building or erection is being built. The said distance of twenty feet shall in every case be measured to the front of the verandah or any other projection of such wooden building.

16. No building used or intended to be used as a dwelling house shall be erected the front of which shall be nearer at any point than fifteen feet to any street within the said township of Shepparton or the external walls of which would be nearer at any point than six feet to the boundaries of the land upon which such building is being built save and except a building the front of which is not nearer than fifteen feet to any street and the end or side walls of party walls of which are parapet built of solid brick or other fire-resisting materials without openings. Provided where such last-mentioned walls are at least three feet from the boundary of the adjoining tenement openings for doors and windows may be allowed.

17. No fowlhouses stables or manure bins shall be erected in front of any building used as a dwelling nor at a less distance than twenty-five feet from such building.

Materials.

18. All materials shall be of good quality and no materials shall be used in the construction of any building or any addition to or alteration of any building if the same has been disapproved of by the Surveyor on the ground of their not being of good quality. Any materials so objected to shall be immediately removed from the site of the work by the builder.

19. Roofs shall be covered with tiles slates metal or other fire-resisting materials approved by the Surveyor.

20. All shop fronts door openings and windows shall be constructed to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

21. Every person who builds or erects a new building shall so construct the same that there shall be for the purposes of ventilation between the undersides of every joist on which the floor thereof is laid and the upper surface of the ground a clear space of at least eight inches and shall cause such space to be thoroughly ventilated by means of some effectual method arranged so as to cause a through current of air to pass beneath the flooring.
