Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE COUNTRY FUEL AND FODDER BOARD.

Note.—This Determination, on the 1st April, 1921, applied to the whole of the State outside and excepting the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warmambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

(a) employed in the business of a hay, com, or chaff dealer;

(b) employed in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of firewood for sale or connected with the sales or distribution of wood, coal, or coke"

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st day of April, 1921, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

And 3s, extra per week for every additional horse.

(3) QVERTIME.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(4) Special Rates.—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, then the special rate shall be payable only for the day so substituted.

(5) PIECE-WORK.—The lowest piece-work prices to be paid to any person for doing work of the description referred to in the following Schedule shall be :-
