Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE STONECUTTERS BOARD.

Note. - This Determination on the 17th January, 1921, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of cutting, carving, polishing, and letter cutting in marble and stone," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That, on the 17th January, 1921, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

Apprentices and improvers shall be subject to the same number of hours per week as fixed for their respective sections.

(3) Stonecutters employed in cutting stone known as granite to be paid 2d. per hour in addition to above rates, unless t following tools are provided by the employer, viz: —Drills, bull-punches, tongs, striking hammers, and patent axes.
(4) Time of Beginning and Ending work.—
(a) For persons employed as frame saw machinists—
Time of Beginning.
7 a.m 12 noon on the day on which the half-holiday is observed, and 7 a.m 6 p.m. on the other working days of the week.
(b) For all other persons—
Time of Beginning. Time of Ending.
7.45 a.m
(5) OVERTIME.—That the following rates shall be paid for overtime:—
Outside the hours fixed in Clause 4 Within the hours fixed in Clause 4 in excess of the number of hours as fixed for a week's work Time and a half.
(6) RATES WHERE TOOLS NOT SHARPENED BY EMPLOYER.—That 2d. per hour in addition to above rates shall be paid in all case mentioned above unless all tools are sharpened by the employer.
(7) DEFINITION.—Wherever occurring in this Determination, the term "Monumental" shall mean pertaining to monument erected in cemeteries or in churches.
