Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE IRONMOULDERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on 6th May, 1921, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; the boroughs of Castlemaine, Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol; and such portion of the shire of Bungaree as is within 10 miles of a city or town.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to “determine the lowest prices or rates of payment which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than moulders employed in moulding metal bedsteads) employed in the process, trade, or business of an ironmoulder,” has made the following Determination, namely:—

NOTE.—Section 163 of the *Factories Act* 1915, No. 2650, extends the powers of this Board to “steel moulding.”

1. That on the 6th day of May, 1921, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

3. OVERTIME.—Any time worked in excess of 48 hours per week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

4. SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, Good Friday, Foundation Day (26th January), Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, and New Year's Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays the special rate shall only be payable on the day so substituted.

5. PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines under the provisions of Section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work in the process, trade, or business of an ironmoulder, provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
