## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

Railways Classification Board Act 1919 (No. 3006).

AWARD (No. 5) OF 5TH APRIL, 1921.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of section 14 of the *Railways Classification Board Act 1919* (No. 3006), has, by Order made on the 10th day of May, 1921, approved the Award (No. 5) of the 5th day of April, 1921, of the Railways Classification Board, as set forth in the subjoined Schedule, the Award to continue in force up to 30th June, 1922:—

## SCHEDULE.

## DIVISION I.

*Emergency Work.*

1. "Emergency work" shall mean all work declared by the Commissioners to be emergency work. It shall include work of an urgent nature—

- (a) performed in connexion with a flood or fire, or an accident requiring the employment of the break-down gang;
- (b) that cannot be performed during the time trains are running; and
- (c) such as may be determined by the Commissioners.

2. As payment for emergency work an addition of 25 per cent. shall be made to the ordinary or overtime rate (as the case may be), subject to a maximum of double time.

## DIVISION II.

*Relieving in Higher Positions.*

1. (a) Any clerk or assistant stationmaster who is required to perform the duties of a stationmaster; and
- (b) any employee (other than an engineman performing the duties of a higher class within his own grade, or an engine-cleaner performing the duties of a fireman) who is required to perform the duties of a higher position than that in which he is classified—

shall whilst performing such duties be paid the equivalent of the minimum salary or wage prescribed for the position in which he is acting. In addition, any clerk, assistant stationmaster, or employee, who whilst performing the duties of a stationmaster is not provided with free quarters, shall be granted the prescribed allowance in lieu thereof.

Nothing contained herein shall affect the provisions of the Award relating to the rate of wage of engine-drivers.

2. Subject to (1), any officer (other than an officer on the regular relieving staff) who is required to perform the duties of a higher position than that in which he is classified for a term exceeding two (2) calendar months (continuous or non-continuous) within a period of twelve (12) calendar months shall, after the expiration of that term, be paid whilst performing such duties the equivalent of the minimum rate of salary prescribed for such higher position.

3. Provided that—

- (a) The foregoing provisions shall not apply in respect of any period of less than one day, except in the case of—
  - (i) any employee who acts in the higher position at least once in every week during any particular month;
  - (ii) any employee who acts as a coal viewer, guard, hostler, lighter-up and washer-out, motor guard, signman, signwriter, or spray painter, or in such other position as may from time to time be determined by the Commissioners;
  - (iii) any employee who acts in a higher position on alternate Sundays; and
  - (iv) any employee who acts in the higher position for at least a quarter of a day on the day immediately preceding or following a full day in which he acts in such position;

and shall not apply in these cases unless the period of higher duty amounts in the aggregate to at least one day in the month; and

- (b) any officer or employee after having performed the duties of a higher position for twelve (12) calendar months either continuously or non-continuously within a period of two (2) years, shall whilst performing such duties be paid the equivalent of the next sub-divisional rate (if any) of salary or wage prescribed for such higher position.

4. Any engine-cleaner who is required to perform the duties of a fireman shall, whilst performing such duties, be paid the equivalent of the minimum wage prescribed for a fireman.

## DIVISION III.

*Conditions Associated with the Running of Trains.*

1. (a) Any employee on the running staff may be booked off at a terminal point away from his head-quarters during an interval between the trips constituting a shift, but shall not be booked off for rest—

- (i) for a period of less than eight hours if the interval commence between 5 a.m. and 8 p.m.; or
- (ii) for a period of less than five hours if the interval commence between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m., and then only subject to the special approval of the Commissioners if the interval be less than eight hours.

(b) Any such employee who is paid on the basis of hours shall be credited with full time at single rate for the time booked off (other than for rest) during any such interval, subject in any case where the time so booked off is more than one hour to a deduction of one hour for each "trip" allowance payable in respect of a shift during which the interval occurs.

For the purposes of this provision an engineman who is required merely to remain in charge of his engine shall be deemed to be booked off.

(c) Any such employee who is booked off for rest during any such interval for a period of less than eight hours shall be paid for one-eighth of a day in addition to the time actually worked or otherwise allowed.

2. Any employee on the running staff who runs a train from his head-quarters and does not commence to return thereto on the same or the following day, shall be credited with such time (subject to a maximum of eight hours) for each intervening week day on which he does not run, in addition to the time allowed for the forward and return trips, as may be required to bring his time (including engine time or other time allowances, but excluding the time to which he is entitled for an intervening Sunday and the penalty rate for any overtime worked during the period of absence) for the round trip up to even time for the number of week days over which the trip extends. Provided that the employee concerned shall be liable for duty at the forward terminal to the extent of the time with which he is credited in respect of such intervening day or days.

3. Any employee on the running staff who runs a train from his head-quarters and does not commence to return thereto on the same or the following day shall be paid for at least eight hours at single rate for an intervening Sunday.

4. Where an employee on the running staff runs a train from his head-quarters in connexion with a shift commencing on a Saturday and terminating on a Sunday and the period between the time of signing off at the termination of such shift and the time of signing on for the return journey to head-quarters amounts to 24 hours or more, he shall be paid for at least eight hours at single rate for such period.

5. In this Division "employee on the running staff" shall mean any engine-driver, fireman, cleaner, guard (including ballast guard), conductor, porter (vanman), or employee acting as such.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

## No. 69.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioners," in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the *Railways Act 1915*, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection, and examination of candidates for employment, and do hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto.

1. Every person desiring to become a candidate for employment in any position specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination must prepare, in his own handwriting, an application on the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for appointment to one of the vacancies specified in such public notice.

2. The age of each candidate shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for the opening of the applications, and shall be not less than the minimum, nor more than the maximum, age specified in the public notice for the particular grade.

3. The height of every candidate shall not be less than the minimum height prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

4. The wage of every successful candidate on appointment and thereafter shall, subject to the conditions specified in the public notice, be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation of the Commissioners, or of any award of the Railway Classification Board, or Wages Board Determination applicable to the particular trade or avocation under the provisions of the *Railway Classification Board Act 1919*.

5. Every successful candidate for employment in the grade of Apprentice, Junior Clerk, Lad Labourer, or Lad Porter, who, owing to the requirements of the Department, may be obliged to reside away from his home, shall, in addition to his salary or wage, be granted an allowance towards his board and lodging expenses if so entitled by the Regulation of the Commissioners or award of the Railway Classification Board in that behalf in operation for the time being.

6. Every candidate shall confine himself to one application for employment in one of the grades specified in the public notice, and, in the case of an Apprentice, to one application for employment in one of the trades specified therein, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped, and posted so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways (hereinafter referred to as the "Secretary"), Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

7. Every candidate shall furnish with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth. In the case, however, of a candidate born outside of the State of Victoria, a statutory declaration by one of his parents or by a near elder relative as to the date of his birth will be accepted as temporary evidence of age; but every such candidate who is selected and is appointed on probation will be required to obtain an official birth certificate from the State or country in which he was born within such reasonable time as may be determined by the Commissioners.

8. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Depart-

ment or in the Public Service, whether as a permanent or supernumerary employee, shall furnish with his application particulars as to the period of such employment.

9. Any person who has been dismissed from the Railway Department, or the Public Service, or whose employment has been terminated for disciplinary causes under the provisions of the Railways or Public Service Acts, or who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour, whether before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

10. The Secretary shall on the day and at the hour named in the public notice proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

11. The candidates in any grade, if not more than twice the number to be employed, shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 17 to 28 inclusive of this Regulation.

12. The candidates in any grade, if more than twice the number to be employed, shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number not exceeding twice the number to be employed.

13. The members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them; and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

14. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

15. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

16. Every candidate selected by the Board of Selectors shall be entitled to present himself for examination by the Railways Medical Officer.

17. Every such candidate, and every candidate for employment in any grade for which the number of applicants is not more than twice the number to be employed, shall pass an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall pay a fee of 5s.

18. Every such candidate shall, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of height, vision, colour-sense, and hearing, present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

19. Every such candidate shall be required by the Examiners appointed for that purpose to pass the educational examination prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

20. Every such candidate shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, as well as certificates, indentures, or other satisfactory evidence that he possesses the requisite qualifications prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade, and shall furnish satisfactory testimony of his employment with any persons or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years; and every such candidate who has had previous employment in the Public Service or in the service of the Commissioners shall produce a statement of such service and a certificate of competency and good conduct.

21. The Educational Examiners shall thereupon examine the candidates who have passed the physical, &c., examination, at such time and place as may be notified to such candidates respectively.

22. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, together with a certificate as prescribed hereunder:—

We, the undersigned duly appointed Examiners under the *Railways Act 1915*, do hereby certify that on the\* 19, we examined† for the position of in the Branch, and allotted him marks, and accordingly certify that he is‡ for such employment.

} Examiners.

23. After examination by the Educational Examiners the successful candidates in any grade, if not in excess of the number required, will be employed forthwith, and their relative seniority for future promotion, &c., shall be determined by a ballot conducted in the manner prescribed in Clause 25.

24. The successful candidates in any grade, if in excess of the number required, shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots in accordance with the method prescribed in Clause 25 to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be recorded for appointment, viz. :—

25. Two ballot-boxes shall be provided, numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which shall be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as shall correspond with the number of successful candidates.

Every such candidate shall then draw first from No. 1 box, and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by the drawing from No. 1 box. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box shall be the fourth in order for drawing out of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from No. 2 box shall fix his order of precedence for appointment, and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all other things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

26. Every successful candidate in any grade, if in excess of the number required by the Commissioners shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment to any vacancy in the particular grade for which he is a candidate during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of the ballot without further or other examination.

27. Every appointment shall be on probation for a period of six months, and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners, provided that the conduct, capacity, and industry of the probationer whilst in the service of the Commissioners have been satisfactory. No probationer, however, shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.

28. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employee shall without previous notice be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the period of probation, or, in the case of an Apprentice, either during or after the period of apprenticeship, and without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

29. Every Apprentice shall, immediately after appointment, attend, at either the Working Men's College, Ballarat School of Mines, Bendigo School of Mines, or such other institution as may be determined by the Commissioners, the classes of instruction appertaining to the trade to which he may be apprenticed, or such other classes as the Commissioners may direct, at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which, subject to the provisions of Clause 34, shall extend over a period of three years.

30. Every Apprentice shall provide the books, drawing instruments, &c., required at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution at his own expence, but the Commissioners will pay the fees of the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution.

31. Every Apprentice shall present himself for such examinations as may be prescribed at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, and shall pass in proper sequence the examinations for each year of such course, and, in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners.

32. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the Apprentices who each year of the three-years' period of tuition at the Working Men's College, School of Mines, or other such Institution may be adjudged first and second in order of merit and as possessing the highest qualifications amongst all Apprentices who are pursuing the course applicable to the particular year, shall be awarded the prizes applicable to their particular trades as specified in the public notice, provided that they obtain not less than 75 per cent. of the possible marks.

33. The Apprentice who, at the end of the third year of tuition, is adjudged first in order of merit amongst all Apprentices eligible under the conditions specified in the public notice, shall be nominated as a student in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering



(as may be determined by the Commissioners), and afforded facilities to attend for two years the full day course at either the Working Men's College, Ballarat School of Mines, Bendigo School of Mines, or other such Institution as may be determined by the Commissioners, and any such Apprentice who passes the prescribed examination and gains a diploma of the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, as the case may be, in respect thereof, shall, subject to the provisions of Clause 28 of this Regulation, thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of two years the fees of the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution will be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid an annual salary in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being.

34. Any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or Second Year Course, after having studied such course for one year, will be allowed a second year in which to qualify in such course, and shall attend such additional night classes as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioners, and shall pay the fees imposed in respect of such classes, and any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or the Second Year Course after having studied such course for two years, or who is adjudged guilty of continual, frequent, or repeated misconduct at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, or to have neglected to make a proper effort to qualify in the work at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution, will render himself liable to the immediate termination of his services, and shall not have any claim if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

35. The term of tuition at the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution at the expense

of the Department shall in every instance be limited to three years, and any apprentice who fails to complete the Course of Instruction within that period, and who desires to continue his studies, shall be required to pay the fees therefor, and will not be allowed to absent himself from duty during working hours for the purpose of attending the College, School of Mines, or other such Institution.

36. The term of apprenticeship shall be five years, and each year thereof shall be deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days, and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the Work-shops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the five years exceed sixty-five working days in the aggregate. In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any Apprentice during the five years exceeding sixty-five working days in the aggregate, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended beyond the five years for a period equivalent to the period of such excess leave of absence.

The country of origin of all imported articles must be stated in column "B" of the schedule.*

Security will be required either in Victorian Government Debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited, and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for a breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular description indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In the event of the tender being accepted for goods of Commonwealth or British manufacture (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor

may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.

3. The value of all packages, cases, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, &c. The net quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.); and, for the purposes of this contract, Melbourne will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary for Education or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. All orders, duly receipted, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account under the Audit Act and Regulations for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time being allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to be made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept, delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 12. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in Clause 7.

12. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in Clause 7.

13. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

14. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be, by the contractor, forwarded by post to the teacher to whom each parcel is directed, for him to sign and return.

15. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

16. The members of Boards of Survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

17. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

19. Should an increase or reduction take place in the prices at present charged for books and school requisites contained in the said schedule hereto by the publishers or manufacturers, a corresponding increase or reduction shall be made to or by the contractors in the prices of the articles supplied by them. In case of any disagreement as to the amount of increase or reduction the same shall be decided and settled by the Director of Education.

20. For the purpose of the contracts entered into under these conditions, it is hereby expressly provided that in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected item or items to remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter at his last-known place of business or abode.

21. If, in the opinion of the Tender Board, the price of any item or items of the contract be materially affected during its currency by any cause as the direct or indirect result of the war or by the proclamation of peace it will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made; the contract for the unaffected item or items to remain in full force and effect.

22. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in Clauses 20 and 21, will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

23. Should the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being decide to discontinue the use of any book, map, or any other article in the schedule, or to direct that any book, map, or any other article other than those enumerated therein be taken into use, he shall at any time give six months' notice of such intention or decision to the contractor, and after the expiration of the period of such notice the Education Department shall not be bound to take any further supply of such
