ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are herein-after set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to sanction the issue and application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Railways and for other purposes."

"An Act to authorize the Construction by the State of Lines of Railway for Developmental Purposes from Port Fairy to Yambuk and from Wren Wren to Woodside and for other purposes."

"An Act to declare the Rates of Income Tax for the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two and to amend and continue the Income Tax Acts."

"An Act to amend Part VI. of the Administration and Probate Act 1915."

"An Act to amend the Law relating to Mines."

"An Act to declare the Rate of Land Tax for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two and to amend the Land Tax Acts."

"An Act to amend the Boilers Inspection Acts with respect to Fees."

"An Act to confer certain powers on the Trustees for the time being under a Deed of Trust under which certain Land is held upon trust for the Members of a Body unincorporate known as the Victorian Branch of the Returned Sailors and Soldiers Imperial League of Australia."

"An Act to amend Section Nine of the *Railways Classification Board Act 1910*."

"An Act to authorize the raising of Money for the purposes of Works and Undertakings of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria and to sanction the Issue and Application of such Money for the said purposes."

"An Act to amend Section Thirty-eight of the *Country Roads Act 1915*."

"An Act to amend the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Acts."

"An Act to provide for the Exchange of a portion of certain Land in the Parish of Coongulmerang temporarily reserved from Sale as a Site for a Cemetery for certain other Land in the said Parish and for other purposes."

"An Act to authorize the Construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Colac to Alvie."

"An Act to amend and continue the *Betting Tax Act 1921*."

"An Act to amend the Law relating to the Sale and Occupation of Crown Lands and for other purposes."

"An Act to amend the Local Governments Acts."

"An Act to amend the Transfer of Land Acts."

"An Act to amend the *Dog Act 1915*."

"An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this and the last preceding Session of Parliament."

"An Act to amend the State Electricity Commission Acts."

"An Act to increase the Borrowing Powers of The Geelong Gas Company."

- "An Act to declare the Effect of Section Eighteen of the *Public Service Act 1901*."
- "An Act to authorize the Construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Red Cliffs to Millewa North."
- "An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation of certain Lands in the Parish of Smeaton as a Site for Public Park and to authorize the Permanent Reservation of portion thereof as a Site for a Public Park."
- "An Act to provide for a Joint Select Committee of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly to be called the House Committee."

Interpretation—

For "Commanding Officer" means the Officer in charge of the Base Hospital or the Officer in charge of the Regiment for the time being or the Officer in charge of the Ship or Naval Depot to which the person for whom treatment is required belongs, or Departmental Medical Officer, Department of Repatriation, Victorian Branch.

Read "Commanding Officer" means the Officer in charge of the Base Hospital or the Officer in charge of any Military Hospital in the State of Victoria or the Officer in charge of the Regiment for the time being or the Officer in charge of the Ship or Naval Depot to which the person for whom treatment is required belongs or the Departmental Medical Officer, Department of Repatriation, Victorian Branch.

**SEVERANCE OF AREA FROM THE SHIRE OF BALLAN
AND ANNEXATION TO THE SHIRE OF KYNETON.**

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686), sections 16 and 35, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the shire of Ballan, notice of which has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* of 19th October, 1921, doth hereby order and direct that a certain area therein described, being part of the East Riding of the said shire, shall be severed therefrom and annexed to the Trentham Riding of the shire of Kyneton—the amended boundaries of the said shire of Ballan with its East Riding as reduced, and also those of the said shire of Kyneton, with the Trentham Riding as enlarged, being set out and described in the Schedule hereto:—

**SEVERANCE OF AREA FROM THE SHIRE OF BALLAN AND ITS
ANNEXATION TO THE SHIRE OF KYNETON.**

Ballan Shire (Reduced and Re-defined).

Commencing at the intersection of the main Ballaarat to Melbourne (north) road and the road forming the west boundary of allotment 1, section 11, parish of Kerit Barceet; thence southerly by the latter road to the south-west angle of allotment 27, section 13; thence easterly by a road to the road from Gordon to Egerton; thence southerly by that road to the north boundary of the township of Egerton; thence west, south, and east by the boundaries of that township to the Geelong road; thence southerly by that road to the south boundary of the Bungal pre-emptive section; thence west by that boundary to the Western Moorarbool River; thence southerly by that river to the road to Morrisons; thence westerly and southerly by that road to the road forming the north boundary of allotment 7A, parish of Borhoneyghurk; thence westerly by that road to the road forming the east boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence southerly by that road to the south-west angle of the Borhoneyghurk pre-emptive section; thence easterly by the south boundary of that section and the south boundaries of allotments 46 and 47, parish of Meredith, to the Moorarbool River; thence northerly by that river to the south boundary of the parish of Ballark; thence easterly by that boundary and the south boundary of the parish of Beremboke to the Little River, opposite the south-east angle of allotment 24E in the last-named parish; thence further easterly by a direct line to the north-west angle of allotment 8, section B; thence east by that allotment and allotment 5 and north by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 4; thence east by a road to the south-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north, east, north, and east by the west and part of the north boundary of the parish of Balliang to the south-west angle of the parish of Gorrockburkghap; thence north, east, and northerly by part of the west boundary of that parish to the south boundary of allotment A, section 9; thence west by that allotment to the south-east angle of the Glenmore pre-emptive section; thence north by the east boundary of that section to the north-east angle thereof; thence east by allotment C to the south-west angle of allotment 9, section 6; thence north by the west boundary of the parish of Gorrockburkghap to the Werribee River; thence easterly by that river to the Myrniong Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the north boundary of allotment 31, section 7, parish of Blackwood; thence easterly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 32; thence north by the east boundary of allotments 32, 33, 39, 40, 43, 44, 47, and 48 to the north-east angle of the allotment last named; thence west by the north boundary of said allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 51; thence north by the east boundary of that allotment and allotment 52 to the north-east angle of allotment last named; thence east by the north boundary of allotment 53 to its north-east angle; thence north-westerly by the Bacchus Marsh and Blackwood road to a point on same north of the north angle of allotment 54 in the last-named parish; thence north by a line to the south boundary of section 11; thence west by the south boundary of that section to the south-west angle of allotment 8. thence westerly by a straight line to the south-east corner of allotment 21; thence west by the southern boundary of that allotment and a straight line to the centre of a 3-chain road; thence north by that road to the south-east corner of allotment N; thence west by the south boundary of that allotment and north by portion of its west boundary to the south-east corner of allotment P; thence west by the south boundary and north by the west boundary of that allotment to its north-west corner; thence south-easterly by a road to the south-west corner of

allotment 103D, parish of Trentham; thence north-easterly by the west boundary of that allotment and north by part of the west boundary of allotment 103E to the summit of the Great Dividing Range; thence north-westerly and south-westerly by the summit of that range to the eastern boundary of allotment C; thence southerly, north-westerly, and westerly by the boundary between the parishes of Trentham and Blackwood to the north-east angle of allotment F1 in the last-named parish; thence southerly, westerly, and northerly by that allotment to the summit of the Great Dividing Range aforesaid; thence westerly by the summit of that range to a point south of the south-east angle of allotment G, parish of Bullarto; thence north by a line to the said angle; thence west by allotments G, P1, O, A, W, X, Y, and Z and northerly by the last-mentioned allotment and a line to the summit of the aforesaid range; thence south-westerly by the summit of that range to the east boundary of allotment 13 of section 3A, parish of Wombat; thence south and west by that allotment and south by a road to the road forming the south boundary of allotment B4; thence west by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 17, parish of Korweinguboorra; thence south-easterly by the south-west boundary of that allotment to the summit of the aforesaid range; thence south-westerly by the summit of that range to the source of the Eastern Moorarbool River; thence south-easterly by that river to the north boundary of the Bolwarra pre-emptive section; thence westerly by that boundary and the north boundaries of sections 20 and 16 to a road forming the west boundary of allotment 1D of section 16; thence following said road southerly and westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 4A; thence west by the north boundary of allotment 10A, section 15; to the Western Moorarbool River; thence southerly by that river to the Ballaarat to Melbourne (north) road aforesaid; and thence south-easterly by that road to the commencing point.

East Riding (Reduced and Re-defined).

Commencing on the Werribee River at its confluence with the Myrniong Creek; thence by the Werribee River north-westerly to the confluence of the Korjammunnip Creek; thence northerly and westerly by the last-named creek to its source at the most northerly of the three westernmost branches; thence magnetic north to the Great Dividing Range; thence easterly, southerly, and westerly by the shire boundary to the commencing point.

Kyneton Shire (Enlarged and Re-defined).

AND ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.**

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1915*, No. 2686, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas by the *Local Government Act 1921*,

No. 3167, it is provided that when any portion of Victoria is, pursuant to the *Local Government Acts*, annexed as a new subdivision to any subdivided municipal district, the Governor in Council, if he thinks fit, may, by Order, provide for the election forthwith of councillors for such new subdivision and give all such directions therefor as are necessary or expedient: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Acts are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the shire of Werribee, with regard to a certain area therein described, notices of such petition having been duly published. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the said shire a certain area therein described, being part of the East Riding, and doth annex and constitute the portion so severed from such shire to the city of Footscray as a separate Ward, to be called the West Ward, and doth re-define the boundaries of the said shire of Werribee and its East Riding as reduced, and of the said city of Footscray as enlarged with the West Ward thereof as constituted, in the manner hereafter set forth and described, and doth appoint Thursday, the sixteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, as a day for holding an election of three councillors for such West Ward; and, furthermore, doth appoint Mr. John Gent, Town Clerk of Footscray, to prepare, make out, and sign a voters' roll for such West Ward, such roll to be prepared from the voters' roll in force in the shire of Werribee (with respect to the portion so severed) at the date of this Order, and such roll so signed shall be deemed to be the voters' roll for the West Ward of the city of Footscray. His Excellency doth by this Order further appoint the said Mr. John Gent Returning Officer for the said West Ward, by and before whom an election of three councillors shall be conducted in conformity with the provisions of the *Local Government Act*; and doth Order that a poll for the election of such councillors shall commence at the hour of Eight o'clock in the forenoon, and close at Eight o'clock in the afternoon, and that the voting-by-post provisions, as made applicable to the city of Footscray, shall apply to such election.

SHIRE OF WERRIBEE (REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria hereunder described shall be a locality in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1915:—

2. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding 12 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements shall be as follows:—
 - For admission of every adult, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.
 - For admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of rider, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.
 - For admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse or any other vehicle, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.
 - For admission of every additional horse, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Sixpence.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No society, club or picnic party or other combined body shall use the Reserve without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserve or pollute any water therein, or remove therefrom any soil, sand or manure.

6. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs or other property in the Reserve, or roll or throw any stones or other missiles therein, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserve any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management.

9. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any place therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a cord or chain, without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management; and all dogs, goats and poultry found wandering in the Reserve may be liable to be destroyed.

11. No person shall place in the Reserve any horses, cattle or sheep or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

12. No person shall engage in any game or sport or in dancing in the Reserve on Sundays.

Every person offending against the Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding six in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence, may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of the Board of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

14. No person shall sell, or offer for sale, any intoxicating liquor in the Reserve.

Every person offending against any of these regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATION No. 8.

A Regulation of the City of Caulfield, numbered eight, made under a By-law of the above-named city, numbered 24, which adopted certain parts and provisions of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903*, including sub-part (1), porticoes, projections, &c., and particularly under the powers provided in clause 4 of such sub-part (1) which enables the Council of the said city from time to time to make regulations for regulating the height from the ground of verandahs and, for appointing the shape, figure, dimensions, and materials of such verandahs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and by the said By-law No. 24, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Caulfield make the following Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district:—

1. Regulation No. 2 made under By-law No. 7 for regulating the height from the ground of porticoes and for appointing the shape figure dimensions and materials of porticoes is hereby repealed.

2. No person shall erect or construct any verandah over the footway of any street other than of the cantilever type and not less than ten feet in height or more than twelve feet in height measured from the pavement to the under side of the cantilever girder at the building line. The building surveyor shall stipulate the height at which the verandah shall be erected.

3. The fascia of every such verandah shall finish flush with the kerb line in all cases. The cantilever and fascia girders shall not exceed eight inches nor be less than seven inches in depth for all verandahs twelve feet or under in width. The face girder shall be carried along the several frontages in true horizontal line, the lowest point being at a minimum height of eleven feet above the kerbing and be carried along in that manner until the maximum height of thirteen feet is reached when the line shall be discontinued and shall recommence at the minimum.

4. The building surveyor may in special cases to be determined by him grant permission in writing or direct that the roof of any such verandah shall slope outwards from the building at such pitch as is stipulated in such permission or direction but in all other cases the roof of the verandah shall slope inwards towards the building and have a pitch of one-half of one inch per foot of width. All verandahs to which this regulation applies shall be covered with not less than No. 26 gauge galvanized corrugated iron secured to purlins with galvanized iron bolts or clips and washers at the top of the corrugations. The iron shall be lapped two corrugations at the sides and not less than nine inches at the ends of the sheets and shall be riveted every twelve inches at sides and every third corrugation at the ends. Purlins may be of either wood, tee or angle iron. If wooden purlins are used verandahs must be ceiled with metal or other fire-resisting material and a metal fascia provided. In the case of verandahs sloping inwards towards the building, box gutters shall be formed at or near the building line and shall be made out of not less than No. 24 gauge galvanized sheet iron well lapped riveted and double soldered at every joint and be supported on metal straps. Where permission or direction has been given for the verandah to slope outwards from the building no box gutters will be necessary but spouting of at least No. 24 gauge galvanized iron must be provided and be firmly secured to the fascia of the verandah and circular galvanized iron pipes of at least No. 24 gauge and of sufficient number and capacity must be provided and properly fixed to convey the water from the spouting and to discharge it into the down pipes at the building line.

5. Down pipes shall be of sufficient number and capacity to efficiently discharge all water falling on or running from or off the verandah roof. Down pipes shall be of wrought or cast iron chased into walls or piers to a height of not less than eight feet six inches above the pavement and shall discharge by a wrought-iron pipe or pipes under footway into street channels.

6. Sky-lights glazed with wired rolled plate-glass in single lengths and set in approved glazing bars may be provided in verandahs.

7. Metal ceilings shall be fixed to jarrah or red pine furring pieces.

The whole of the work shall be executed in accordance with this Regulation and subject to the satisfaction and approval of the building surveyor.

For every sheep, lamb, or goat—2d.

For carcasses or meat derived from animals reared and slaughtered by any person on his own premises and accommodated at the public abattoirs or other appointed place—

For every carcass or piece of meat—1s.

2. By-law No. 83, entitled "A By-law to amend By-law No. 70 and to repeal By-law No. 76," shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
