AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR THE
SELECTION OF SKILLED MEMBERS.

UNDER the power in that behalf vested in it, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of the said State, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. Class 4 of clause 3 of "The Regulations for the Selection of Skilled Members, 1922," made by the Board on the twenty-third day of February, 1922, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the eighth day of March, 1922, shall be and the same is hereby amended by the addition at the end thereof of the following words, namely:—

"Any person who has held a licence as a Port Phillip pilot and has voluntarily retired from active service shall be deemed to be a 'Port Phillip pilot' within the meaning of this Regulation."

2. This Regulation shall take effect on and from the date of the passing thereof.

The foregoing amending Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this seventeenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 25th November, 1912, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.
- (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]
(Signed) _____ A.B.

(Date.) _____

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-

course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(e), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the

other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 ls.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1915*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS DISTRICT.—NAME CHANGED TO
MORNINGTON PENINSULA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

That for the words "That the name of the Waterworks District of the one-time Dandenong Waterworks Trust shall be Dandenong Waterworks District," in the Order of the Governor in Council bearing date the 10th day of February, 1920, there shall be substituted the words "That the name of the Waterworks District of the one-time Dandenong Waterworks Trust shall be Mornington Peninsula Waterworks District."

And as on and from the 1st day of July, 1922, the said Order of the Governor in Council shall be deemed to be so amended.

OF WARRACKNABEAL KNOWN AS THE "ANZAC MEMORIAL
PARK."

WE, John Robert Taylor, Ernest Chatsworth Stevens, Joseph Louis Disciacati, Garnet Stanley Down, Frederick Charles Newman, Andrew Taylor, William Joseph Smith, Ernest Joseph Miller Devereux, Henry Brown, Louis Oswald Schulz, William Powell, and Straum Wright-Smith, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the township of Warracknabeal known as the "Anzac Memorial Park," having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding fifty (50) in one year as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, sports, or shows, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings (2s.) may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, and no society, club, picnic party or other combined body shall be allowed to use the Reserve without the written consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.

3. No persons shall climb or jump over the fences, or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the fences or buildings, gates or other property in or around the Reserve, or leave or roll stones therein, or pollute any water in the Reserve, or remove therefrom any sand, soil or manure.

4. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Reserve, or throw any stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing or any litter.

5. No person shall erect any booth or other structure in the Reserve, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description without having first obtained the written permission of the Committee of Management, and no person shall light any fires in the Reserve without the special permission in writing of the Committee of Management.

6. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or young trees or shrubs.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog for coursing or other purposes, or on days on which *fêtes*, sports or shows are held; and all dogs so brought in and all goats and poultry found therein may be liable to be destroyed.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, on conviction before a justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or a member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty (20) in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, *fêtes*, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall light fires therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and a charge of Ten pounds per centum will be made by the Committee of Management on the gate receipts received therefrom.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any *fêtes*, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

CITY OF ESSENDON.

BY-LAW No. 45.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 45, for—

- Prescribing the minimum area, and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house may hereafter be erected.
- Providing that every dwelling-house hereafter erected shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof a prescribed area of open land.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon (hereinafter called "the Council") order as follows:—

Introductory.

- This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
- All Government buildings shall be exempted from the provisions of this By-law.

PART 1.

Subdivision of Land.

- For the purpose of this By-law, the excision or transfer of one or more pieces of land from an existing title to land shall be deemed a subdivision.
- Before any subdivision is effected or registered, a copy of the plan of subdivision, together with two tracings or copies thereof, shall be submitted to the Council for approval, accompanied by an application in the form prescribed under the 23rd Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1915*, and enclosing such fee as the Council may direct.
- In any subdivision of land the minimum size of any allotment shall be 5,000 square feet, and the minimum frontage of any allotment shall be 50 feet, and the minimum depth of any allotment shall be 100 feet; and that except in the case of corner sites the buildings erected thereon shall cover not more than one-third of the area, and on the corner sites with frontages to two streets or roads, not more than half of the area.
- There shall be provided in connexion with every dwelling-house an open space at rear of same and exclusively belonging to such dwelling of an aggregate extent of not less than 500 square feet free of any erection above the level of the adjoining pavement.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding clause, where in any new subdivision of land it is, in the opinion of the Council, impracticable to give a minimum frontage of 50 feet to any of the allotments, owing to the shape of the original block, the Council shall have power to determine the frontages of such allotments in the subdivision to which these conditions apply, provided always that the frontages so fixed shall not reduce the area of the allotment concerned below the minimum of 5,000 square feet.
- Notwithstanding anything herein contained, it shall be permissible to excise or transfer portions of land which have a less superficial area than 5,000 square feet for each or any of the following purposes:—

- Creation of easements for drainage, light, or traffic.
- Adjustment of existing boundaries of occupation.
- Transfers of land to adjoining owners for the purpose of increasing the superficial area of existing allotments, provided such transfers do not reduce the allotment from which the transfer is being made to a less area than 5,000 square feet.

All dealings with land which come under the provisions of this clause shall be submitted to and approved by the Council before they are registered.

PART 2.

Erection of Buildings.

- Upon any allotment of land which complies with the provisions as regards minimum area, depth, and frontage, it shall be permissible to erect only one dwelling.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in Building By-law 38 or By-law No. 40 of the city of Essendon, every dwelling-house hereafter erected (other than a dwelling attached to a shop) shall have on all sides thereof an open space in accord-

ance with the requirements of Building By-law No. 38 of the city of Essendon; save and except that a building may be erected with one wall upon the boundary in accordance with the provisions of By-law No. 40 of the city of Essendon, if no portion of any building already erected upon the allotment immediately abutting upon the boundary aforesaid is within 5 feet of such boundary, and no dwelling-house shall be attached on any side thereof to any other dwelling-house separately occupied or intended for separate occupation.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in any of the foregoing clauses, it shall be permissible to erect business premises, shops, or factories, whether dwellings are combined with or attached to such business premises, shops, or factories or not, upon allotments of less area, frontage, or depth than provided in this By-law, provided such frontage is not less than 16 feet, but the Council shall have power to direct what area of land shall be reserved upon such allotments for the purposes of providing light and ventilation. In the case of shops combined with dwellings being erected upon land facing streets which are, in the opinion of the Council, residential streets, the Council shall have power to insist upon the minimum area of 5,000 square feet being provided, and the provisions of clause 4 of Part 1 of this By-law shall apply in the case of shops with dwellings attached thereto.

PART 3.

Allotments Subdivided Prior to Adoption of By-law.

1. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, in the case of allotments subdivided prior to the date of adoption of this By-law, where in the opinion of the Council it is impossible to comply with the provisions of the By-law, the Council shall at its discretion waive the provisions of the By-law in regard to any particular allotment, but such action on the part of the Council shall not create a precedent for any other case, nor shall the Council be bound in any way to waive the provisions of the By-law should any action be deemed inexpedient.

PART 4.

Enforcement of By-law and Penalties.

1. Where any land has been subdivided in such manner as to be in contravention of the requirements of the By-law—

- The Council may give to the owner of such land fourteen days' notice, in writing (which notice may be signed by the municipal clerk on behalf of the Council), to bring such subdivision into accord with the requirements of this By-law.
- If default is made in complying with such notice, then the Council may take such steps as are necessary to prevent the registration of any transfer in respect to such land, or the registration of any plan of subdivision.
- In addition to penalties imposed by this By-law, all costs and expenses incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of this By-law or of any steps taken by the Council in consequence of such breach shall be paid by the person committing such breach, and may be recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

2. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence. Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 26th day of June, 1922, and confirmed the 24th day of July, 1922.
