Applicants should possess a University degree, and Diploma of Education, or special equivalent qualifications in drawing and commercial subjects, and have had experience in secondary

(a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

Nore.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, he equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Norz.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a watercourse or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

- 8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.
- Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

· SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and under-ground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermina-tion of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(c) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tacheometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; ele-mentary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, com-pilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

(The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such vice voce examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

Articles of indenure or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he

No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination. tion as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913;
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to lat January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to lat January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to lat January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 ls.), the declaration as prescribed by the Land Surveyors Act 1915, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

BRIGHTON GENERAL CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Brighton General Cemetery reseind the Rules and Regulations published previously in the Government Gazette, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
- 2. Any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purposes in the Cemeterv under the above Act, shall apply to the Trustees thereof. If approved, the Trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.
- 3. Any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the Cemetery, shall apply in writing to the Trustees for permission to do so, and, at the same time, submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval. Every permission will be subject to sections 21 and 26 of the Cemeteries Act 1915, and no label is to be removed from any grave without written permission from the surveyor or other officer, and must be again replaced under their direction.
- again replaced under their direction.

 4. For the information of the Trustees, an English translation must accompany any inscription in a foreign language. No proposal to erect a tombstone or a monument in the portion of the Cemetery allotted to the Jews will be entertained by the Trustees unless the design and the inscription (if any) accompanying such design has previously received the approval, expressed in writing, of a duly qualified minister of a Jewish congregation.
- 5. Any order for interment shall be given at the office of the Trustees at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.
- 6. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule B, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
- 7. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under the direction of the surveyor or other officer, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone or iron, securely cemented.
- 8. Every grave shall be at least 7 feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.
- In the portion of the Cemetery allotted to the Jews one corpse only shall be interred in each grave of whatever character.
- 9. No interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence, that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so; except as provided for in the next rule.
- 10. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
- 11. No burial shall be permitted to take place in said Cemetery without a certificate from a registrar of deaths, coroner, or justice of the peace. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the Cemetery.
- 12. Any public grave may, on approval of the Trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees as per scale of charges.
- 13. In the case of it being desired to exhume any body, the same shall only be done on the production, at the office of the Trustees, of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and at such hours and on payment of such charges as the Trustees may determine.
- 14. In case of reinterment or removal from another cemetery or burial-ground, a verified copy of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf must be produced at the office of the Trustees, and the usual fee paid before such reinterment.
- 15. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 8 a.m. to 4.30 sp.m., except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will the from 9 to 10.30 a.m., throughout the year. No interment will be allowed on Sunday except in such cases as a medical practitioner or a magistrate certifies, in writing, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day.
- 16. No burials shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m., except by special permission of the Trustees.

- 17. The time fixed for any funeral shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the Cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
- 18. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance gates to the Cemetery, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning-coaches, shall be permitted to pass the said entrance. Breaking out of the procession after passing the said gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery.
- 19. Any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.
- 20. Any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the Cemetery without the permission of the Trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.
- 21. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No bath, caen, oamaru, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the crection of tablets or other exposed stonework.
- 22. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrances. No person shall be allowed to bring work into the Cemetery on a vehicle having wheels of less than 4 inches in width, unless by special permission.
- 23. No catacomb shall be allowed.
- 24. No wooden erection shall be allowed.
- 25. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there are liable to be destroyed.
- 26. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or any trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the Act, or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the Cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.
- 27. No person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the Cemetery.
- 28. No person, other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure, unless by special direction of the Trustees.
- 29. The surveyor or other officer so directed shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the Trustees, over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery.
- 30. Any person who shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the
- 31. No person employed under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in discharge of his duty, nor shall be be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the Trustees.
- 32. Any person employed under the Trustees accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.
- 33. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected there, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.
- 34. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- 4 p.m.

 35. In the event of a certificate of right of burial being lost or destroyed, or becoming so obliterated as to be useless, the person claiming to be entitled thereto shall supply a statutory declaration setting forth the facts upon which such claim is based, and the Trustees, upon proof to their satisfaction of such claim, may issue a fresh certificate in the place of the one so lost, destroyed, or obliterated, subject, however, to the payment of the charge provided in the scale of fees and to, such further conditions as the Trustees in their discretion may deem necessary.
- 36. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with name of deceased stamped thereon.
- 37. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in those charges and regulations.

Poisons Act 1920. DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS 1922.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of August, 1922.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Lawson Mr. Baird Mr. Angus

Mr. Merritt Mr. Pennington.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Poisons Act 1920 (11 Geo: V. No. 3113), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following, which have been recommended by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria:—

These Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1922.

CONSTRUCTION.

In the construction of these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Act" means the Poisons Act 1920.
"Board" means the Pharmacy Board of Victoria.

DEFINITIONS.

DEFINITIONS.

"Dangerous Drug."—In Part I. of these Regulations any of the substances and preparations included in paragraph 1 of the Second Schedule to the Poisons Act 1920 as are specified in the said Regulations is referred to as a "dangerous drug." "Specified Drug."—In Part II. of these Regulations any of the substances and preparations included in paragraph 2 of the Second Schedule to the said Act as are specified in these Regulations referred to as a "specified drug." "Potent Drug."—In Part III. of these Regulations any of the substances and preparations included in the Third Schedule to the said Act as are specified in these Regulations any of the substances and preparations included in the Third Schedule to the said Act as are specified in these 'Regulations is referred to as a "potent drug." "Prescription Book."—The book prescribed for the recording of prescriptions under the Pharmacy Regulations 1921.

"Poisons Book."—The book required to be kept under section 8 of the Poisons Act 1915.

"Register."—The register of dangerous drugs required to be kept under Part I. of these Regulations.

PART I.

APPLICATION.

- 1. The dangerous drugs to which Part I. of these Regulations apply are as follows:
 - as apply are as follows:—

 (a) Morphine, cocaine, ecgonine and diamorphine (commonly known as heroin) and their respective salts and medicinal opium and any preparation admixture extract or other substance containing not less than one-fifth per centum of morphine or one-tenth per centum of cocaine ecgonine or diamorphine. For the purposes of the foregoing provision the percentage in the case of morphine shall be calculated as in respect of anhydrous morphine.

 (b) Any other substance or preparation added by proclamation to section 1 of the Second Schedule to the Act.

MANUFACTURE.

- 2. No person shall manufacture any of the dangerous drugs mentioned in the next preceding Regulation—
 - (a) Unless he is licensed by the Chief Secretary on the recommendation of the Board or is authorized by the Poisons Act 1920 or any Regulations made there-under so to do.

- (b) Except on premises licensed for the purpose.
 (c) Unless such manufacture is conducted under expert supervision.
- (d) Otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

SALE POSSESSION AND DISTRIBUTION.

- 3. No person shall supply or procure or offer to supply or procure any dangerous drug to or for any person—
 - (a) Unless he is a duly qualified medical practitioner a registered dentist or person "recorded" by the Dental Board of Victoria under the provisions of the Medical Act 1915, Part II., a registered pharmaceutical chemist, a registered veterinary surgeon a person holding a certificate as general dealer in poisons under the provisions of the Poisons Act 1915, a person holding a permit under section 31 of the Poisons Act 1915, or is the holder of a licence or authority to manufacture any of the dangerous drugs referred to in Regulation 1.
 (b) Otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

SALE AND DISTRIBUTION.

4. Except where any of the dangerous drugs are lawfully dispensed in pursuance of a prescription given by a duly qualified inedical practitioner registered dentist or person "recorded" by the Dental Board of Victoria under the provisions of the Medical Act 1915, Part II., or registered veterinary surgeon in accordance with the conditions hereinafter specified—

No person shall supply or procure or offer to supply or procure any of the dangerous drugs to or for any person who is not licensed or otherwise authorized to be in possession of dangerous drugs except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence or authority. Provided that administration of any of the dangerous drugs by or under the direct personal supervision of a duly qualified medical practitioner or by or, under the direct personal supervision of a registered dentist (or person "recorded" by the Dental Board of Victoria) in dental treatment or by or under the direct personal supervision of a registered dentist (or person "recorded" by the Dental Board of Victoria) in dental treatment or by or under the direct personal supervision of a registered veterinary surgeon in the treatment of any animal shall not be deemed to be supplying the dangerous drug within the meaning of these Regulations.

Provided also that a person holding a licence as a general dealer in poisons under the Poisons Act 1915 may supply tincture of opium for veterinary purposes without a prescription provided he is satisfied that the drug is required for legitimate purposes and an entry is made in the poisons book and in the register required to be kept under these Regulations.

CONDITIONS AS & THE GIVING AND DISPENSING OF PRESCRIPTIONS.

5. Except in the case of emergency as hereinafter provided a prescription for the supply of any of the dangerous drugs must comply with the following conditions:—

(a) The prescription must be in writing, must be dated and signed by the medical practitioner, registered dentist, person "recorded" by the Dental Board of Victoria, or registered veterinary surgeon (as the case may be), and must specify the name of the person for whom the prescription is given.
(b) A prescription shall only be given by a registered dentist or person "recorded" by the Dental Board of Victoria for the purposes of dental treatment and shall be marked "for local dental treatment."
(c) A prescription shall only be given by a registered veterinary surgeon for the purposes of treatment of animals and shall be marked "for animal treatment."

animals and shall be marked "for animal treetment only."

(d) No prescription shall be given for the supply of any dangerous drug otherwise than in accordance with the foregoing conditions.

(e) A medical practitioner dentist or veterinary surgeon who dispenses any medicines to which these Regulations apply shall enter particulars thereof in the register hereinafter specified.

(f) Every medical practitioner who writes a prescription containing any dangerous drug shall write on such prescription the maximum number of times such prescription shall be dispensed.

(g) In an emergency case where a prescription is issued

prescription shall be dispensed.

(g) In an emergency case where a prescription is issued orally or by telephone to any pharmaceutical chemist such prescription shall be forthwith reduced to writing and despatched without delay to the person dispensing the same by the person issuing it.

(h) The use of a rubber stamp in lieu of the written signature on a prescription for dangerous drugs is hereby prohibited.

6. The following conditions shall be observed by persons dis-

(a) A dangerous drug shall not be supplied more than once on the same prescription. Provided that if the prescription so directs the dangerous drug may be supplied on more than one but not exceeding four occasions as directed in the prescription.
(b) The prescription shall be stamped marked or inscribed in writing with the date on which it is dispensed with the name and address of the person who diamonas it.

(c) The person who dispenses the prescription for the last occasion as determined by the maximum mentioned in Regulation 6 (a) shall, in addition to the requirements mentioned in Regulation 6 (b) also write stamp mark or inscribe in durable and legible letters across the prescription the word "cancelled."

(d) No person shall dispense any prescription containing any dangerous drug within the scope of those Regulations if he has any reason to believe that the prescription is not genuine.

- 7. Every person who supplies any dangerous drug shall comply with the following provisions :— $\,$
- (a) He shall enter or cause to be entered in a register kept
 for the sole purpose all supplies of the dangerous
 drugs purchased or otherwise obtained by him.
 (b) The register may be kept in the form of Schedule 1.
 or in any simple form of debit and credit entry.

(c) The entries shall be made in the register on the day on which the dangerous drugs are received or disposed of; or when that is not necessarily convenient on the day immediately following.

(d) Where business is carried on at more than one set of premises a separate register shall be kept in respect of each set of premises.

(e) In the case of wholesale druggists the ordinary stock and sales records required to be kept by them under the provisions of the Customs Regulations shall be deemed to be a sufficient record for the purposes of these Regulations.

(f) The register shall be kept in some part of the premises to which it relates so that it shall at all times to available for inspection in accordance with the provisions of the Poisons Acts.

(g) No entry which is untrue in any particular shall be made in the register; no entry shall be obliterated or cancelled or altered. Any mistake in an entry may be corrected by a marginal note or footnote giving the correct particulars and dated.

(h) For the purpose of seeing that the provisions of these Regulations are observed all information in regard to any purchases made and all stocks held and all transactions effected by such person of any of the dangerous drugs shall be furnished on application to any person specifically authorized in writing by the Board to obtain the same.

the Board to obtain the same.

8. A duly qualified medical practitioner or registered veterinary surgeon who records in a day book particulars of any of the dangerous drugs supplied by him to any patient together with the name and address of the patient and date of the supply may (in lieu of keeping the register required by the preceding Regulation) enter separately in a book to be kept tor the purpose references under the appropriate dates to the records in the day book of any supply of the dangerous drug.

9. A registered pharmacoutical chemist may in lieu of keeping the register in the form required by Regulation 7 enter separately in the register particulars identifying such entry with the corresponding entry in the "poisons book" or "prescription book "kept by him provided that the entries made in the prescription book are in the proper sequence and contain the name of the person for whom the prescription was issued the date on which the medicine was dispensed the number of the prescription, and such other requirements as are prescribed by Regulations made under the Pharmaceutical Chemists Act 1920.

SALE MANUFACTURE OR POSSESSION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS.

10. No person shall manufacture sell or possess any dangerous drug except such manufacture sale or possession (as the case may be) be sanctioned by law statutory or otherwise unless these Regulations so permit or he hold a licence or authority under the same.

GENERAL AUTHORIZATION.

- 11. Any person lawfully keeping open shop as a pharmaceutical chemist is hereby authorized-
 - (a) To manufacture at the shop in the ordinary course of retail business any preparation admixture or extract of any of the dangerous drugs.
 - (b) To carry on at the shop the business of retailing dispensing or compounding any of the dangerous drugs but subject always to the provisions of these Regulations.

gulations.

The supply by a registered pharmaceutical chemist keeping open/shop to a medical practitioner, registered dentist, person "recorded" by the Dental Board, registered veterinary surgeon, registered midwife, or any of the persons and institutions mentioned in the next following Regulation shall be deemed to be within the scope of this authority but subject always to the provisions of these Regulations.

12. Any duly qualified medical practitioner or any registered pharmaceutical chemist employed or engaged in dispensing medicines at any public hospital or other public institution or any-registered dentist or person "recorded" by the Dental Board of Victoria or any registered veterinary surgeon or certificated nurse, or registered midwife or any person in charge of a laboratory for purposes of research or instruction attached to any university college public hospital or other institution approved by the Board for the purpose or any person appointed by the Health Commission as a public analyst or nurse employed by the Victorian Bush Nursing Association is (until such authority is withdrawn as is hereinafter provided hereby authorized so far only as is necessary for the practice of his or her profession or employment in such capacity to be in possession of any of the dangerous drugs subject to the provisions and limitations of these Regulations.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

13. In the event of any person (authorized by Regulation 12) being convicted of an offence against the Act or Regulations the Chief Secretary may on the recommendation of the Board withdraw the authority conferred by these Regulations to be in possession of any dangerous drug.

APPLICATIONS FOR LICENCES AND AUTHORITIES.

14. The following rules shall apply to licences to manufacture any dangerous drug, namely :-

- (a) Any person desirous of obtaining a licence to manufacture any dangerous drug shall apply in writing to the Chief Secretary in the form or to the effect of the
- Third Schedule to these Regulations.

 (b) The application in the first place shall be sent with the prescribed fee to the Board for its recommendation. The Board shall then consider the application and if it thinks fit it may recommend the Chief Secretary to issue it either with or without conditions.

tions.

(c) A licence shall be in the form or to the effect of the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations.

(d) A licensee desirous of obtaining a renewal of his license shall apply in writing to the Board, with the prescribed fee. The Board on being satisfied that the licensee is a fit and proper person to continue to hold such licence may recommend the Chief Secretary to renew it.

(e) The prescribed fee is hereby fixed at the sum of One pound.

pound.

15. In the event of any person authorized by these Regulations or by any licence granted by the Chief Secretary to manufacture supply or be in possession of dangerous drugs or any of them being convicted of any offence against the Act or Regulations or of an offence under the enactments relating to Customs as applied to the importation of dangerous drugs the Chief Secretary may on the recommendation of the Board by notice in the Gazette withdraw the licence or authority in respect of such person if in his opinion such person cannot properly be allowed to manufacture supply or be in possession of the dangerous drugs or any of them.

DELIVERY TO MESSENGERS.

16. No person shall deliver any dangerous drug to any one not licensed or otherwise authorized to be in possession thereof who purports to be sent by a licensed or authorized person unless he produces an authority in writing signed by the licensed or authorized person to receive the dangerous drug on his behalf and unless the person supplying the dangerous drug has no reason to believe that the authority is not genuine. This Regulation shall not be deemed to apply to medicines dispensed in pursuance of the foregoing Regulations, or to wholesalers in the ordinary course of wholesale dealing.

NON-APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS.

Non-application of Regulations.

17. The foregong Regulations shall not apply to preparations containing less than one-fifth per cent. (one part in five hundred) of morphine or one-tenth per cent. (one part in a thousand) of cocaine, eegonine or diamorphine nor to prescriptions which when dispensed result in the finished product containing not more than one-fifth per cent. (one part in five hundred) of morphine or not more than one-tenth per cent. (one part in a thousand) of cocaine ecgonine or diamorphine nor to the substances and preparations included in-the Second Schedule to these Regulations and Part II. of the Second Schedule to the Poisons Act 1920.

PART II.

Regulations governing the sale and supply of specified drugs, namely: chloral hydrate, ergot, paraldehyde, diethyl-barbituric acid, sulphonal and its homologues and any salt compound or derivative of such substances.

18. No person shall sell or dispense any of the following specified drugs:—

Diethyl-barbituric acid (whether described as veronal, proponal, medinal, or by any other trade name, or designation).

Sulphonal and its homologues (whether described as trional, tetronal, or by any other name mark or designation).

tion), and any salt compound or derivative of such specified drug or any admixture containing any of the foregoing specified drugs, or any other substance or preparation added by proclamation to paragraph 2 of the Second Schedule to the Poisons Act 1920 except upon the written prescription of a registered medical practitioner or registered veterinary surgeon. Such prescription shall contain the date when written the name of the person for whom or the purpose for which prescribed and the signature in full of the said medical practitioner or veterinary surgeon. When dispensed the prescription shall be entered forthwith in the prescription book and the person dispensing it shall comply with the requirements of the Pharmaceutical Chemists Act 1920 and Regulations made thereunder so far as they apply to the recording of prescriptions.

19. Provided that so far as these Regulations are concerned the foregoing restriction shall not apply to the sale by an authorized person to a duly qualified medical practitioner a registered veterinary surgeon or a registered pharmaceutical chemist or to any scientific or public institution or public

hospital or to any Government Department on the signed written order of the superintendent or nurse in immediate charge of any such institution hospital or Department or to a nurse employed by the Victorian Bush Nursing Association who furnishes a written order signed by a medical officer of the Association nor to a wholesale druggist licensed under this Act selling or supplying to persons authorized to sell or supply any of the specified drugs.

20: Every medical practitioner or veterinary surgeon who writes a prescription containing any specified drug shall write on such prescription the maximum number of times such prescription shall be dispensed.

21. (1) No person shall dispense any prescription containing any specified drug—(a) unless such prescription bears the signature of the medical practitioner or veterinary surgeon by whom it purports to be given, and (b) he has no reason to suppose that the prescription is not genuine.

(2) Such prescription shall not be dispensed more than twice unless the prescription so directs.

(3) The prescription shall be marked stamped or legibly inscribed with the name of the chemist dispensing it and the date on which it is dispensed.

(4) The person who dispenses the prescription for the last occasion as determined by the maximum in Regulation 21 (2), shall, in addition to the requirements mentioned in Regulation 21 (3) also stamp, mark; or inscribe in durable and legible letters across the prescription the word "cancelled."

PART III.

Regulations governing the supply and sale of "potent drugs," namely

Acetanilide,

Adrenals (extracts and preparations of),

Oil of tansy, ract, Pituitary extract, Any serum or vaccine for human use, Thyroid gland (preparations of),

22. In the sale by retail of any "potent drug" every pharmaceutical chemist or person holding a certificate as a dealer in poisons under the provisions of Division 1 of Part I. of the Poisons Act 1915 or other person shall attach to the label on the bottle box cover wrapper immediately containing any potent drug the following direction, namely:—"This preparation is a "potent drug" and care must be exercised in using it."

PART IV.

GENERAL.

23. Any dangerous drug or specified drug or potent drug in the order or disposition of any person shall be deemed to be in his possession.

- 24. These Regulations shall not apply to the preparations named in Schedule 2 of these Regulations, nor to any dangerous drug or specified drug when denatured in a manner recommended by the Board and approved by the Governor in
- -25. These Regulations shall come into force on the first day of January, 1923.

No person shall erect any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor without a like permission shall any person hawk, offer for sale or sell any article in the Reserve.

7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs or plants.

8. No person shall enter any enclosure set apart for any purpose within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall wilfully obstruct the portions set apart and used as fairways within the Reserve.

10. No person shall wilfully obstruct the portions set apart and used as fairways within the Reserve any dog unless led on a chain or a cord.

11. All dogs except as provided in Regulation No. 10, and all goats, pigs and poultry found on the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

12. No person shall take part in any assembly in the Reserve nor in any fête, picnic, concert or public function therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No person shall bet in the Reserve or in any part thereof and any person found betting in the Reserve shall be liable to expulsion therefrom.

14. No person shall remove from the Reserve any flowers, shrubs or other material without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor shall any soil be removed from the Reserve.

15. No person shall deriven or led into or pass through or over the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No person shall carry any firearms in or through the Reserve or shoot therein.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

No person shall interfere with remove damage or destroy the seats trees shrubs grass flowers statuary fountains or any property in any Tree Reserve or throw stones or other missiles or light fires therein or leave in any Tree Reserve any bottles fruit-peel paper cast-off clothing litter or refuse of any kind.

3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around any Tree Reserve or stick bills on the fences gates seats trees posts or other structures or cut names letters or marks on the trees seats gates posts or fences or other structures or other structures or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

4. No person shall bring into any Tree Reserve any dog unless held by a chain or cord.

5. No person except workmen employed in a Tree Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation or for other purposes to the exclusion of the public.

6. No assemblies for fêtes picnics or concerts or for the purpose of public worship preaching or public speaking of any kind or meetings of a like character shall take place in any Tree Reserve without the permission in writing of the Council first had and obtained.

7. No person unless authorized by the Council in writing shall offer or expose for sale in any Tree Reserve any article fruit or merchandise.

8. No person shall bring or allow to remain in any Tree Reserve any horses cattle sheep pigs goats fowls geese or other animals and any such found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

9. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry noise or disturbance or play upon any musical or noisy instrument or sing in any Tree Reserve.

10. No person shall preach or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in any Tree Reserve without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

11. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills placards notices advertisements books pamphlets or papers in any Tree Reserve or shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills placards notices advertisements books pamphlets or papers.

12. No person shall play at or engage in any game athletic sport or gymnastic exercises in any Tree Reserve.

13. No person shall in any Tree Reserve wilfully obstruct disturb interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any officer or other servant of the Council.

14. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any structure or erection within any Tree Reserve.

15. No booth tent or other structure shall be erected within any Tree Reserve without the consent in writing of the Council.

16. No person shall drive or propel or cause to be driven or propelled any cart motor-car motor-cycle bicycle, or other vehicle or machine in through or across any 'Tree Reserve except at the points and by the roads and paths especially provided for the purpose.

17. No person shall park or leave in any Tree Reserve any cart motor-car motor-bicycle bicycle or other vehicle or machine whether there is any person in attendance with such cart motor-car motor-bicycle or other vehicle or machine or not.

18. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall for each offence be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
