PROCLAMATION

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Two million two hundred and forty-six thousand one hundred and seventy-four pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three.”

Applicants should possess a University degree, and Diploma of Education, or special equivalent qualifications in drawing and commercial subjects, and have had experience in secondary teaching, and should furnish evidence of qualifications for teaching one or more of the following groups of subjects, stating the standard to which they are prepared to teach any particular subjects:—

- (a) English, history;
- (b) Latin, French, German;
- (c) Arithmetic, algebra, geometry, trigonometry, mathematics;
- (d) Elementary science, physics, chemistry, geography, geology;
- (e) Drawing;
- (f) Commercial principles and practice, shorthand.

Applicants for positions of Senior Masters or Senior Mistresses should be graduates with proved successful experience in secondary teaching, and be capable of teaching a group of subjects, for example, modern languages, English and history,

mathematics, physics and chemistry, up to the standard of the School Leaving (Honours) examination. Assistants in charge of departments will be required to organize courses of study in the groups of subjects mentioned above, and, under the Head Master, they will be required to direct the teaching and examination of their special subjects throughout the school. All assistant teachers, in addition to the teaching of their forms, will be required to undertake such extra-school duties (even outside the ordinary hours of teaching), for example, in connexion with games, boards of studies, and the like, as may be assigned by the Head Master. Where school hostels are established, assistant teachers may be required to undertake residential duties connected with the studies and conduct of the boarders at such institutions.

In the case of the University High School, no applicant will be appointed who has not had at least two years' experience subsequent to training.

HENLEY-ON-YARRA.

Notice to Boatmen, Etc.

[No. 1 of 1922.]

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association, in connexion with the Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley Course on the Upper Yarra on the 28th October, 1922, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations, viz.:-

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) are allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers.

No boat deemed by the Port Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No boat will be permitted to show any advertisement or objectionable device.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boat, except such as have permission of the Port Officer or his Deputy.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the Port Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

No motor or other boats will be allowed to ply for hire between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road Bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and midnight on Henley Day.

All motor boats shall be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m., and shall remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

Applicant for permit must apply at the office of the Port Officer, Electricity Commissioners' Building, corner of Flinders-lane and William-street, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 35 feet from stem to stern, or with a beam exceeding 9 feet overall, unless the Port Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats shall be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid fuel.

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations, whether general or special.

A limited number of moorings will be available along Henley Reserve, and early application to the Port Officer for same is invited. Applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, and must moor at post bearing same number as shown on permit.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light, and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 8 feet.

The use of paddles as a means of propulsion for rowing boats is preferred.

Boats over 25 feet in length or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections, will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Rowing boats and canoes shall exhibit a white light after sunset on Henley Day.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

The Marine Act 1915.

GENERAL RULES FOR FORMAL INVESTIGATIONS
BY THE COURT OF MARINE INQUIRY.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the
twelfth day of September, 1922.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Lawson	Mr. Clarke

WHEREAS by section 185 of The *Marine Act 1915* it is provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, and when made may revoke, alter, and add to, general Rules to carry into effect the provisions of the said Act with respect to the Court of Marine Inquiry, and in particular with respect to the summoning of and procedure before the Court, the amount and application of fees, and the publication of such Rules. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Rules, that is to say:—

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Court of Marine Inquiry Rules 1922." Short title.

2. These Rules shall come into operation on and after the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*, on which date the Court of Marine Inquiry Rules 1890 shall be repealed, save as to any formal investigation which has been commenced thereunder. Commencement. Repeal.

3. In these Rules

"President of the Board" shall include the Vice-President of the Board acting as president during his absence or temporary incapacity. Interpretation.

"Secretary to the Marine Board" shall include any officer for the time being duly authorized to act in that capacity.

"Clerk of the Court of Marine Inquiry" shall include any person from time to time deputed by the said Clerk, with the approval of the Minister for the time being administering the *Marine Act 1915*, to act as the deputy of the said Clerk.

"Exempt Master" shall mean a master holding an exemption certificate within the meaning of the *Marine Act 1915*.

4. These Rules shall be published by the Government Printer, and a copy thereof shall be kept at the office of the Marine Board, and any persons desiring to peruse the same shall be entitled so to do without charge. Publication of Rules.

5. A copy of these Rules shall be supplied by the Clerk of the Court of Marine Inquiry to any person applying for the same on payment of the sum of One shilling. Sale of Rules.

6. Whenever the Court of Marine Inquiry is to be constituted for the purpose of holding a formal investigation, the President of the Board shall appoint some convenient time and place for the holding of such Court, and shall give reasonable notice thereof to such police magistrate as may be available to attend such Court, and the said President shall also, when requiring (by notice in writing under his hand) the skilled members proper and next in order for duty at such Court to attend for the purpose of such investigation, give notice to them of the time and place appointed for the holding of the Court. Summoning of Court

The said President shall also cause public notice of the time and place at which such Court is to be holden to be given by advertisement in one or more public newspapers at least two clear days before the holding of the same.

Constitution of Court where scientific question involved.

7. Where any formal investigation involves or appears likely to involve some scientific question relating to the conduct of navigation or the build or management of ships, one of the members of the Court of Marine Inquiry constituted for the purpose of holding such investigation shall be a person of such special skill as would qualify him to investigate such scientific question, if there be any one on the list of skilled members of the Court of Marine Inquiry who appears from such list to possess such special skill, and who is not disqualified.

Constitution of Court where master or mate of sailing ship charged.

8. On every formal investigation into a charge against a certificated master or a certificated mate of a sailing ship, one at least of the members of the Court of Marine Inquiry constituted for the purpose of holding such investigation shall be a master mariner, possessing a certificate of competency as such, who has served five years as a master in the merchant service in command of a ship since the granting of such certificate, during one year of which service, at least, he must have been in command of a sailing ship.

Constitution of Court where master or mate of steam-ship charged.

9. On every formal investigation into a charge against a certificated master or a certificated mate of a steam-ship, one at least of the members of the Court of Marine Inquiry constituted for the purpose of holding such investigation shall be a master mariner, possessing a certificate of competency as such, who has served five years as master in the merchant service in command of a ship since the granting of such certificate, during two years at least of which service he must have been in command of a steam-ship.

Constitution of Court where engineer charged.

10. On every investigation into a charge against a certificated engineer, two at least of the members of the Court of Marine Inquiry constituted for the purpose of holding such investigation shall be engineers each of whom has served five years as an engineer in the merchant service, and who at the time of his selection by the Board as eligible for appointment as a skilled member of the Court holds a first-class certificate of competency.

Constitution of Court where pilot or exempt master charged.

11. On every formal investigation into a charge against a Port Phillip pilot or an exempt master, two at least of the members of the Court of Marine Inquiry constituted for the purpose of holding such investigation shall be persons each of whom is, at the time of his selection by the Board as eligible for appointment as a skilled member of the Court, either a Port Phillip pilot or a person who has voluntarily retired from that position or a master holding a certificate as exempt master.

FORMAL INVESTIGATIONS INTO CASUALTIES.

Formal investigations into casualties.

12. Whenever the matter of a casualty (that is to say the loss, abandonment, collision, or grounding of any ship, or any accident, injury by fire, or damage to any ship) has been referred by the Marine Board to the Court of Marine Inquiry, the said Court shall sit at such time and place as may be duly appointed for the purpose of holding a formal investigation into such casualty.

Notice of investigation. First Schedule.

13. A notice or notices of investigation into a casualty in the form or to the effect of the First Schedule hereto may be obtained from the Clerk of the Court of Marine Inquiry by any person having a general or special authority from the said Board in that behalf in writing under the seal of the said Board, or by any officer of the Board. All such notices shall be sealed with the seal of the said Court, and may be served upon the person or persons to whom they are respectively addressed. Such notices of investigation may be addressed to the owner or owners, the master and certificated officers of the ship in respect of which the formal investigation is to be held, as well as to any other person whomsoever who may appear to have in any way contributed to the casualty the subject of such investigation. A copy of every such notice shall be retained by the said Clerk.

14. On any formal investigation into a casualty, ^{Parties.} the Marine Board and any certificated officer upon whom a notice of investigation into a casualty has been served shall be deemed to be parties to the proceedings.

Any other person upon whom a notice of investigation into a casualty has been served, and any person who shows to the satisfaction of the Court that he has an interest in the investigation, shall have a right to appear at any time during the investigation, and shall, if he appear, become a party to the proceedings.

Any other person may by permission of the President of the Court of Marine Inquiry appear, and shall thereupon become a party to the proceedings upon any formal investigation into a casualty.

FORMAL INVESTIGATIONS INTO CHARGES AGAINST INDIVIDUALS.

15. Whenever a charge against a certificated master, ^{Formal investigations into charges of incompetency or misconduct.} or certificated mate, or certificated engineer of a British ship, or pilot or exempt master has been preferred by the Marine Board, or by its direction or with its permission, signified under the seal of the Board, before the Court of Marine Inquiry, the said Court shall sit at such time and place as may be duly appointed for the purpose of holding a formal investigation into such charge; but if it appear on the sitting of the said Court that the person charged has (having regard to the place where he was when last heard of, or where he is then reasonably supposed to be) not received such notice of the charge as to enable him to appear personally, or by representative, and answer such charge, such Court shall adjourn to such subsequent day as to it may seem fit.

16. A notice of any such charge in the form or to the effect of the Second Schedule hereto may be obtained ^{How charge to be preferred. Second Schedule.} from the Clerk of the Court of Marine Inquiry by any person having a general or special authority from the said Board in writing under the seal of the said Board, or by any officer of the Board. Every such notice shall be sealed with the seal of the said Court, and such charge shall be preferred by serving such notice upon the person charged therein. A copy of every such notice shall be retained by the said Clerk.

17. Every such notice shall be served by either delivering the same personally to the person charged therein, or by leaving the same at his last known place of abode or business, or by delivering the same on board any ship to which he belongs, accompanied with a statement of the purport thereof, to the person in command or charge or appearing to be in command or charge of such ship, or by forwarding the same by registered letter through the post to the person charged thereby, addressed to his last-known place of abode or business. If such person be absent from the State, or if he cannot be found, the Clerk of the said Court may, if he think fit, after such notice has been duly served as aforesaid, place a copy thereof in an envelope addressed to him, and send it and a notification of its contents to any owners or agents resident in Victoria of the ship to which he belongs, with a request that it may be forwarded to him under cover; or if such owners or agents cannot be found, may advertise such notice in the *Government Gazette* and any daily newspaper published in Victoria. ^{Service of notice of charge.}

18. Together with every such notice, when so served as aforesaid, there shall be forwarded to the person charged a copy of the report, or of the preliminary inquiry, or of a statement of the case upon which the formal investigation into such charge has been ordered. ^{Copy of report, &c., upon which charge is ordered to be supplied.}

19. On any formal investigation into any charge ^{Parties.} against any such person as aforesaid the party charged and the Marine Board shall be deemed to be parties to the proceedings.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

20. A party to any proceedings on any formal investigation may give to any other party notice in writing to produce any documents (saving all just exceptions) relating to the matters in difference between them, and ^{Notice to produce.}

which are in the possession or under the control of such other party, and if the notice is not complied with, secondary evidence of the contents of the documents may be given by the party who gave the notice.

Notice to admit. 21. A party to any proceedings on any formal investigation may give to any other party notice in writing to admit any documents (saving all just exceptions); and in case of neglect or refusal to admit after such notice, the party so neglecting or refusing shall be liable for all the costs of proving the documents, whatever may be the result, unless the Court of Marine Inquiry is of opinion that the refusal to admit was reasonable; and no costs of proving any document shall be allowed unless such notice be given, except where the omission to give the notice has, in the opinion of the officer by whom the costs are taxed, been a saving of expense.

Witnesses.
Third Schedule. 22. The Clerk of the Court of Marine Inquiry may issue summonses according to the form in the Third Schedule hereto for the attendance of such witnesses as any of the parties to the proceedings may desire should be summoned.

Affidavits. 23. Affidavits may, by permission of the President of the Court, be used as evidence at the hearing, when sworn to in any of the following ways:—

In Victoria, before a judge of any court of law, or before a police magistrate, or a justice of the peace for the place where it is sworn or made, or before a commissioner of the Supreme Court for taking affidavits.

In any other place in the British dominions, before any court, judge, or justice of the peace, or any person authorized to administer oaths in any court in that place, or before a commissioner of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria for taking affidavits, or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits.

In any place out of the British dominions, before a British minister, consul, or vice-consul, or notary public, or before a judge or magistrate, whose signature is authenticated by the official seal of the court to which such judge or magistrate is attached.

Proceedings in Court. 24. At the time and place appointed for holding the investigation, the Court of Marine Inquiry may (subject as hereinbefore provided in the case of a formal investigation into a charge against a certificated master, a certificated mate, or certificated engineer or pilot, or exempt master) proceed to hear and adjudicate upon the case, whether the parties upon whom a notice of investigation or of any such charge has been served, or any of them, are present or not.

Board to first produce witnesses. 25. The representative of the Marine Board on any formal investigation shall first produce any witnesses, whether they were or were not on board the ship at the time of the occurrence respecting which such investigation is held, whom he may wish to examine, and who can give material evidence in the matter. The other parties to such investigation shall then in such order as amongst themselves as the Court may direct call their witnesses.

Cross-examination. 26. The witnesses shall be cross-examined by the parties in such order as the President of the Court of Marine Inquiry may direct, and may then be re-examined.

Points on which decision is required. 27. When the whole of the evidence is concluded, the representative of the Marine Board may state upon what questions (if any) in reference to the causes of the casualty or other occurrence (the subject-matter of the investigation) and to the conduct of any persons connected therewith the opinion of the Court of Marine Inquiry is desired; such questions shall be put to the said Court in open court. When such questions have been put, or if the representative of the Board does not intend to put any such questions, the parties, other than the Marine Board, shall be heard in such order as the

President of the Court of Marine Inquiry may direct, ^{Summons up.} and in all investigations the representative of the Marine Board shall be heard in reply.

28. When the taking of evidence upon any formal ^{Decision of Court.} investigation has been concluded, and the various parties or their representatives have been heard by the Court of Marine Inquiry, or have been given an opportunity of addressing the said Court, the said Court shall give its opinion in answer to the questions, if any, put to it by the representative of the Marine Board, and shall give its decision upon the matter of the casualty or on the charge (as the case may be); and in the case of an investigation into a casualty shall state whether any person or persons; and, if so, what person or persons appear to it to be to blame, and shall state what in its opinion caused the said casualty; and in the case of an investigation into a charge against a certificated master, mate, or engineer, shall decide whether the certificated master, certificated mate, or certificated engineer of any British ship so charged be guilty of any gross act of reckless or careless navigation, or of any gross act of drunkenness, or tyranny, or of any other gross act of misconduct whatsoever, or be incompetent, or have occasioned by his wrongful act or default the loss, abandonment of, or serious damage to any ship, or any loss of life; and in the case of an investigation into any charge of incompetency or misconduct, or breach of the provisions of any Act of Parliament or of any regulations relating to pilots, on the part of a pilot or exempt master, shall decide whether the pilot or exempt master so charged be guilty of reckless or careless navigation, or any other act of misconduct whatsoever, or be incompetent, or be guilty of any breach of the provisions of any Act of Parliament or of any regulations relating to pilots.

29. The decision of the Court of Marine Inquiry ^{Decision of Court how notified.} shall, when the certificate of a master, mate, or engineer, or the licence of a pilot, or the certificate of an exempt master is to be suspended or cancelled, be stated in open court by one of its members; but in any formal investigation into any casualty, or in any formal investigation in which it has not been determined that any such certificate or licence should be cancelled or suspended, the decision of the Court may either be delivered orally in open court by any member thereof, or may be delivered in writing signed by the President of the Court, and if in writing such decision may be sent or delivered to the respective parties by the Clerk of the Court, and it shall not be necessary to hold a court merely for the purpose of giving such decision.

30. The Court of Marine Inquiry may, if it think ^{Costs.} fit, order the costs and expenses of the proceedings, or any part thereof, to be paid by the Marine Board, or (in a case other than a preliminary inquiry or a formal investigation into a casualty) by any other party to the proceedings within such time as the Court may specify. Such order may be in the form in the Fourth Schedule ^{Fourth Schedule.} hereto.

31. At the conclusion of the case, the President of ^{Report to Board.} the Court shall forward its judgment to the Marine Board. Such judgment shall have annexed thereto the ^{Fifth Schedule.} particulars specified in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

32. In computing the number of days within which ^{Computation of time.} any act is to be done, they shall be reckoned exclusive of the first day and inclusive of the last day unless the last day fall on a Sunday or on a day duly appointed for a public holiday, in which case the time shall be reckoned exclusive of that day also.

33. Any notice, summons, or other document issuing ^{Service of notices, &c.} out of the Court may be served by forwarding the same through the post in a prepaid registered letter, addressed in compliance with the provisions of section 240 of the *Marine Act* 1915.

34. The service of any notice, summons, or other ^{Proof of service} document may be proved by the oath or affidavit of the person by whom it was served.

Adjournment. 35. The Court of Marine Inquiry may adjourn from time to time, and from place to place, as it may think fit

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF DONALD.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend the provisions of By-law No. 134, with reference to the prevention of nuisances and accidents. Now, therefore, the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by Act 6, George V., No. 2686, and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, make the By-law and order as follows:—

Construction of By-law.

1. This By-law shall from and after the date of same coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law No. 134 intitled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII. Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 134 to amend and consolidate the By-laws and Regulations with reference to Street Traffic."

Amendment of By-law No. 134.

2. Clause 32 of the said By-law No. 134 shall as from the commencement of this By-law be and the same is hereby repealed and the next following clause hereof shall be enacted and read in lieu thereof. Provided that such repeal shall not prejudice or affect any prosecution for any act or omission or any penalty incurred by reason of any contravention of such clause prior to the commencement of this By-law.

Obstructing Streets or Footways. Advertising Placards, &c., on Vehicles. Employees of Persons Offending also Liable.

3. No person shall place on any street or footway to the obstruction or annoyance of any member of the public or carry on any vehicle or otherwise any placard board or other thing by way of advertisement unless he has obtained from the Town Clerk a permit so to do. The employer of the driver of any vehicle or motor car upon which is carried any placard board or other thing contrary to this clause or of any other person contravening the provisions of this clause and also any other person who shall in any manner authorize the same shall respectively be guilty of an offence hereunder.
