DISCHARGED SOLDIER SETTLEMENT ENQUIRY BOARD.

1. That Mr. A. R. Stewart, honorary secretary of the Newlyn sub-committee of the local Repatriation Committee, whilst professing to assist soldier settlers on the Sutton Park Estate, in every way did so for his own benefit.

2. That Mr. Stewart gave a number of them credit for sums amounting to perhaps £100, but later, when these soldier settlers had produce on their holdings and there was likely to be a rise in the prices, he insisted upon such soldier settlers selling their hay to him.

3. That Mr. Stewart knew that prices were rising, and that the soldier settlers knew that also, and so they did not want to sell.

4. That Mr. Stewart, however, told them that if they did not sell to him at once he would take proceedings for recovery of the money they owed him.—

5. That having received an order issued by the Closer Settlement Board in favour of a soldier settler to enable him to buy chaff, Mr. Stewart, instead of handing the order to such soldier settler, posted it back to the Closer Settlement Board with the intimation that such soldier settler did not want to buy chaff at all, this action being taken when the soldier settler informed Mr. Stewart that he was going to buy his chaff elsewhere, as he could get it cheaper than Mr. Stewart was prepared to sell it to him.

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The charges for burying in or otherwise use the cemetery must be paid before an order can be given for the particular work or privilege required.

3. Orders for interments must be given to the caretaker, at least six working hours before the time appointed for the burial, so as to allow sufficient time for digging the grave within working hours.

4. The caretaker will dig all ordinary graves, but when brick graves or—vaults are required, then the excavations must be made and the ground filled in or removed under the inspection and to the satisfaction of the caretaker.

5. The hours fixed for interment are from 10 a.m. till 5 p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from 10 k.m. till 4 p.m. during the other four months, except on Sundays, when the hours are from 2 p.m. till 5 p.m. throughout the year.

6. A drawing of every stone, tomb, or pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be creeted, and a copy of every inscription must be submitted to the trustees, without whose approval it shall not be erected or inscribed.

7. Every collin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in and cemented, and covered by a slab of stone or iron.

*8. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery.

9. Every stonemason or contractor doing work in the completion of the work.

10. The grounds will be open to the public daily from sunrise till sunset.

11. No new grave can be made without paying for the ground or satisfying the trustees that it has already been paid for.
