Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 18 (MISCELLANEOUS SHOPS).

Note.—This Determination on the 2nd October, 1922, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts: the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo. Geelong, and Warmambool; the towns of Geelong West and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in any shop other than shops of the following classes, that is to say:—

- (a) a butcher's shop, a bookseller's and news agent's shop, a confectionery and pastry shop, a cooked meat dealer's shop, a fish and oyster shop, a flower shop, a fruit and vegetable shop, a hairdresser's shop, a tobacconist's shop:
- (b) a hoot dealer's shop, a boot repairer's shop, a chemist's shop, a dairy produce dealer's shop, a draper's shop, a dyer's and clothes cleaner's shop, a fuel and todder dealer's shop, a furniture dealer's shop, a grocer's shop, a haberdasher's shop, a hardware shop, a hater's shop, a men's clothing shop, a mercer's shop, a milliner's shop, an underclothing shop,"

has made the following Determination, namely

(1) That on the 2nd October, 1922, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVEETIME.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 48 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(4) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rates payable for all work done on Sunday and time and a half for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
