Marine Act 1915.

AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1915*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of the said State in Council, doth hereby make the regulations following, that is to say:—

1. *Short Title*.—These Regulations may be cited as "The Masters and Mates Regulations 1922."

2. *Commencement*.—These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates, 1921," made by the Board on the 16th day of December, 1920, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th day of January, 1921, hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations," and shall come into operation on the 13th day of November, 1922.

3. *Repeal*.—The Regulations mentioned in the Schedule hereto to the extent to which the same are thereby expressed to be repealed, are, from the coming into operation of these present regulations, hereby repealed.

4. *Signalling*.—

(1) *Second Mate (Ordinary)*.—For clause (l) of paragraph 32 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

32 (l). The Morse and British movable semaphore alphabets, the International Code of Signals and the Allied Signal Manual. He will be required to attain a minimum speed of 10 words a minute in semaphore and 6 words a minute in Morse flashing, and 5 words a minute in Morse flag waving.

(2) *Mate (Home Trade)*.—For so much of clause 61 of the Principal Regulations as relates to the proficiency to be attained in signalling there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

He will also be required to attain a minimum speed of 10 words a minute in semaphore and 6 words a minute in Morse flashing, and 5 words a minute in Morse flag waving, and to have a good working knowledge of the International Code of Signals and Allied Signal Manual.

5. *Master (Ordinary)*.—After clause (d) of paragraph 38 of the Principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following additional clause, namely:—

38 (e). or, he must have served seven and a half years at sea, two years of which must have been in a capacity not lower than Third Mate of a foreign-going vessel whilst holding a First Mate's Certificate for foreign-going vessels (he must prove that he had only two officers over him besides the master) and one year and a half not lower than Third or Fourth Mate of a foreign-going vessel in charge of a watch whilst holding a Second Mate's Certificate for foreign-going vessels (see Regulation 7).

6. *Service as Wireless Operator*.—For clause (b) of paragraph 109 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

109 (b). If a candidate has been engaged on Articles of Agreement as seaman, or in any seaman rating, and has served both as a seaman and as a wireless operator, two-thirds of such service may be counted as qualifying service.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS

REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

No. 73.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioners," in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the *Railways Act* 1915, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection, and examination of candidates for employment, and do hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto.

1. Every person desiring to become a candidate for employment in any position specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination must prepare, in his own handwriting, an application on the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for appointment to one of the vacancies specified in such public notice.

2. Every candidate shall be restricted to one application for employment; but, if so prescribed in the public notice, will be allowed to specify two of the positions, or, in the case of an apprentice, two of the trades named therein as his first and second preference respectively, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped and posted so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways (hereinafter referred to as the "Secretary"), Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

3. The age of each candidate shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for the opening of the applications, and shall be not less than the minimum, nor more than the maximum, age specified in the public notice for the particular grade.

4. Every candidate shall furnish with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth. In the case, however, of a candidate born outside of the State of Victoria, a statutory declaration by one of his parents or by a near elder relative as to the date of his birth will be accepted as temporary evidence of age; but every such candidate who is selected and is appointed on probation will be required to obtain an official birth certificate from the State or country in which he was born within such reasonable time as may be determined by the Commissioners.

5. The height of every candidate shall not be less than the minimum height prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

6. The salary or wage of every successful candidate on appointment and thereafter shall be subject to the conditions specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination.

7. Every successful candidate for employment in the grade of Apprentice, Junior Clerk, Lad Labourer, or Lad Porter, who, owing to the requirements of the Department, may be obliged to reside away from his home, shall, in addition to his salary or wage, be granted an allowance towards his board and lodging expenses, if so entitled, subject to the conditions specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination.

8. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Department or in the Public Service, whether as a permanent or supernumerary employee, shall furnish with his application particulars as to the period of such employment.

9. Any person who has been dismissed from the Railway Department, or the Public Service, or whose employment has been terminated for disciplinary causes under the provisions of the Railways or Public Service Acts, or who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour, whether before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

10. The Secretary shall on the day and at the hour named in the public notice proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

11. The candidates in any grade, if not more than twice the number to be employed, shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 16 to 26 inclusive of this Regulation.

12. The candidates in any grade, if more than twice the number to be employed, shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number not exceeding twice the number to be employed.

13. The members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them; and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

14. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

15. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

16. Every candidate selected by the Board of Selectors and every candidate for employment in any grade for which the number of applicants is not more than twice the number to be employed, shall be required to undergo an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall pay a fee of 5s.

17. Every such candidate shall, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of height, vision, colour-sense, and hearing, present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

18. Every such candidate shall be required by the Examiners appointed for that purpose to pass the educational examination prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

19. Every such candidate shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, as well as certificates, indentures, or other satisfactory evidence that he possesses the requisite qualifications prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade, and shall furnish satisfactory testimony of his employment with any persons or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years; and every such candidate who has had previous employment in the Public Service or in the service of the Commissioners shall produce a statement of such service and a certificate of competency and good conduct.

20. The Educational Examiners shall thereupon examine the candidates who have passed the physical, &c., examination, at such time and place as may be notified to such candidates respectively.

21. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, indorsed with their certificate as to the fitness or otherwise of the candidate for the position applied for.

22. After examination by the Educational Examiners the successful candidates in any grade, if not in excess of the number required, will be employed forthwith, and their relative seniority for future promotion, &c. (all other things being equal), shall be determined by a ballot conducted by the Secretary.

23. The successful candidates in any grade, if in excess of the number required, shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots to determine the order of procedure in which their names shall be recorded for appointment; and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all other things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

24. Every successful candidate in any grade, if in excess of the number required by the Commissioners, shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment to any vacancy in the particular grade for which he is a candidate during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of the ballot without further or other examination.

25. Every appointment shall be on probation for a period of six months, during which the probationer shall be required to attend such instructional classes as may be prescribed by the Commissioners for the particular grade; and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners, provided that the probationer whilst in the service of the Commissioners has demonstrated his fitness for permanent appointment by good conduct, industry, and capacity as ascertained by the results of such examinations and practical tests that

may be imposed. No probationer, however, shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.

26. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employee shall without previous notice be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the period of probation, or, in the case of an Apprentice, either during or after the period of apprenticeship, and without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

27. Every Apprentice, unless specifically excepted, shall, immediately after appointment, attend such Departmental or other instructional classes as the Commissioners may direct at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which shall extend over the period prescribed in Clauses 30 and 31.

28. Every Apprentice shall provide the books, drawing instruments, &c., required at the classes of instruction at his own expense, but the Commissioners will either provide instruction free of charge or pay any necessary fees, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the classes of instruction.

29. Every Apprentice shall present himself for such examinations as may be prescribed for the particular trade, and shall pass in proper sequence the examinations for each year of such course, and, in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners.

30. Every such Apprentice will be allowed a maximum period of three years in which to complete the course of instruction prescribed for the first and second years of apprenticeship; but no Apprentice will be eligible to undergo the third-year course unless he has satisfactorily completed the first and second year courses within the period covered by the first three years of his apprenticeship.

31. Any Apprentice who, after having undergone the third-year course of instruction, fails to pass the prescribed qualifying examination for that year will not be allowed to repeat such course either at the expense of the Department or in his ordinary hours of duty, nor will he be eligible to compete for the Scholarship referred to in Clause 35.

32. Any Apprentice who fails to make satisfactory progress at the classes of instruction may be called upon to attend, at his own expense and in his own time, such additional night classes as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioners.

33. Any Apprentice who is adjudged guilty of frequent or repeated misconduct at the classes of instruction or to have neglected to have made a proper effort to qualify in his work as an Apprentice will render himself liable to the immediate determination of his service, and shall not have any claim if at any time his service be so determined.

34. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the Apprentices who each year of the period of tuition may be adjudged highest in order of merit and as possessing the highest qualifications amongst all Apprentices who are pursuing for the first time the course applicable to the particular year, shall be awarded the prizes applicable to their particular trades as specified in the public notice, provided that they obtain not less than 75 per cent. of the possible marks.

35. The three Apprentices who, at the end of the third year of tuition, are adjudged highest in order of merit amongst all Apprentices eligible under the conditions specified in the public notice, shall be nominated as students in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering (as may be determined by the Commissioners), and afforded facilities to attend for three years the full day course at either the Working Men's College or other such Institution as may be determined by the Commissioners, and any such Apprentice who passes the prescribed examination and gains a diploma of the College or other such Institution, as the case may be, in respect thereof, shall thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of three years the fees of the College or other such Institution will be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid an annual salary in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being; and every such Apprentice who is appointed as an Engineering Assistant will be required to agree in writing to remain thereafter in the service of the Commissioners (provided his services are required) for a period of at least three years, or alternatively, in the event of his earlier resignation, to refund all fees paid and expense incurred by the Commissioners for the purpose of his tuition.

36. The term of apprenticeship shall extend over the period of years specified in the public notice for the particular trade, and each year thereof shall be

deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days, and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the Workshops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the prescribed term of apprenticeship, exceed the aggregate of thirteen (13) working days per annum for each year of such prescribed term of apprenticeship.

In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any apprentice exceeding such aggregate of 13 days per annum for each year of the prescribed term of apprenticeship, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended for a period equivalent to the period of such excess leave of absence.

WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT OF THE CLUNES BOROUGH COUNCIL.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922-1923.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Water Supply District of the Clunes Borough Council do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law, viz. :—

By-law No. 22, fixing the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the district, such rate being made for the year ending on the 30th day of September, 1923.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the occupiers or owners of the lands or tenements within the Water Supply District of the Clunes Borough Council, who are supplied with water, shall be as follow :—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of One pound five shillings per annum.
2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, the sum of One shilling and threepence in the pound of the municipal valuation.

3. On unoccupied lands and lands on which no tenements are erected, nor water laid on, the sum of One shilling and threepence in the pound of the municipal valuation.

4. Water supplied for steam-boiler purposes, One shilling per thousand gallons.

5. For water supplied for irrigation and to gardens and nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons until the amount so payable is equal to the amount of the assessed annual rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by meter. For a further supply, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that when the value of the water used as above shall equal the sum of Five pounds, the charge for water then used in excess of such value shall be reduced to Twopence per 1,000 gallons until the quantity used reaches the maximum annual quantity used on the same rateable area during the previous three years, after which the price will be reduced to One penny half-penny per 1,000 gallons up to a further quantity of 50,000 gallons, and thereafter the price will be reduced to One penny per 1,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied to troughs in the streets of the borough, Eighteen shillings per annum, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Commissioners may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

8. Provided the occupier or owner provides a suitable wrought-iron trough, with strong cover for locking down, and fixes a suitable ball-cock, the following shall be the scale of charges per annum for supplying stock with water, unless the Commissioners decide that the water must be taken by measure, and at such rate per 1,000 gallons as fixed by them :—

- (a) On land not exceeding 20 acres, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.
- (b) On land above 20 acres but not exceeding 50 acres, the sum of Eighteen shillings per annum.
- (c) On land above 50 acres but not exceeding 75 acres, the sum of Twenty-five shillings per annum.
- (d) On land above 75 acres but not exceeding 100 acres, the sum of Thirty-one shillings per annum.
- (e) On land above 100 acres, the sum of Thirty-seven shillings and sixpence per annum.

9. In addition to the foregoing scale of charges, there shall be paid the sum of One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal valuation of such land or lands and tenements. All payments to be made in advance.

10. The maximum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where it is supplied by measure for domestic use, the watering of stock, or irrigation of private or other gardens, or for any other purpose whatsoever, shall be the quantity for which the return would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable upon the premises if supplied under the rating or otherwise than by measure.

11. For small lots under cultivation for trade purposes or for the supply of vegetable products to hotels, boarding-houses and such like, occupied by the same persons, the following scale shall be applied :—

- (a) If not exceeding one quarter of an acre in extent each, the sum of Ten shillings per annum.
- (b) If exceeding one quarter of an acre but not exceeding one half of an acre, the sum of Twenty shillings each per annum.

12. The rates and charges shall be payable by equal instalments on the 1st day of February, 1923, and the 1st day of April, 1923, at the Town Hall, Clunes.

13. Such person as shall be appointed from time to time for that purpose by the Commissioners is hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and sue for the recovery of the rates and charges hereby made.

The foregoing By-law, numbered 22, was made and adopted by the Water Supply Commission of the Clunes Borough Council, and the common seal of the said corporation was hereto affixed this 4th day of October, 1922.

BY-LAW No. 33.

A By-law making rates and charges for water supplied within the Water Supply District of the Borough of Creswick.

THE Council of the Borough of Creswick do hereby, pursuant to and in the execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (Nos. 2747 and 2852), make the following Rates upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Creswick, such rates to come into operation for the year commencing on the 1st day of October, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, and the said rate shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance, viz., on the 1st day of October, 1922, and the 1st day of April, 1923.

The Rates and Charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes :—

1. On every house or tenement of an annual value not exceeding £12, the annual sum of £1.
2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £13 and not exceeding £20, the annual sum of £1 5s.
3. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £21 and not exceeding £30, the annual sum of £1 10s.
4. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £31 and not exceeding £50, the annual sum of £2.
5. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £51 and not exceeding £75, the annual sum of £2 10s.
6. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £76 and not exceeding £100, the annual sum of £3.
7. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £101 and not exceeding £150, the annual sum of £3 10s.
8. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £151 and not exceeding £200, the annual sum of £4.
9. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £200, the annual sum of £5.

Hotels.

10. On every hotel of the annual value of £50 and under, the annual sum of £2 10s.
11. On every hotel of the annual value of £51 and not exceeding £100, the annual sum of £3 10s.
12. On every hotel of the annual value of £101 and not exceeding £150, the annual sum of £4 15s.
13. On every hotel of the annual value of £151 and not exceeding £200, the annual sum of £6.
14. On every hotel above the annual value of £200, the annual sum of £7.
15. Livery and coach-horse stables and other premises where horses are constantly kept (in addition to the above) to be charged at the rate of 6s. per stall per annum.
16. In hotels, one stall allowed for every £50 annual value; every additional stall to be charged at the rate of 6s. per annum.
17. Charge for water troughs, £1 per annum.
18. Charge for water supplied by meter, 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.
19. Charge for water supplied at stand-pipe, 6d. per load of 180 gallons.

AVOCA TOWNSHIP WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 13.

THE Avoca Township Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1923 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

1. On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal value thereof; but the minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound ten shillings sterling.

2. Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal value.

3. Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be ten thousand gallons (10,000).

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per thousand gallons (1,000).

5. Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum per engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

6. For steam-boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter.

7. On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the charge shall be Five shillings per thousand gallons (1,000), and the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the contractor, owner, or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings and Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided; or they may by special agreement with the Trust pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings per annum, and for water at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, payments in either case to be made in advance.

8. Supplies of water not specified herein must be paid for at such a rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

9. In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to make a special charge.

10. For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

11. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such hose is used.

12. For all tenements in the said district situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and which tenements are not supplied with water, by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, the rate shall be one-half, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, shall be one-quarter the amount which would be payable if such tenement were supplied with water from the service pipes.

13. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of January, 1923.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover such rates and charges.

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923.

By virtue of the Water Acts, By-law for Imposing, Levying, and Receiving Water Rates and Charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1923, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being of the annual value of Twenty pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.).

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Seventeen shillings shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Seventeen shillings be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be paid.

6. Every consumer of water must provide meters; all excess water over allotment covered by the valuation rate to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 3d. per 1,000 gallons.

The above rates shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1923.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

GISBORNE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923.

THE Commissioners of the Gisborne Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following rates are those which occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1923 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District:—

A rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the Trust District according to the municipal valuation of such properties, and shall be paid in equal moieties on the 1st day of January, 1923, and the 1st day of July, 1923.

A minimum rate of Twenty shillings shall be paid on all properties valued at £4 sterling and over, and a minimum rate of Ten shillings shall be paid on all allotments of land on which there is no building and valued at £3 sterling and under.

All water supplied by the Trust for domestic use and for other than domestic use shall be charged for by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust).

Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon.

The minimum quantity to be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be the quantity which would be equal to the amount of assessed rate payable for such premises so supplied. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Commissioners of the Gisborne Waterworks Trust on the 4th day of October, 1922.

MURTOA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 18.

THE Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust shall pay for the year 1923 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said district:—

1. For any house or tenement fronting any street wherein a pipe for the supply of water shall have been laid or where houses or tenements if not fronting such streets are supplied with water by reticulation, and being of an annual valuation of Ten pounds (£10) or under, the sum of One pound five shillings (25s.).
2. For every house or tenement so situated of an annual value of above Ten pounds (£10) the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.
3. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under situated in streets with no pipes, and if not supplied with water, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).
4. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) in streets with no pipes, and if not supplied with water, the sum of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound on the annual value of such property.
5. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.
6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1923, and shall be payable on the 1st January, 1923.
7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.
8. Water supplied to Government Departments, religious denominations, and to persons outside the Trust area, shall be by measurement or special agreement.
9. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of water supplied by special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons. In cases of large consumers of water by meter the Trust by special agreement may make a reduction to not less than Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons. A charge of 7½d. per 1,000 will be made to the Wimmera Inland Freezing Co. Ltd. for pumping water.
10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the previous clauses, the minimum charge for water supplied by measurement or under special agreement must not be less than the charge would be if the property was rated in the usual way according to the shire valuation. This By-law also applies to the freezing works.
11. On properties where the officers consider it necessary, a meter will be ordered to be put on, and in case of non-compliance the water will be cut off, according to the powers conferred by the Water Acts.

The foregoing By-law, No. 16, was made by the Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Acts, this 21st day of September, 1922.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1923.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situated, the minimum rate to be Twenty shillings.
 2. Water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes during January, February, March, November, and December shall be charged for by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), and the minimum quantity to be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be the quantity which would be equal to the amount of assessed rates payable for such premises so supplied. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.
 3. The above rate is for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1923, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1923, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the first of April and on the first of October, 1923.
- Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rate and charge.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BRANXHOLME PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act* 1915, the Trustees of the Branhholme Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.
5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper, or sexton).
6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
8. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the officer of health of the district, or by a police magistrate, or justice of the peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day; and on payment of the special fee as provided.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. Any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

17. No wooden erection shall be allowed.

DECLARATION OF DEVELOPMENTAL ROADS IN THE SHIRE OF ELTHAM.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the nineteenth day of September One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) being of opinion that the roads set out or described in the Schedule thereunder written are of sufficient importance and will serve to develop areas of land (whether alienated from the Crown or not) by providing access to a railway station or to a main road leading to a railway station and acting under the powers conferred upon it by the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* (No. 2944) declared such roads to be developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Act 1918*: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road or part thereof mentioned in such Resolution shall be a developmental road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

The Country Roads Board incorporated by the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the roads set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance and will serve to develop areas of land by providing access to a railway station or to a main road leading to a railway station acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* (No. 2944) doth by this Resolution hereby declare such roads to be developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Developmental Roads Act 1918*.

SCHEDULE.

Shire of Eltham.

5. *Yarra Glen-Kinglake East Road* (5655).—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 46A, parish of Burgoyne; thence north-easterly and north-westerly to a point at the eastern end of the Country Roads Board deviation through allotment 47D, the said point being distant from the north-western angle of allotment 47K of the said parish, by a line bearing approximately south 75 deg. 30 min. west 12.2 chains.

PORTLAND MUNICIPAL COMMON.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

THE following shall be read in lieu of Regulation 7:—

Every animal placed upon the Common shall bear a metal tag having thereon a distinctive number attached to it by means of a metal chain or leather strap, which tag and chain or strap shall be supplied by the managers upon registration being effected and payment of a deposit of Three shillings and sixpence thereon, and until such tag, &c., is returned to the managers the animal bearing such tag shall be deemed to be depasturing upon the Common, and the owner thereof shall be liable for the agistment thereof, and shall not be entitled to a refund of such deposit.

The following shall be read in lieu of Regulation 3:—

The fees for depasturing stock on the Common during the hours between 6 a.m. and 5 p.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September, and to 7 p.m. during the other months of the year, shall be as follow, and shall be payable in advance during the first week in January, April, July, and October in each and every year, that is to say:—

For every horse, Ten shillings for every quarter if on the Common for the whole of the year; but if not on the Common during the three quarters of the year preceding the spring quarter, the charge for the spring quarter to be Twenty shillings.

For every milch cow, Six shillings and sixpence for every quarter if on the Common for the whole of the year; but if not on the Common during the three quarters of the year preceding the spring quarter, the charge for the spring quarter to be Thirteen shillings.

For every dry cow or head of other large cattle, Seven shillings and sixpence for every quarter if on the Common for the whole of the year; but if not on the Common during the three quarters of the year preceding the spring quarter, the charge for the spring quarter to be Fifteen shillings.

Provided that in all the cases above mentioned should an animal be registered upon the Common for each quarter of the year the last quarter's fee shall be so reduced that the whole charge for the year shall not exceed four times the fee for the ordinary quarter.

Foals and calves are allowed to run free upon the Common up to three months of age.

No stock under the age of two years shall be allowed upon the Common excepting on such portion thereof as the managers may set apart for that purpose after 1st October, 1922.

For sheep, at the rate of Four shillings per head per annum. For goats, the sum of One shilling per head per annum.
