ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are herein-after set forth, that is to say:—

“ An Act to amend the *Electoral Act 1920*.”

“ An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Railways and for Irrigation Works and Water Supply Works and for Drainage and Flood Protection Works in Country Districts and for Works under the River Murray Waters Acts.”

“ An Act to sanction the Issue and Application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Irrigation Works Water Supply Works Drainage and Flood Protection Works in Country Districts and for Works under the River Murray Waters Acts and for other purposes.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and in the thirteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

A GLAZED POTTERY BOARD AND AN UNGLAZED POTTERY BOARD TO BE APPOINTED IN PLACE OF THE POTTERY TRADE BOARD.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council, by Order dated the eighth day of October, 1900, appointed the Pottery Trade Board: And whereas it is expedient to appoint the undermentioned Boards to take the place of the said Pottery Trade Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of

the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby abolish the said Pottery Trade Board and in place thereof order—

(I.) That a Wages Board consisting of six members and a Chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of making glazed pipes or glazed pottery (except tiles), and digging the clay used in connexion therewith: Also, that such Wages Board may in any regulation, determination, order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Glazed Pottery Board.

(II.) That a Wages Board consisting of six members and a Chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of making unglazed pipes or unglazed pottery or tiles of all sorts (other than cement tiles), and digging the clay used in connexion therewith: Also, that such Wages Board may in any regulation, determination, order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Unglazed Pottery Board.

(III.) That the area or locality within which each of the Determinations of the said Glazed Pottery Board and the said Unglazed Pottery Board shall be operative shall be the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool, the towns of Geelong West and Sandringham, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

A GLAZED POTTERY (COUNTRY) BOARD AND AN UNGLAZED POTTERY (COUNTRY) BOARD TO BE APPOINTED IN PLACE OF THE POTTERY TRADE BOARD.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council, by Order dated the twenty-seventh day of June, 1922, appointed the Country Pottery Trade Board: And whereas it is expedient to appoint the undermentioned Wages Boards to take the place of the said Country Pottery Trade Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby abolish the said Country Pottery Trade Board, and in place thereof order—

(I.) That a Wages Board consisting of six members and a Chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of making glazed pipes or glazed pottery (except tiles), and digging the clay used in connexion therewith: Also, that such Wages Board may in any regulation, determination, order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Glazed Pottery (Country) Board.

(II.) That a Wages Board consisting of six members and a Chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of making unglazed pipes or unglazed pottery or tiles of all sorts (other than cement tiles), and digging the clay used in connexion therewith: Also, that such Wages Board may in any regulation, determination, order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Unglazed Pottery (Country) Board.

(III.) That the area or locality within which each of the Determinations of the said Glazed Pottery (Country) Board and the said Unglazed Pottery (Country) Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State outside and excepting the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool, the towns of Geelong West and Sandringham, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
