THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act to provide for the Permanent Reservation as a Site for a Public Park and Recreation Grounds (to serve as a Memorial of the Soldiers who took part in the recent War) of certain Land in the Parish of Marnoo to be transferred to the Crown and for the Sale of certain Crown Land in the said Parish temporarily reserved as a Site for Public Recreation and for the Application of the Proceeds of such Sale to the Improvement of the first-mentioned Site."
- "An Act to ratify and provide for carrying out an Agreement between the States of New South Wales and Victoria respecting the Construction Maintenance and Operation of certain Lines of Railway in the State of New South Wales and the State of Victoria the Construction and Maintenance of certain Bridges over the River Murray, and other Works and for other purposes."
- "An Act relating to Vermin and Noxious Weeds."
- "An Act to amend the Land Surveyors Act 1915."

THE Municipal Council of the City of Warrnambool doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water District has for the purpose of the said Acts. been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following.

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of land and tenements shall pay, in advance, in one instalment, for the period from the first day of October, 1922, to the thirtieth day of September, 1923, in respect of water supplied by the Council (that is to say):—

(c) Houses occupied for a period of not less than six calendar

(d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dounciles nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelvepence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(c) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except where the Council shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.

(f) For water supplied by the Council by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Council, or otherwise provided in this regulation, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per

(g The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 1,000 gallons, and the ratepayers shall be charged for quantity of water which at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from the stand-pipe.

(h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(i) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(i) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Council, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Five shillings per centum for wooden buildings lined with plaster, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Council, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for the water at the rate of One shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. Payment in either case to be made in advance.

(k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

(l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Council shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Council before a supply can be taken or used.

  (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case so supplied shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

  (2) For a stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of 250 gallons or under, One shilling.

Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam engines, or stock who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water shall, if the Commissioners think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such occupiers or owners are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE CRANBOURNE RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

NDEA the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlers) keeping shops within the Cranbourne Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Cranbourne of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke the regulations made on the twenty-eighth day of March, 1916, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hair-dressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915, within the Cranbourne Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Cranbourne shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

(a) No occupier of any premises or other person shall construct or cause to be constructed any closet or privy except in the form of an earth-closet which shall consist of a suitable privy building the floor of which is at no point less than three inches above the surrounding ground surface and which shall have requisite means provided for the application of dry earth or other deodorizing material to the contents of the pan to be used therein and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose. of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

4. (b). Every closet or privy attached to any school licensed public house botcl factory workroom or common lodging house shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination from the riser of seat towards the back of the building of half-an-inch to the foot. All closets and privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

4. (c). No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

4. (c). No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

5. Every such closet or privy shall be furnished by the Shire Council with a double-pan service for the reception of night-soil and such pans shall be and remain the property of the Council.

6. At least once a week or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct the pan in use shall be enclosed with a tight-fitting lid and removed between such hours as the Council may direct in a suitable cart and a pan cleansed and disinfected by efficient means approved of by the Council shall be left in place of the one removed.

7. The night-soil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor desiceator or incinerator provided by the Council or be trenched or ploughed into the ground in such locality as may be provided by the Council.

8. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy a proper supply of dry-earth ashes lime sawdust charcoal or some other effective decdorant for effectually decdorizing night-soil and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet or privy to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such decdorizing material sufficient to thoroughly distinfect the contents of such pan.

9. No such occupier or person shall use a closet van for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for decdorizing) other than night-soil or shall damage such pan or lids in any manner whatsoever.

10. No such occupier or person save those authorized by the Council shall remove any night-soil except in cases of exemption.

11. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the Council

the Council shall remove any night-soil except in cases of exemption.

11. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the Council over all premises within the said boundaries which premises may be inspected by the Council or its officers from time to time or by any other person duly authorized by the Council.

12. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make an annual charge on each such occupier for the supply of pans and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed to be done. Such charge shall be payable quarterly in advance or otherwise as the Council shall by resolution direct and shall be recoverable in any Court of Petty Sessions. Failure to pay the said charge when due shall constitute a breach of this By-law.

13. Every, such occupier or person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds sterling for every such breach thereof and in case of a continuing breach to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each week during which such breach shall be committed or continued but the Court before which such penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

14. That all By-laws hitherto in force within the shire of Hampden made under this Act and having relation to any or all of the several things contained in this By-law with respect to the area contained within the above-mentioned boundaries are hereby repealed.
