### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are herein-after set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to provide for the closing of [portion of a certain Street adjoining the Township of Jeparit and for the Grant of a Lease of the Portion so closed to the Country Fire Brigades Board and for other purposes."

"An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation of certain Land at Kew and to make provision for its Permanent Reservation as a Site for Public Recreation and Park."

"An Act relating to the Sale of certain Lands in the City of Brunswick under the *Municipal Rates Recovery Act 1916*."

"An Act to amend the *Drainage Areas Act 1915*."

"An Act to amend the *Sewerage Districts Act 1915*."

"An Act to make further and better provision for the Supply of Milk and to amend the *Dairy Supervision Act 1915*."

"An Act to amend the Railways Acts with respect to the Board of Discipline."

"An Act to amend the Audit Acts."

## THE BALLARAT SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

## BY-LAW No. 1.

*Standing Orders.*

For regulating and appointing the place and hour of Meetings of "The Ballarat Sewerage Authority," and providing for the management and conduct of business thereat.

**WHEREAS** by the *Sewerage Districts Act 1915*, numbered 2761, power is given to the Ballarat Sewerage Authority (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council), from time to time, to make, amend, and repeal By-laws and regulations relating (*inter alia*) to the appointment of the place and hour of meetings, whether periodical or special, and providing for the due management and conduct of business thereat:—Be it therefore ordered and directed (subject as aforesaid) by the said Authority, as follows, viz.:—

1. In all cases not provided for by the above recited Act of the Parliament of Victoria, or by this by-law, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Authority.

*Place, Hour, and Adjournment of Meetings.*

2. Meetings of the Authority shall be held periodically at the Water Supply Office, Lewis-street, in the city of Ballarat, on every fourth Thursday, to date from the 20th December, 1920, at the hour of 4.30 o'clock p.m., and the members may from time to time by adjournment from any such meeting, or from any subsequent adjournment thereof, meet together at such times as the Authority deems necessary, at any convenient place, and at such hour to be from time to time appointed by them for that purpose.

*Meetings, Special.*

3. A special meeting of the Authority may, or shall, be summoned at any time in case of emergency, or otherwise, by the Secretary, under the direction of the Chairman, or by the Chairman or Secretary, upon receiving a requisition in writing under the hand of at least four Members of the Authority, such requisition to state the business to transact which it is desired such special meeting shall be called, by notice to be delivered or addressed, as provided in clause 6, at least two days prior to the time appointed for such meeting to take place, such notice to state the particular business to be transacted, and no other business than that set forth in such requisition or notice shall be transacted at any such meeting, and such meeting may be adjourned from time to time as provided in clause 2.

*Quorum.*

4. That a quorum of the Authority shall consist of four, and the Chairman shall take the chair at the hour appointed for the meeting of the Authority, and if, at the expiration of half-an-hour after the time appointed, there is not a quorum present, the business shall not be proceeded with, and the Chairman may adjourn the meeting to a day, notice of which shall be given to each Member. But if at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the commencement of the proceedings, the Members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting, and in the event of the absence of the Chairman and no quorum present at fifteen minutes after the hour appointed, the major part of the Authority present or any one Member, if only one be present, or if no Member be present, then the Secretary may adjourn the meeting to a day of which due notice shall be given to all the Members.

5. That if, at any time after the commencement of the business of the day, there are not present four Members, the Chairman shall, by his own authority, adjourn the meeting to such other day as he may consider most convenient.

*Meetings, Notice of.*

6. A notice of every meeting of the Authority shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by post addressed to the usual or last known place of abode of each Member, two days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held, except in cases of emergency, when a special meeting may be called as hereinbefore provided.

*Resolutions, Revoking of.*

7. A resolution or other Act of a Sewerage Authority at any meeting shall not be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of intention to propose such revocation or alteration is given to each member of the Sewerage Authority seven days at least before such subsequent meeting, and unless such revocation or alteration is determined upon a majority consisting of at least two-thirds of the Members of the Sewerage Authority present at subsequent meeting.

*Business, &c., Order of.*

8. At every meeting of the Authority the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding

meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereof except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman of such meeting; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Authority at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required by any Member present at such meeting.

9. After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Members at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

1. Reading of copies of letters sent by the Authority, if called for.
2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
4. Receiving deputations from the ratepayers (as provided in clause 48).
5. Presentation of reports of committees.
6. Payments.
7. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the Chairman may think desirable.
8. Other motions of which previous notice had been given.
9. Notices of motion, and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

*Who to Speak.*

10. If two or more Members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

*Chairman to Rise while Addressing Meeting.*

11. The Chairman shall rise in addressing the Members to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

*Members not to Speak Twice on the same Question.*

12. No Member shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation, when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

*Points of Order.*

13. The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

*Members not to Digress, or Impute Improper Motives.*

14. No Member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other Member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives; and all personal reflections on Members shall be deemed disorderly; and every Member so doing shall, upon being called to order by the Chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections as the case may be.

15. A Member called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

*Persons not Members to Leave when Requested.*

16. No person not being a Member, who having been admitted to any meeting of the Authority, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when lawfully requested by the Chairman so to do.

*Call of the Members.*

17. No Member shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Members without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.

*Documents to be Produced.*

18. Any Member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Authority applying to the question under discussion.

*Motions, Amendments, and Notice thereof.*

19. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the Secretary at the close of the meeting of Members, or if not given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the day upon which the next meeting of Members is to take place; and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

*No Motion without Notice.*

20. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

*Motions on Petitions, &c.*

21. No motion, except that of receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary Meeting of Members after that at which it has been presented.

*Motions to be Moved in Order.*

22. Except by leave of the Members, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

*Motions not to be Proceeded with in the Absence of Mover.*

23. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Member producing written authority from him to that effect.

24. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.

*Mover of Motion or Amendment not to be Interrupted.*

25. Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the Member in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

*Nature of Motion to be Stated.*

26. Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Members thereon.

*Leave to be Obtained before Motion Withdrawn.*

27. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without leave of the Authority.

*Motions to be Seconded Prior to Discussion.*

28. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Members unless it is seconded; but a Member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Authority by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

*Mover and not the Seconder Held to have Spoken.*

29. A Member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a Member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

*Motions to be in Writing.*

30. At every meeting of the Authority, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall, if required by the Chairman, be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

*Amendments re Motion in Cases.*

31. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

*Amendment to become the Question.*

32. If an amendment be carried, the question or amendment as amended shall become itself the question whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question coming after such first-mentioned amendment may be moved.

*Second Amendment may be Moved.*

33. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Authority for discussion at a time.

*Right of Mover to Reply.*

34. The mover of any original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no Member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

*Adjournment—Motion for.*

35. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Authority, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the object then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

*Protest, Members May.*

36. Any Member may protest against any resolution of the Authority, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Authority by the protesting Member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Secretary's office, and signed by such Member, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Members to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Authority.

*Lapsed Questions.*

37. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

*Order of the Day to be Restored.*

38. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day, on motion upon notice; and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

*Voting.*

39. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Member the Members voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the Chairman. The Chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and a casting vote, and every Member present shall vote except he be disabled by law from so doing.

*Questions to be Put.*

40. The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Authority, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

*Petitions.*

41. No petition shall be presented after the Authority shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

*Contents of Petitions.*

42. It shall be incumbent on every Member presenting a petition, to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Authority, and that the contents do not violate any By-law or any provision hereof.

*Name at Beginning of Petition.*

43. Every Member presenting a petition to the Authority shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

*Petitions to be in Writing.*

44. Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioner at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on each skin or sheet on which it is written.

*How Signed.*

45. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto, by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

*No Letters, &c., to be Attached.*

46. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

*Presentation of Petitions.*

47. Every Member presenting a petition to the Authority shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

*Deputations.*

48. Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Authority, in support of any petition or otherwise, must send in an application in writing to the Secretary the day before the meeting of the Authority at which such petition is intended to be presented.

*Committees.*

49. The Authority may appoint such occasional or standing Committees as it thinks fit for any purpose which, in its opinion, would be better regulated and managed by means of

a Committee. Any Committee so appointed to consist of four Members including the Chairman, three to form a quorum. Three of such members of the Committee shall be chosen by the Authority. The Chairman shall be a Member of all Committees.

#### *Minutes of Committees.*

50. Minutes of all proceedings of Committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in a minute book, and being signed by the Chairman, shall be presented to the Authority; and the Secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the Committees.

#### *Committees to be Convened.*

51. The Secretary shall convene every Committee, at any time by order of the Authority, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of a Committee.

#### *Cheques to be Signed.*

52. That two Members of the Finance Committee shall sign the cheques, and the same shall be countersigned by the Secretary.

#### *Salaries to be Fixed.*

53. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Authority shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.

#### *Member, &c., not to be Surety.*

54. No Member or Officer of the Authority, and no Assessor or Auditor, shall be received, as a surety for any Officer appointed by the Authority or for any work to be done for the Authority.

#### *Contracts.*

55. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

#### *Plans, &c.*

56. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Authority at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Member during that time, except in cases of emergency.

#### *Secretary to Expend Moneys.*

57. It shall be lawful for the Secretary and Treasurer, from time to time, on the written order of the Chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Authority for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the Authority the sum of Fifty pounds.

#### *Common Seal.*

58. The Common Seal of the Corporation shall be kept in a box having two locks, one of which locks the Chairman shall keep the key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the Secretary, and the Corporate Seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Chairman and one other Member and the Secretary of the Authority, or in the absence of the Chairman, unless two Members and the Secretary be present.

#### *Addresses to the Governor, &c.*

59. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Authority.

#### *Suspension of Regulations.*

60. Any one or more of the rules and regulations herein contained may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice being duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Authority.

#### *Penalty.*

61. Every person who shall offend against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

#### *By-Law 1.*

Made and adopted by the Ballarat Sewerage Authority, on the 25th September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and was confirmed by the said Authority on the 23rd November, 1922.

### THE BALLARAT SEWERAGE DISTRICT.

#### BY-LAW No. 2.—SPECIAL RATE.

THE Ballarat Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Sewerage Districts Act 1915, No. 2761*, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

The following special rate is hereby made under the provisions of the *Sewerage Districts Act 1915, No. 2761*, and shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable properties within the Ballarat Sewerage District.

1. Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District a rate of threepence in the pound of the net annual value of all rateable properties within the said district.
2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1923, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1923, and shall be payable on the thirty-first day of March, 1923, at the office of the Authority situate Water Supply Office, Ballarat.
3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined by a police magistrate.
4. Such person or persons as the Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

The Resolution for passing the foregoing By-law was agreed to by the Ballarat Sewerage Authority on the twenty-sixth day of October, 1922, and was confirmed by the said Authority on the 23rd day of November, 1922.

### KORUMBURRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

#### RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923, No. 18.

THE Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

#### *By-law No. 18.*

1. For determining the rates to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied, otherwise than by measure, with water for domestic use:—

2. For making and levying such rate:—

- (1) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement, being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement does not exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid. Provided that the said rate shall not in any case be less than the sum of Fifteen shillings per annum.
- (2) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement exceeds the sum of Two hundred pounds, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling for the first Two hundred pounds and Fourpence in the pound sterling for any amount over and above the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement, shall be paid.

- (3) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment, or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings be charged.
- (4) For every township allotment on which there is a stock trough or any other facility for watering stock, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be paid.
- (5) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the 31st day of December, 1923, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1923.

4. Such rates and charges other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1923, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1923.
5. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

7th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

8th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Five shillings.

- (a) If for domestic, or other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (b) If for other than domestic purposes, only 30,000 gallons per annum.

(III.) Such rate is made for the year 1923, commencing the first day of January, 1923, as also the charges for every steam boiler, and for water supplied from the public stand-pipes, and shall be payable on the first day of January, 1923.

(IV.) All other charges by measurement shall be paid on the 1st day of January, 1923.

(V.) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1923.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

(a) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) of the net annual value of £20 and under situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall be not less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.

(b) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) above the net annual value of £20 and not exceeding £300 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.

(c) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500 in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 10s. per cent. in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.

(d) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 per cent. in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.

(e) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.

(f) Of any warehouse or wholesale store used exclusively for such purposes situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £3 10s. per cent. in the pound of the municipal valuation of such warehouse or wholesale store as aforesaid.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning on the first day of January, 1923, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1923, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1923, at the office of the Water Commissioners at Ballarat.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipalities in which such lands and tenements are situate in the Ballarat Water Supply District shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively.

4. For water supplied by the Commissioners for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements valued at £20 and over shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied otherwise than by measure by the Commissioners in excess of such aforesaid quantity, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such persons as the Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the twenty-second day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635)* being of opinion that the road set out or described in the First Schedule to the same is of sufficient importance to be considered a main road resolved that the Resolution passed by the Board on the eighth day of October One thousand nine hundred and twenty and confirmed by the Governor in Council by an Order published in the *Government Gazette* of the first day of April One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one on page 1112 declaring the highway particulars of which are therein set out or described a developmental road be rescinded in part and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon the Board by the said *Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635)* by the said Resolution declared such part of such road to be a main road within the meaning of the said *Country Roads Act 1915*: And whereas the said Act and the *Developmental Roads Act 1918 (No. 2944)* amongst other things provide that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road or part thereof mentioned in such Resolution shall cease to be a developmental road and any road or part thereof mentioned in the said Resolution shall be a main road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the road mentioned in the First Schedule to such Resolution shall cease to be a developmental road and the road mentioned in the Second Schedule to such Resolution shall be a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1915*.

## RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

## REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE CITY OF BENDIGO.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the municipal district of the city of Bendigo shall be closed from the hour of six o'clock in the evening on Friday in every week.

## REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF EAGLE-HAWK.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

## DETERMINATION OF THE GAS METER BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 8th January, 1923, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of making or repairing gas meters" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 8th day of January, 1923, the last and all previous Determinations of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
