of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or thusiness initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be constructed by and fixed under the supervision of the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the water bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law, a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

5. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands

when the supply is by gravitation—One shilling for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

When the supply is pumped—Three shillings for each and every acre foot of water supplied.

6. An acre foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of 1 acre to a depth of 1 foot.

7. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the water bailiff in charge of that portion of the district in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

8. Charges for water supplied for irrigation shall be payable at the office of the Commission, at Mystic Park, fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

9. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

10. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct.

# BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD.

BY-LAW No. 44 UNDER HEALTH ACT No. 3041.

A By-law of the Borough of Daylesford made under the provisions of part fourteen of the Health Act No. 3041 and numbered 44 for prescribing the various fees payable for registration and renewal and transfer of registration of the various premises and houses within the borough of Daylesford and required by the said Act to be registered with the said Mayor Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Daylesford Daylesford.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act No. 3041 the Mayor Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Daylesford make the following By-law.

1. Offensive trades premises—One pound. Boarding houses—Ten shillings. Common lodging houses—Ten shillings. Eating houses—Ten shillings.

Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) remises (whether a heensel victuality a premises of hos-, on which are manufactured or prepared for sale, icc-cream, ginger beer, hop beer or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, sodawater, lithia water or other mineral water or any artificially acrated water—Five shillings.

2. For any transfer of registration-Two shillings and six-

pence.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation through-the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Daylesford.

4. This By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

Regulation made by the Council of the Borough of Hamilton under the provisions of the Police Offences Act 1915 and numbered 45 for the route to be observed by all carriages carts vehicles and persons and for keeping order in the carriages and footways and public places in the Borough of Hamilton and for preventing any obstruction thereof whether by assemblage of persons or otherwise.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Act of the Parliament of Victoria, numbered 2708, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hamilton make the following regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

1. No person or persons shall obstruct any carriage-way, footway, or public place within the Borough of Hamilton by standing, loitering, or assembling thereon.

2. Any person or persons obstructing any carriage-way, footway, or public place in the Borough of Hamilton by standing or loitering therein or thereon shall upon being required so to do by any member of the Police Force discontinue such standing or loitering.

3. All persons walking along the footways shall, in passing each, other, keep on their respective right-hand side of the footway.

3. All persons walking along the footways shall, in passing each other, keep on their respective right-hand side of the footway.

4. The driver of any cart, carriage, or vehicle shall give way if he can conveniently do so to any other cart, carriage, or vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other cart, carriage, or vehicle.

5. The driver of any hackney carriage or other vehicle shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street except as near as may be to the left or near side of the street except as near as may be to the left or near side of the street.

6. The driver of any cart, carriage, or vehicle of whatsoever kind whether public or private before stopping the same in any carriage-way for any purpose shall give notice of intention so to do if riding upon or driving such cart, carriage, or vehicle by holding up his hand or his whip so that the same may be seen by the driver of any cart, carriage, or the vehicle in the rear of his, and upon stopping he shall place his cart, carriage, or vehicle so as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if the stoppage prevents the passing of any other cart, carriage, or vehicle or interrupt or delay traffic he chall immediately upon being requested by the driver of such other cart, carriage, or vehicle or so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

7. The driver of every cart, carriage, or vehicle to pass or so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

The driver of every cart, carriage, or vehicle shall while the same shall be travelling or standing in or on any road, street, or public place within the Borough of Hamilton between sunset and sunrise carry on the right or off side thereof a lamp showing a bright white light visible within a reasonable distance but not less than two hundred yards in the direction toward which such cart, carriage, or vehicle shall at or near the intersection of Gray and Thompson streets or at or near the in

down any passenger or passengers or to take delivery of and load or to unload and deliver any goods, property, or merchandise on to or from such cart, carriage or vehicle. This clause shall not apply to drivers of licensed vehicles lawfully remaining or plying for hire at any stand for vehicles specially set apart or appointed by the Council of the Borough of Hamilton

9. No driver of any cart, carriage, or vehicle shall (save for the purpose of avoiding any accident or collision) stop or cause to stop such cart, carriage, or vehicle at or within the intersection of Gray and Thomson streets or at or within the intersection of Gray and Brown streets or at or within the intersection of Brown and French streets. The onus of proving that any stoppage is for either or both of the purposes aforesaid shall be upon such driver.

10. No processions of persons or of vehicles or motor cars or of any combination of persons, vehicles, or motor cars shall except for military or functal purposes parade or pass through any street unless with the previous consent, in writing, of the Council, given under the hand of the Town Clerk, and by the route specified in such consent and unless and until the recipient of such consent has given at least twenty-four hours' notice with particulars of such consent and route to the officer in charge of Police in the Borough. All applications for any such consent shall be in writing, addressed to the Council of the Borough of Hamilton.

11. Retween the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and

Between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the avening of any day except Friday, and between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and ten o'clock in the evening of Friday no person shall cause interruption or annovance to passengers along the public roadways or footways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such roadway or footway whether from buildings in process of construction or demolition or in any other manner.

No person shall light or smoke any pipe tobacco cigar or cigarette in the main hall or auditorium or public hall or in the staircase hall or lobby or in any corridor or passage (save that this shall not apply to that part of the corridor or passage space between the front door and the staircase lobby) or in the kitchen of the building known as the Town Hall of the Borough of Hamilton. And any person who is guilty of any wilful act of default contrary to any of the provisions of this clause of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Twenty shillings nor more than Twenty pounds for each offence.
- 3. No person in a state of intoxication shall be allowed to enter or remain in any part of the Town Hall building.
- enter or remain in any part of the Town Hall building.

  4. Any person found smoking in the main hall or auditorium or public hall or in the staircase hall or lobby or in any corridor or passage (save and except that part of the corridor or passage between the front door and the staircase lobby) or in the kitchen of the said Town Hall building or found intoxicated or using profane or improper language or who is guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever whereby annoyance or discomfort is caused to other persons than in the Town Hall building shall be forthwith removed therefrom by the lessee or his servant or servants and if necessary by a constable and shall not be permitted to re-enter during any meeting or performance then being held. The hallkeeper of the Council

or any other person acting with the authority of the Council or Town Clerk thereof may also remove or cause to be removed or Town Clerk thereof may also remove or tause to be removed any person so smoking or being intoxicated or using profane or improper language or who is guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever whereby annoyance or discomfort is caused to other persons then in the Town Hall building.

5. No offensive personalities nor anything calculated to produce riot or breach of the peace shall be permitted in the

produce riot or breach of the peace snan be permitted in subuilding.

6. Notwithstanding the provisions of clauses 1 and 2 of this By-law smoking may be permitted at a banquet held in any part of the Town Hall but only in the room wherein the banquet is held and so long as ordinary and reasonable precautions and safeguards against fire breaking out are taken and observed by the person or persons smoking.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that part of the Municipal District upon which is erected the Town Hall and Borough Offices of the Borough of Hamilton.

4. Every person who drives rides or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left hand side of the carriage way and whenever he or she shall overtake with such machine any vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger proceeding or standing on the street or carriage way he shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing such vehicle horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his or her machine by sounding a bell or whistle.

5. Every person driving riding or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle animal or foot passenger and shall give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach by sounding a bell or whistle.

6. In every case where a person riding driving or impelling

In every case where a person riding driving or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any vehicle drawn by a horse or other beast of burden and where such horse or other beast or other beast of burden and where such horse or other beast of burden on such meeting or overtaking becomes restive or alarmed or ceases to be under the due control of the person in charge of same the person riding driving or impelling such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible and shall continue dismounted as long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. No person driving riding or impelling a machine in Graystreet, Thomson-street, French-street, Lonsdale-street, Kennedy-street, McIntyre-street or Brown-street or any part thereof shall proceed at a greater speed than at the rate of eight miles per hour.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
