4. The following Rules shall be substituted in lieu of said Parts 2 and 3 of the Insolvency Rules 1917. So far as practicable and unless otherwise expressly provided these Rules shall apply to all matters pending or arising and to all proceedings taken in any matters under the *Insolvency Act 1915* except proceedings under Part II. of the said Act and any matters in which jurisdiction is given by the said Act to the Supreme Court or a Judge thereof.

5. Bills of costs shall be written lengthwise, distinguishing by insertion in separate columns costs out of pocket from charges for work done and time expended. Dates shall be furnished to each item but they must not be written in the margin, which shall be left clear for taxation.

6. No instructions for an affidavit shall be allowed when the solicitor or his clerk makes the affidavit unless it is necessary to make inquiries specially for the purpose of making such affidavit.

7. The allowances for instructions and drawing an affidavit in answer to interrogatories and other special affidavits, and attending the deponent to be sworn, shall include all attendances on the deponent to settle and read over.

8. The fees allowed for delivery of documents services and notices shall not be allowed when the same solicitor is for both parties unless it be necessary for the purpose of making an affidavit of service.

9. The fees allowed for perusals shall not apply where the same solicitor is for both parties.

10. Where the same solicitor is employed for two or more persons having the same interest, and separate papers are delivered, or other proceedings had by or for two or more such persons separately, the Taxing Officer shall consider, on the taxation of such solicitor's bill of costs either between party and party or between solicitor and client, whether such separate papers or other proceedings were necessary or proper, and if he is of opinion that any part of the costs occasioned thereby has been unnecessarily or improperly incurred, the same shall be disallowed.

11. A folio is to comprise 72 words, every figure comprised in a column being counted as one word.

12. In cases where a barrister and solicitor acts both as Counsel and solicitor or appears as Counsel instructed by his partner acting as solicitor neither he nor his partner shall be entitled to make any charge for "instructions for brief" nor for "drawing" nor "engrossing brief" but in lieu of all such charges such barrister and solicitor or partner as the case may be shall be entitled to such fees as may be allowed by the Taxing Officer for "preparing for hearing or examination" and for "preparing brief notes."

13. Where costs have been ordered to be paid in any matter by the opposite party to a Trustee such order shall not prevent the Trustee from having his costs in the matter taxed as between Solicitor and client as mentioned in Rule 326 of the Insolvency Rules 1917.

14. As to all fees or allowances which are discretionary, the same are, unless otherwise provided, to be allowed at the discretion of the Taxing Officer, who, in the exercise of such discretion, is to take into consideration the other fees and allowances to the Solicitor and Counsel (if any) in respect of the work to which any such allowance applies, the nature and importance of the matter, the amount involved, the interest of the parties, the estate or persons to bear the costs, the general conduct and costs of the proceedings, and all other circumstances.

15. Any person who may be dissatisfied with the allowance or disallowance by the Taxing Officer in any bill of costs taxed by him of the whole or any part of any items, may, at any time before the certificate or allocatur is signed carry in before the Taxing Officer an objection in writing to such allowance or disallowance, specifying therein by a list, in a short and concise form, the items or parts thereof objected to and the grounds and reasons for such objection and may thereupon apply to the Taxing Officer to review the taxation in respect of the same.

16. Upon such application the Taxing Officer shall reconsider and review his taxation upon such objections, and he may if he shall think fit, receive further evidence in respect thereof, and, if so required by the solicitor or any person interested, he shall state either in his certificate of taxation or allocatur, or by reference to such objection, the grounds and reasons of his decision thereon, and any special facts or circumstances relating thereto.

17. Any person who may be dissatisfied with the certificate or allocatur of the taxing officer as to any item or part of an item which may have been objected to as aforesaid may, within fourteen days from the date of the certificate or allocatur, or such other time as the Court or Judge or the Taxing Officer at the time he signs his certificate or allocatur, may allow, apply to the Judge for an order to review the taxation as to the same item, or part of an item, and the Judge may thereupon make such order as the Judge may think just without being bound by the discretion of the Taxing Officer, but the certificate or allocatur of the Taxing Officer shall be final and conclusive as to all matters which shall not have been objected to in manner aforesaid.

18. Such application shall be heard and determined by the Judge upon the evidence which shall have been brought in before the Taxing Officer and no further evidence shall be received upon the hearing thereof unless the Judge shall otherwise direct.

19. The fees payable on taxation of costs, except where otherwise provided, shall be taken on signing the certificate, or on the allowance of the bill of costs as taxed; but the fees shall be due and payable, if no certificate or allocatur is required, on the amount of the bill as taxed, or on the amount of such part thereof as may be taxed, and the solicitor or party acting in person shall in such case cause the proper stamps (the amount thereof to be fixed by the officer) to be impressed on or affixed to the bill of costs.

20. The Taxing Officer may require a deposit of stamps on account of fees before taxation not exceeding the fees on the full amount of the costs as submitted for taxation, and the officer or his clerk taking such deposit shall make a memorandum thereof on the bill of costs.

BOROUGH OF ARARAT.

BY-LAW UNDER THE WATER ACTS.

ACTING under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ararat hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a Water Rate within the Water Supply District of Ararat as duly defined:—

By-law No. 16.

1. A rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound sterling is hereby made for the year ending 30th September, 1922, on the valuation of each tenement built upon or to which water is laid on within the said Water Supply District of Ararat, with a minimum of One pound ten shillings sterling. On vacant allotments in streets where the Council mains are laid, the rate shall be Five per cent. on the municipal valuation of such allotments.

2. The foregoing rates shall be due and payable on the first day of February, 1922.

3. Such person or persons as the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ararat may appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

BOROUGH OF INGLEWOOD.

BY-LAW No. 41.—MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES FOR THE YEAR 1922.

THE Inglewood Borough Council doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following rate, from the first day of January, 1922, to the thirty-first day of December, 1922, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Inglewood, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

- On every house or tenement of the annual value of £5 and under, the annual sum of Thirteen shillings and fourpence (13s. 4d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £5, and not exceeding £10, the annual sum of Twenty shillings (20s.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10, and not exceeding £20, the annual sum of Twenty-six shillings and eightpence (26s. 8d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding £30, the annual sum of Forty shillings (40s.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £30, and not exceeding £40, the annual sum of Fifty-three shillings and fourpence (53s. 4d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £40, and not exceeding £50, the annual sum of Sixty-six shillings and eightpence (66s. 8d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £50, and not exceeding £60, the annual sum of Eighty shillings (80s.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £60, and not exceeding £70, the annual sum of Ninety-three shillings and fourpence (93s. 4d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £70, and not exceeding £80, the annual sum of Five pounds six shillings and eightpence (£5 6s. 8d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £80, and not exceeding £90, the annual sum of Six pounds (£6).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £90, and not exceeding £100, the annual sum of Six pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence (£6 13s. 4d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100, and not exceeding £120, the annual sum of Eight pounds (£8).

- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £120, and not exceeding £140, the annual sum of Nine pounds six shillings and eightpence (£9 6s. 8d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £140, and not exceeding £160, the annual sum of Ten pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence (£10 13s. 4d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £160, and not exceeding £180, the annual sum of Twelve pounds (£12).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £180, and not exceeding £200, the annual sum of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £200, and not exceeding £225, the annual sum of Thirteen pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence (£13 13s. 4d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £225, and not exceeding £250, the annual sum of Fourteen pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence (£14 13s. 4d.).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £250, and not exceeding £275, the annual sum of Sixteen pounds (£16).
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £275, and not exceeding £300, the annual sum of Sixteen pounds three shillings and fourpence (£16 3s. 4d.).

The Water Supply District shall include all occupied lands and tenements within the pink line marked on the plan now exhibited in the Council Chambers with the borough seal stamped thereon, and having the signature of the Mayor—Thomas Tatchell, Esq.

Owners of steam-engines or other property not being dwellings requiring water for same may be supplied by entering into a special agreement with the Council; and all persons whose tenements and property are outside the Water Supply District may be supplied by making special arrangements with the Council. Charges for hotels and other tenements having stables to be 10s. per stall per annum.

Water troughs and stand-pipes on the footpaths, streets, or outside property will not be permitted.

The owner of any tenement or property permitting or allowing any person to carry away water excepting for the use of the tenement or property belonging thereto will be liable to have the water cut off.

The above rate is payable half-yearly in advance on 1st January and 1st July, 1922.

#### BAIRNSDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1922.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following By-law determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply within the Urban District of the Trust during the calendar year 1922:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land, houses, and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such land-owners, or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which land, houses, or tenements if not on such street are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes from the year commencing on the first day of January, 1922, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1922, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges:—

- On every house or tenement of £20 annual municipal valuation of under, Twenty shillings per annum.
- On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of £20, at a rate of One shilling for every one pound per annum of such valuation.
- On all vacant allotments of land, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of municipal value thereof, except where there is a water service to the allotment, when the minimum charge shall be One pound.
- For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of 6d. per hundred gallons, or 6d. for any fractional part thereof, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

- For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or water supplied under the terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per one thousand gallons.
- Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, and butchers, livery and coach horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- Water supplied to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens shall be charged by agreement or measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- Private water troughs shall be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of Twenty shillings shall mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when in the opinion of the Trust a meter shall be necessary.
- The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons, by measurement at the discretion of the Trust, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the rate-payer.
- For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of 1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.
- The service for conveying the water from the pipes of the Trust to the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—
  - For domestic supply of premises with annual municipal valuation of £40 or over, a three-quarter-inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust. For domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual valuation, half-inch diameter.
  - For the supply of water other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.
- Each house or tenement must be provided with separate service from the main.
- Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for domestic supply may be allowed for at the discretion of the Trust.

2. The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and all charges for water supplied otherwise than by meter or by special agreement, shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the first day of January, 1922, and the first day of July, 1922.

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when owner or occupier shall become liable to pay rates for the supply of water hereinbefore mentioned.

In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922.

THE Benalla Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law for the making of a rate on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Benalla Waterworks Trust:—

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Benalla Waterworks District according to the valuation for the time being

The minimum rate payable in respect of any property liable to be rated shall be One pound sterling for lands or tenements supplied with water from the pipes of the Trust, and Ten shillings for every piece of vacant or unoccupied land not so supplied, as fixed by the Governor in Council.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

#### BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, viz.:-

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1922. Such rates and charges shall be deemed to be due and payable, in advance, on the first day of January, 1922, but the Trust may accept payment of the same by four quarterly instalments, payable on the first January, first April, first July, and first October, of the said year, without prejudice to its right to recover the whole year's rate. That is to say:-

2. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Two shillings in the pound on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Thirty shillings.

3. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum under this clause to be Thirty shillings.

4. On every livery stable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory using water in connexion with its machinery or treatment, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings, and on every flour mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds.

5. On every steam engine (not including any steam engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4), a sum of One pound.

6. On every horse trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

7. The area of land allowed for each house or tenement paying the ordinary rate herein imposed shall not exceed one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Five shillings shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood. Only one service-pipe connexion with the Trust's mains will be allowed to each house or tenement rated herein, and such service-pipe shall not exceed  $\frac{3}{4}$  of an inch in diameter.

8. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings and/or additions and/or alteration to existing buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering shall be made; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or on amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention so to do.

##### Cases where Water is not Laid On.

9. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Fifteen shillings.

10. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any above-mentioned tenement, and facing a street or land in which a water main is laid contiguous thereto, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Five shillings.

11. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice, in writing, to the Trust's Secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless the water is turned off for a full quarter, nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

##### Water Supplied by Measure.

12. The charge for water supplied to market and other gardens and nurseries over one-quarter of an acre in area shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, such supply to be in every

case by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the customer after being approved by the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be (20,000) twenty thousand gallons. The service-pipe for the supply of such water shall not exceed 1 inch in diameter.

13. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crop without a permit from the Secretary of the Trust; who shall, subject to the approval of the Trust, issue the same. The fee for such permit shall be £1 10s. for each one-eighth ( $\frac{1}{8}$ ) or part of one-eighth ( $\frac{1}{8}$ ) of an acre to be irrigated. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains more than one-quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of an acre of any land unless a meter be attached to the service-pipe supplying such land. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

14. The charge for water supplied to any "bowling club" shall be £10 per annum, such supply to be by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the consumer after being approved by the Trust.

15. The Trust may require a meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any house or tenement in any case where it deem the same necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 12 shall apply to such house or tenement.

16. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of clauses 12, 13, or 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

17. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each (100) one hundred gallons.

18. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

19. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the above-mentioned rates and charges.

20. In the construction of this By-law the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force on the 1st January, 1922; the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust; and the word "tenement" as used herein shall be deemed to include the whole of the land held or used by or on behalf of one person, as one contiguous property, whether divided into two or more parts by fences or not.

An annual charge of Five shillings per year shall be made for each head of stock more than two (whether horses or cattle) kept on any premises along the line of mains unless meters are placed on the service-pipes to such premises, in which case the provisions of clause 3 of the General Regulations shall apply.

4. Such rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1922.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Koroit Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1922, No. 3.

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Orbost Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Rating By-law, viz.:—

A By-law for determining the rate which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1922 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Twenty-six pounds (£26) sterling.

2. A minimum rate of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Twenty-six pounds (£26).

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling on the net annual value of such rateable property valued over Ten pounds (£10), provided that no such allotment shall pay less than One pound (£1) sterling.

4. For every water trough a charge of Thirty shillings (30s.) per annum; maximum amount of water for each trough, 30,000 gallons.

5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) sterling per annum for every horse-power of such boiler.

6. For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for every load of two hundred (200) gallons or under, a charge of Two shillings (2s.), to be paid on delivery.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling (1s.) for every thousand (1,000) gallons.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be—If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

9. Such before-mentioned rates and charges shall be based on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Orbost for the time being, and (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the first day of July, 1922.

10. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Orbost Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

## RUTHERGLEN WATERWORKS TRUST.

## BY-LAW MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES FOR THE YEAR 1922.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Rutherglen Waterworks Trust (the Waterworks District of the Trust having been proclaimed an Urban District) do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rate for the year 1922 upon all lands and tenements within the said Urban District, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes—

On every house or tenement whether occupied or not, or allotment of land by which a main passes, the sum equivalent to a rate of Three shillings in the £1 per annum, with a minimum charge of Two pounds (£2) on every house or tenement and One pound (£1) on allotments of land.

Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1922, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

The charge for water supplied by measure outside the Trust's area shall be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum of One pound (£1) per annum for each service.

Water supplied to Government Departments or public bodies shall be by measurement or special agreement.

The Trust may by notice intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises within its Waterworks District using water for domestic or other than domestic purposes that the supply is to be charged for by measure, and by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within one month from the date of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner within the time specified at his own expense shall provide such meter with a certificate from some approved authority that same is in proper order, and shall so maintain same, and if any person neglect to comply with such notice such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Such occupiers or owners as are supplied with water per meter shall pay at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

The Trust will upon application supply a meter at cost price for cash on delivery.

## SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates for 1922 which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

(1) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be paid.

(2) For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds, and not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

(3) For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound fifteen shillings shall be paid.

(4) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, and not exceeding Thirty-seven pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound seventeen shillings and sixpence shall be paid.

(5) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Thirty-seven pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

(6) The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be:—Under Seven pounds—Seven shillings and sixpence, over Seven pounds the rate shall be One shilling in the pound per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

(7) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from the stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

(8) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other purposes shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 54,000 gallons.

(9) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st of July, 1922.

(10) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

#### TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 1, 1922.

**T**HE Tatura Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of all lands and tenements within the district of the said Waterworks Trust comprised in and affected by any notice or notices heretofore or hereafter to be published in the *Government Gazette* pursuant to sections 236 and 237 of the *Water Act 1915*:—

For the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure—

(a) For all lands and tenements within the said district, excepting and excluding all lands set out and described in paragraph (b) hereof, a rate of One shilling and eightpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

(b) For every Crown allotment and lesser piece of land upon which no building is erected, or which is unoccupied or vacant, and which is not supplied with water, a rate of Ten shillings for every such Crown allotment or lesser piece thereof.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1922, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1922, and shall be payable in equal half-yearly moieties, in advance, on the first days of January and July in the year 1922.

3. The valuation for the time being of the lands and tenements within the said district, for the municipal rate in the municipal district of the shire of Rodney in which such lands and tenements are situated, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purpose of making and levying such rates.

4. Water will also be supplied by measurement, and in such case the party desiring to be supplied must provide the meter, and maintain the same in good working order and pay for the water according to measurement thereby at the rate following:—

(a) For steam boilers, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(b) For shire water troughs, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(c) In all other cases, water supplied by the Trust by measurement will be charged for at the rate of One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons until the amount payable equals the amount of the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied. Excess water over and above such amount will be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to 200,000 gallons, over and above 200,000 gallons Sixpence per each additional 1,000 gallons; and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will, in each case, be fixed by the Trust.

5. Water will also be supplied for the year in paragraph two hereof set out for watering gardens according to the area hereof, and the following scale of charges payable yearly in advance on the 1st day of January, 1922, is hereby fixed for water supplied otherwise than by measure for watering gardens:—

(a) For water supplied solely for watering gardens not exceeding in area 75 square yards, Ten shillings.

(b) For water supplied solely for watering gardens not exceeding in area 150 square yards, Twenty shillings.

6. Supplies of water for any purpose not specified herein, and otherwise than by measure, must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment of such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken.

7. The minimum amount to be paid for water supplied by measurement for domestic purposes only, or both for domestic purposes and for purposes other than domestic combined, shall be the amount which at One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied otherwise than by measure.

8. For water supplied by measure, the minimum charge therefor being the same amount as the rate for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure shall be paid half-yearly in advance, upon the same days as the said rate is hereinbefore made payable, and shall be deemed to be in satisfaction of the said rate, and the excess over and above the amount allowed by the rate shall be paid for upon demand in writing immediately after the amount thereof shall be ascertainable by the reading of the meter at the end of each year.

9. In no case will water be supplied to any person whatsoever at a lesser rate or charge than Twenty shillings sterling per annum.

10. Such person or persons as the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and all moneys made payable hereunder.

5. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in one sum on the first day of January, 1922.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922.**

**T**HE Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following Rating By-law:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings.
2. For every house or tenement of annual municipal valuation exceeding Twenty pounds, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound.
3. For every unoccupied allotment of land and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value of such allotment.
4. For every water trough, a charge of Seventeen shillings and sixpence.
5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Seventeen shillings and sixpence for every horse-power of such boiler.
6. For stand-pipe or hydrant water for each load of two hundred gallons or under, a charge of Two shillings and sixpence, to be paid on delivery.
7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of Two shillings and sixpence for every thousand gallons.
8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be:—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1922.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 39 of the *Fire Brigades Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2653) His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve the following additional regulations which have been prepared by the Country Fire Brigades Board, viz. :—

## COMPENSATION IN CASE OF DEATH.

That a fund be established by the Board paying out of its revenue such sum or sums as the Board may from time to time consider necessary, but not exceeding an aggregate of two hundred and fifty pounds in any one year, to provide for payment in case of death of any member of a brigade as hereinafter indicated, such sum to be invested in such manner as the Board may from time to time direct, all interest accruing from investments to be placed to the credit of the fund.

An amount, to be determined by the Board, but not to exceed the sum of Five hundred pounds, may be granted out of the said fund to the wife or other dependants of a member of the service killed in the execution of his duty at fires or practices, or when death is proved by medical testimony, and to the satisfaction of the Board, to have been brought about by fire service work. The Board may in its discretion pay the amount decided on as compensation either in one sum or by periodical payments.

## PAYMENT FOR SPECIAL SERVICES.

An amount, to be determined by the Board, but not to exceed the sum of Fifty pounds, may be granted for special services rendered in connexion with the saving of life or property at any fire or for special services rendered to any brigade whether by members of the brigade or by other persons.

## FIRES OUTSIDE FIRE DISTRICTS.

Any registered brigade or portion thereof, or any of its officers or members, or engines or other apparatus, on the authority of the senior officer present at the time, may proceed or be taken beyond the limits of any fire district for the purpose of attending fires; and the Board shall have power to claim and recover charges for services of brigades and appliances, at rates to be fixed by the Board and not exceeding those mentioned in the Third Schedule of the *Fire Brigades Act*, from the owners or occupiers of the premises in which such fires occur.

## RECOGNITION OF LONG SERVICE.

The following paragraph is substituted for paragraph 1 of Regulation No. 18, approved by the Governor in Council on the 2nd October, 1916:—

Officers and members of brigades who shall have efficiently served as registered firemen for not less than twelve (12) years in any one or more brigades under the Country Fire Brigades Board, shall be entitled to the Board's Long Service Badge; and officers and members of brigades who shall have similarly served for not less than ten (10) years shall be entitled, on retirement, to a Certificate setting forth the term of such service. Applications for badges and certificates must be made on forms provided by the Board for such purpose, and they must be duly certified to by the applicant and the captain and secretary of the brigade. Service as a reserve member is not to be counted in the periods of service mentioned in this Regulation, except in the case of the Ballarat City, Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong brigades.

- (e) Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water, Five shillings.
- (f) For any transfer of registration, Two shillings and sixpence.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Town of Coburg.
