VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 257.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as relate thereto or conflict therewith :—

(1) No person by virtue of the fact that he or she is the holder of :—

- (a) a half ticket of the type commonly issued to persons under the age of fourteen years; or
- (b) a ticket upon which the words "Not available for smoking compartment" are written, printed, stamped or impressed; or
- (c) a metal periodical ticket which, pursuant to the by-laws regulating the issue of periodical tickets at reduced fares to students, or to youths and females in business, or to females who are not in business, has been issued at a fare less than the full adult fare for the time being in force

shall be entitled to travel in any smoking compartment of any carriage.

(2) Any person who travels in any smoking compartment of any carriage by means of any such ticket aforesaid may be removed from such compartment by any authorized officer or employé of the Commissioners, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

(3) Nothing in this By-law shall be deemed to prohibit a child who is apparently under the age of fourteen years from travelling in any smoking compartment of any carriage when in the company and under the control of a person who is apparently above the age of twenty-one years who is entitled to travel in any such compartment.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective on and from the 1st day of December, 1921.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 259.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflict therewith:—

1. Goods Rates.

(a) The rate of 2s. 1d. per ton prescribed on page 129 of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 252) for the carriage of coal in 400-ton lots from the Victoria Dock to any station (other than Melbourne) within a radius of six (6) miles thereof, or from Williamstown Pier to any station within a radius of six (6) miles thereof, is hereby abolished, and in lieu thereof this traffic shall be charged for under Class "M" less 5 per cent., provided that the minimum charge shall be 3s. 6d. per ton for distances up to and inclusive of 10 miles and subject to the prescribed truck load minimum of 5 per cent. less than the carrying capacity of the class of truck used.

(b) The rate of 2s. 4d. per ton prescribed on page 129 of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 252) for the carriage of brown coal in truck loads from Lal Lal to Ballarat is hereby abolished, and in lieu thereof this traffic shall be charged for under Class "M" less 5 per cent., subject to the prescribed truck load minimum of 5 per cent. less than the carrying capacity of the class of truck used.

2. Live Stock Rates (Stores).

A charge of 1s. per truck shall be imposed, in addition to the rates prescribed in By-law 256, clause (c), sub-clause (1), for the conveyance of store sheep, cattle, and horses.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective as on and from the first day of January, 1922.

MAFFRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 9.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Maffra Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law:—

(1) The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1922 in respect of water supplied within the Urban District of the Trust:—

(2) For every house or tenement of an annual value of £14 or over, at the rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound of such value.

(3) For every house or tenement of a less annual value than £14, a minimum charge of £1 5s.

(4) For every vacant allotment of land of an annual value of £5 or under, a charge of 5s. For each additional allotment of land rated together with the first allotment, One shilling. Where the annual value of an allotment is over £5, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of the annual value thereof.

(5) For every water trough supplied with water, £1. On vacant lands the rate of payment shall be considered as part payment of this charge of £1. In cases where a large quantity of water is consumed by the use of a trough, as in a paddock where a number of stock are kept, the Trust in its discretion may insist on a meter being installed.

(6) For water supplied by measure, Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons; provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate, except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements. In cases where the occupier quits without paying for the excess water registered by meter, the owner will be held liable for same.

(7) For using a hose for stable watering during the year, Twenty shillings. This payment will entitle the user to an additional 10,000 gallons of water.

(8) For water supplied to new buildings being erected, £1 per centum on the contract price of all brick, stone, cement, or other work where water is used. In every case where a new building is erected a minimum charge of Ten shillings shall be paid by the owner.

(9) Water supplied to manufactories, railways, livery stables or paddocks, for other than domestic purposes may be charged at a special rate, or by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

(10) The Trust may, by notice in writing, require any owner or occupier using water through a hose, or for other than domestic purposes to provide a meter within two weeks from the date of such notice, the expense of providing the meter is to be borne by such occupier or owner.

(11) No person shall use water by means of a hose for watering gardens, washing cars or buggies, cleaning windows or for other than domestic purposes unless such water is registered by an approved meter.

(12) Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste, or who uses it in an unauthorized manner, or who does not provide a meter when requested so to do. When the water is cut off from any premises the owner or occupier must pay the sum of One pound to be reconnected with the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of 8 o'clock p.m. and 6 o'clock a.m. For the purpose of conserving water during dry weather or for extensions or repairs, the Trust in its discretion may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

(13) For water supplied through any stand-pipe or hydrant, a charge of One shilling for each 200 gallons.

(14) For all lands or tenements in the said district situate otherwise than in streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and in which tenements are not supplied with water from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe or hydrant for the supply of water, one half the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are more than a quarter of a mile and less than half a mile from such stand-pipe or hydrant, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates, or be charged at a rate at the discretion of the Trust.

(15) For every plumber's licence £1 per year ending 31st December, 1922.

(16) The foregoing rates and charges are payable in two moieties in advance, on the 1st day of February, 1922, and the 1st day of August, 1922. Interest at the rate of (6 per cent) Six pounds per centum per annum will be charged on amounts six months overdue. Amounts under Two pounds are to be paid in one sum in advance on the 1st day of February, 1922. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint shall be authorized to demand and collect the said rates and charges.

Every person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Ten shillings, for every day such breach is committed or continued.

WINCHELSEA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1922.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities, conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:—

By-law No. 10.

The following are the rates and charges which occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1922 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District thereof:—

1. For every house and tenement up to £16 annual municipal value and under, the sum of £2 16s. (Two pounds sixteen shillings) per annum.

2. For every house and tenement of £17 annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Three shillings and sixpence to the £1 upon the municipal value of such property.

3. Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months commencing on the first day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied or supplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound one shilling sterling per annum.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied or supplied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Three shillings and sixpence in the £1 upon the municipal value of such property.

6. Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs, and to Government grounds, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement at 2s. (Two shillings) per 1,000 gallons.

7. For water supplied from stand-pipe, or hydrant, there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons or under, the sum of Ninepence.

8. For a supply during the erection of new buildings, there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

9. Except hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of assessed rates which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and for water in excess of such minimum, there shall be a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

10. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be £1, renewals 5s.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, or in other cases as directed by the secretary, and shall be payable in two equal instalments. The first payment shall be made on the first day of January, 1922, for half-year ending 30th June, 1922, and the second payment shall be made on the first day of July, 1922, for the half-year ending 31st December, 1922. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919* (No. 3041); and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Common Hospitals for Infectious Diseases (appointment of Committees of Management) Regulations 1921, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or interpretation—

“Common hospital” means a hospital provided by two or more councils in combination for the accommodation, maintenance, and treatment of persons suffering from infectious disease.

3. When two or more councils combine in providing a common hospital each of such councils shall forthwith nominate for appointment to the committee of management of such hospital the number of persons following (that is to say):—

(a) when two councils have so combined, three persons;

(b) when three or more councils have so combined, two persons.

4. If, after two councils have combined in providing a common hospital, and the Governor in Council has appointed their representatives to the committee of management, such councils further combine with one or more other councils in respect of such hospital, the representation of each of such first-mentioned councils on the committee of management shall continue to be three members until the expiration of the term of office of such members when the representation shall be two members for each council acting in combination.

Fourteen days at least before proceeding to nominate any person for appointment to any such committee any council combining as aforesaid shall give public notice of its intention so to do by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in its municipal district. Such notice shall invite applications in writing from persons who are willing to accept nomination.

6. Every such nomination shall—

(a) be in writing shall be under the seal of the council and shall set out the full Christian and surnames of the nominee as well as his occupation and address;

7. No alien, no uncertificated or undischarged bankrupt or insolvent, no person who applies to take the benefit of any Act for the relief of insolvent debtors or by any deed or writing compounds with his creditors, no person attainted of treason or convicted of felony or perjury or any infamous crime, no person of unsound mind shall be eligible for nomination for appointment as a member of a committee of management of a common hospital or be capable of being or continuing a member of any such committee.

8. When the seat of any member of a committee of management becomes vacant, the council, upon whose nomination such member was or might have been appointed shall immediately take steps to fill the vacancy, and the provisions of these Regulations shall apply as in the case of an original nomination.

Every member of a committee of management shall, subject to these Regulations, be entitled to hold office for three years from the date of his appointment (except in the case of a member appointed to fill a casual vacancy when such member shall be entitled to hold office only for the unexpired portion of the period for which his predecessor was appointed), and shall be eligible for nomination and re-appointment in manner aforesaid.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION AT SKIPTON.

THE Council of the Shire of Hampden, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for the purposes of Public Recreation at Skipton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

(1) The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for

cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

(2) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(3) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

(4) No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

(5) No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(6) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(7) No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(8) No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(9) No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

(10) No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

(11) No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

(12) Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy of hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

(13) No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
