## BY-LAW No. 260.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby alter the by-laws specified in paragraph 1 hereof to the extent to which the said by-laws are in paragraph 2 hereof expressed to be altered:—

1. **Marine Act 1915.****REGULATIONS FOR THE SELECTION OF SKILLED MEMBERS OF THE COURT OF MARINE INQUIRY.**

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act* 1915, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. **Short Title.**—These Regulations may be cited as “The Regulations for the Selection of Skilled Members, 1922.”

2. **Commencement and Repeal.**—These Regulations shall take effect on and from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, from which date the Regulations for the Selection of Skilled Members made by the Board on the 16th day of May, 1890, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th day of May, 1890, shall be and stand repealed.

3. **Classes of which persons eligible for appointment as Members of Court of Marine Inquiry to consist.**—The skilled members of the Court of Marine Inquiry shall be divided into the following five classes, and no person shall be considered eligible for appointment as one of such skilled members who does not possess such qualifications as would permit of his being placed in one of such classes:—

Class 1.—Masters possessing a certificate of competency as such who have served five years in command of a ship since the granting of such certificate, one year of which service at least must have been in command of a sailing ship.

Class 2.—Masters possessing a certificate of competency as such who have served five years in command of a ship since the granting of such certificate, two years of which service at least must have been in command of a steamship.

Class 3.—Engineers who have served five years as engineers in the merchant service, and who, at the time of their selection by the Board as eligible for appointment as skilled members hold first class certificates of competency.

Class 4.—Port Phillip pilots, or masters holding at the time of their selection by the Board exemption certificates within the meaning of the *Marine Act* 1915 qualifying the holders to act within the port of Port Phillip as pilots to vessels unrestricted as to the channels to be resorted to for navigation and also as pilots to vessels within the port of Melbourne (including the River Yarra) and the port of Geelong.

Class 5.—Persons of known scientific attainments of such a nature as would qualify them to investigate any scientific question relating in any manner to the conduct of navigation or the build or management of ships.

4. *Tenue of Office*.—Persons appointed as skilled members shall hold office from the date specified in their respective appointments until the 30th day of June next following such date so specified.

5. *Board to Prepare List*.—The Marine Board shall at some convenient time during the month of June in each year, prepare a list of persons not exceeding twenty, and not less than fifteen in number, who, in their opinion, are eligible for appointment as skilled members of the Court of Marine Inquiry; and, in selecting the persons whose names are to be placed on such list, the Board shall take care that the number eligible for appointment as members of each of the aforesaid classes of skilled members of the Court of Marine Inquiry shall be as nearly equal as may be practicable.

6. *List to be Forwarded to Minister*.—Such list shall be forwarded by the Secretary to the Marine Board not later than the 14th day of June to the Minister, for submission to the Governor in Council, for the purpose of a selection being made therefrom of persons for appointment as skilled members of the Court of Marine Inquiry.

7. *Extraordinary Vacancies*.—If any vacancy or vacancies in the number of skilled members appointed by the Governor in Council occur from death, resignation, or any other cause, the Marine Board shall, with all convenient despatch, after being notified of the same by the Minister, submit names not exceeding four and not less than two in number, for each vacancy, of persons who may be eligible to fill such vacancy or vacancies, from which names the Governor in Council may select the person or persons to fill such vacancy or vacancies, provided the person or persons so selected shall possess the qualifications necessary for appointment to the class to which the person or persons in whose place he or they are appointed respectively belonged.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this twenty-third day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

#### SHIRE OF RIPON.

BY-LAW NO. 25.—MAKING AND LEVYING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do hereby, in pursuance and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the By-law following for the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council:—

##### PART I.

1. A rate for the year hereinafter mentioned is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning of the *Local Government Act* 1915, within the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council, according to the valuation for the time being of such land and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district of the said shire within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated for the supply of water for domestic purposes other than by measure, and such rate shall consist of the rates and charges hereinafter specified.

##### PART II.—THE BEAUFORT WATER SUPPLY.

2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Beaufort Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement (including vacant allotments supplied with water) save as hereinafter provided, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of such house or tenement, but in no case, save as hereinafter pro-

vided, shall such rate be less than the minimum sum of Twenty shillings, and, in addition to such rate there shall be payable a further sum of Five shillings for each garden, upon a tenement and a further sum of Five shillings for each horse kept or usually watered on such tenement. For each water trough (public) supplied with water, the sum of Ten shillings; for every steam boiler supplied the sum of Fifteen shillings. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

- (b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon, and to which water-pipes are not laid, but having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any main pipe laid for the supply of water from the Beaufort Water Supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such land or opposite some portion of such frontage, the minimum sum of Ten shillings. Nothing in this sub-section contained shall be deemed to apply to land adjoining and used in connexion with any other tenement.

3. "The Beaufort Water Supply" means and includes the reservoirs (with their respective systems of reticulation) known as Jackson's Reservoir and the Goldfields Reservoir, situate to the north and south respectively of the township of Beaufort, and the springs and races which feed such reservoirs.

##### PART III.—THE JOINT WATER SUPPLY.

4. The rates and charges hereinafter mentioned are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the joint water supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council and which is supplied by the Council with water from the joint water supply, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

5. "The Joint Water Supply" means the race running from the springs at Mount Cole to Jackson's Reservoir.

##### PART IV.—THE WATERLOO SUPPLY.

6. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Waterloo water supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any pipe laid for the supply of water from the Waterloo supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such house or tenement or opposite some portion of such frontage, the sum of One pound per annum.

7. "The Waterloo Supply" means "The Waterloo Reservoir" (with reticulation therefrom) situated on or near the boundaries of the parishes of Raglan and Beaufort, and being about 5 miles in a northerly direction from the township of Beaufort.

##### PART V.

8. Such rate as aforesaid is made, and shall be levied for the year beginning on the 1st day of October, 1921, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1922, and shall be payable at the office of the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, at the Shire Hall, Beaufort, immediately after the expiration of one month from the publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the notice required by the Water Acts.

9. Such person or persons as the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, and the common seal thereof was hereunto affixed this 13th day of February, 1922, in the presence of—

## EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN PORTION OF THE TOWN OF SANDRINGHAM.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Hampton and Sandringham Wards of the municipal district of the town of Sandringham, of the particular classes to be effected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, tobacconists' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the Hampton and Sandringham Wards of the municipal district of the town of Sandringham shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*;

- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—

- (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday;  
 (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;  
 (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

## RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF WARRACKNABEAL.

**W**HEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) it is, amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders amongst other things to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of £1,500 a shire: And it is further enacted that every Order constituting any new shire shall assign a name to such shire, describe the boundaries thereof, determine of how many members the council shall consist, determine whether the municipal district constituted is to be subdivided or not, and in case it is to be subdivided name and describe the subdivisions; and it is further enacted that every Order severing any district from any subdivided municipal district may abolish all the subdivisions and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or re-subdivide the same, and that every Order under the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of portion of the shire of Kerang, praying that a certain area described in such petition, being part of the North-east and South-east Ridings of the shire of Kerang, be severed from the said shire and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Cohuna: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner described by the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a new shire to be named the Shire of Cohuna, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said shire of Kerang and of the South-east and North-east Ridings as amended, shall be those hereunder set forth and described, and doth further Order that the said new shire of Cohuna be subdivided into three ridings, to be named the Central Riding, the East Riding, and the West Riding, the boundaries of which shall be those hereunder set forth and described, and doth further Order that the council of the said shire shall consist of nine members.

And such fees shall be paid to the Shire Secretary at the Shire Hall, Sunshine, once at least in every month, and the amount of such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the Meat Inspector.

A By-law of the shire of Fern Tree Gully made under section 286 of the *Health Act* 1919, and numbered 22, for prescribing the fees for registration and renewal, and transfer of registration of premises required to be registered under the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1919, and by the *Local Government Act* 1915, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Fern Tree Gully do order as follows:—

For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and sixpence.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

SHIRE OF MORNINGTON.

By-LAW No. 30.

A By-law of the Shire of Mornington, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered 30.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington, make the following By-law:—

1. This By-law shall come into force immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the shire of Mornington.

3. No person shall carry on a business, trade or calling hereunder specified unless same is registered with the Council, and the fee for such registration will be at the rate of:—

- (1) Cattle Sale Yards—One pound per annum.
- (2) Offensive Trades Premises—One pound per annum.
- (3) Boarding Houses—Ten shillings per annum.
- (4) Common Lodging Houses—Five shillings per annum.
- (5) Eating Houses—Five shillings per annum.
- (6) Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings per annum.
- (7) For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and sixpence.

4. Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds for the first offence, and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

The resolution for passing this By-law, numbered 30, was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Mornington on the eighth day of September, 1921, and confirmed on the eleventh day of November, 1921.
