REGULATIONS IN RELATION TO TOLLS.

PURSUANT to the powers in that behalf conferred upon the River Murray Commission by the *River Murray Waters Act 1915*, the Commission hereby makes the Regulations set forth hereunder.

Whereas by the *River Murray Waters Act 1915* the River Murray Commission (hereinafter referred to as "the Commission"), appointed for the purposes of the said Act is empowered to make regulations prescribing *inter alia* tolls pursuant to the said Act that may be demanded and received in respect of vessels and prescribing a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds for a breach of any regulation.

Now therefore the Commission in pursuance of the powers it in that behalf enabling hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the River Murray Tolls Regulations 1922. Short title.
2. In these Regulations unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.
 - "lock" includes navigable pass;
 - "lockmaster" means the person in charge of the lock at Blanchetown under authority from the Government of South Australia;
 - "master" means the person in charge of a vessel and, in relation to vessels towed by another vessel, the person in charge of the last-mentioned vessel.
3. There shall be payable to the person thereto authorized by the Government of South Australia in respect of any vessel Tolls. passing through the lock at Blanchetown upon each occasion that the vessel passes through that lock tolls at the rate of Sixpence per ton of the freight carried by the vessel through the lock.
4. The master of each vessel passing through the lock at Blanchetown shall furnish to the lockmaster as and when Master to required by him a statement in accordance with the form in the Schedule to these Regulations. furnish statement.
5. Any person who fails to comply with any requirement made by or under these Regulations shall be guilty of an Offences. Offences.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.

MARYSVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Marysville Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Acts*, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1922 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Trust, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling-house is erected of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Four pounds or under, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence sterling.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds, a rate of 15 per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds except where a meter is used.

4. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be charged.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.

6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

7. No service pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

8. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance on the thirtieth day of April, 1922.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.
