## MURDER OF ALMA TIRTSCHKE.

£1,000 REWARD AND FREE PARDON OFFERED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act* 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2618), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint

the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

#### Bank Holidays.—

THURSDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1922, at Cheltenham;  
WEDNESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1922, at Newstead.

#### Bank Half-Holidays from the Hour of Twelve o'clock Noon.—

WEDNESDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1922, at Newstead;  
THURSDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1922, at Trafalgar.
