The petitioners state that there is a strong community of interest between the ratepayers of the various portions of territory sought to be included in the proposed shire, and that Sea Lake is the business centre of such territory, and that the granting of the prayer of this petition would greatly facilitate the transaction of municipal business within such territory, and that the rates would be collected with greater facility and the revenue expended to greater advantage; that the seats of local government of the shires of which the territory sought to be included in the proposed shire now forms parts are so far distant from such territory that the respective Councils cannot ascertain and carry out the requirements of such territory and the ratepayers thereof.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the shires of Wycheproof, Swan Hill, and Karkarooc, and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of the shire of Sea Lake, such municipality to be subdivided in such manner as the Governor in Council may direct.

That it is desirable that the views and opinions of the ratepayers who are irrigationists should be more clearly represented in the Council of the Shire of Deakin.

That such representation is not sufficiently made under the present subdivision, whereby the same councillors elected to the Shire Council are required to represent both irrigationists and farmers who are not irrigationists.

That the area of the proposed Central Riding is occupied by ratepayers who are irrigationists.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to re-subdivide the shire as desired into four ridings, to be named the

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS IN THE HAMPTON WARD OF THE TOWN OF SANDRINGHAM.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Hampton ward of the municipal district of the town of Sandringham of the particular classes to be affected doth hereby revoke (in as far as such regulations relate to the Hampton ward of the said municipal district of the town of Sandringham), the Regulations made on the second day of March, 1922, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, tobacconists' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act* 1915), within the Hampton and Sandringham wards of the municipal district of the town of Sandringham shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT IN THE SANDRINGHAM WARD OF THE TOWN OF SANDRINGHAM.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

BOROUGH OF ARARAT.

A By-law of the borough of Ararat made under the *Local Government Act 1915*, *Police Offences Act 1915*, and every other power enabling it in this behalf, and numbered 55, for controlling the management of all reserves under the control of the said Council.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the aforementioned Statutes and every other power enabling it in this behalf, the Council of the borough of Ararat, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said borough, for the purpose of carrying the same into execution within its jurisdiction, orders as follows, that is to say:—

In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, "Reserve" means—

1. Reserve for public gardens, tennis, croquet, bowling and known as Alexandra Park.
2. Reserve for recreational purposes and known as the Recreation Reserve and Cricket Ground.
3. Reserves for water supply purposes and known as Mt. Cole, Langi Ghiran, Olivers Gully, High-street and Copes Hill Water Reserves.
4. Reserve for public and municipal purposes and known as the Market Square.

1. No association, club or similar body, person or persons, shall enter or use any reserve for the purpose of holding any religious lecture, address or entertainment of any kind, without first having obtained the consent of the Council.

2. No person or persons, in or near any reserve, or within the view or hearing of any person or persons being or passing therein or adjacent thereto, shall behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening or insulting manner or use any threatening, abusive or insulting words.

3. The Council may from time to time make charges for the lease of any reserves by clubs, associations, and the such like, and any person or persons may be granted the use of the said reserves for any purposes whatsoever upon application.

4. No person shall bathe in any stream, reservoir, conduit, aqueduct or waterworks belonging to any reserve, or lake or pond in any public gardens, without first having obtained the consent of the Council, and no person shall wash, cleanse, throw or cause to enter therein, any animal whether alive or dead, or any rubbish, filth, stuff or thing of any kind whatsoever or do anything whereby any water or waterworks or water reserves are fouled, obstructed or damaged.

5. No person shall carry any firearms in or through any reserve, or shoot, snare or destroy any wildfowl without the consent of the Council.

6. The Alexandra Park Gardens shall be open from sunrise to sunset on each day of the week, unless permission otherwise be granted by the Council.

7. No person shall pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds or borders or climb or get over any fence, or remove any of the tallies or disturb, damage or destroy or take away any property or thing or throw stone or other missiles or light fires or leave any bottles, fruit, peels, papers, litter or refuse of any kind in any reserve and no person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, books, pamphlets, or papers or throw or scatter any of the aforementioned without the sanction of the Council.

8. No cart or other vehicle shall without the authority of the proper officer of the Council be driven in or through any reserve.

9. No person shall interrupt any workman by conversation or otherwise in any reserve.

10. All cattle, goats, sheep, pigs, poultry or other animals found within any reserve shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

11. No person shall offer or expose for sale in any reserve, any article, fruit or merchandise without the sanction of the Council.

12. No booth, tent or other structure shall be erected in any reserve without the consent of the Council.

13. No children under five years of age will be allowed in any reserve unless in charge of an adult.

14. No person shall expectorate on any paths, seats, or other property in any reserve.

15. No promoter of any entertainment shall oppose or cause to be opposed the inspection of any reserve, leased, by an authorized officer of the Council, during, before or after any entertainment held in any reserve.

16. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to enter any reserve during the period for which such reserve is leased, unless in the proper manner such entrance fees as may be prescribed are duly paid and a ticket or other symbol received and presented.

17. It shall be lawful for the Council, from time to time, to grant licences to anglers to fish in water reserves, and no person shall fish in any such reserve unless in possession of such licence.

18. This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the reserves as aforementioned.

19. Any By-law or Regulation formerly passed in respect to the aforementioned matters are hereby repealed.

20. Any person or persons who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
