## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

## BY-LAW No. 261.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as relate thereto or conflict therewith:—

When a car on an electric street railway is appointed or reserved primarily for the conveyance of passengers who intend to travel beyond a specified point on the particular railway, there shall be payable by any person who travels by such car, but does not intend to proceed thereby beyond the specified point aforesaid, the ordinary fare which would be payable by such person in respect of the particular journey which he or she intends to make were he or she to travel by a car not so appointed or reserved as aforesaid, and, in addition, such special fare as the Commissioners may from time to time fix in that behalf. Any person who travels by any such car appointed or reserved as aforesaid and refuses to pay any special fare which may be payable by such person pursuant to the provisions of this By-law may be removed from the said car by any authorized employé of the Commissioners, and, in addition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective on and from the 1st day of April, 1922.

V. Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile of a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter the assessed rate.

VI. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement shall be paid as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates.

93. Where a prisoner is under these rules and regulations entitled to have a portion of his current sentence of imprisonment remitted, and such current sentence is for an offence committed by such prisoner whilst at large during the remitted portion of a previous sentence, an amount of time equal to the remitted portion of such previous sentence shall be deducted from the amount of time to be remitted from the current sentence. If the remitted portion of such previous sentence is greater than the amount of time to be remitted from the current sentence, then the prisoner shall not be entitled to have any portion of the current sentence remitted: Provided that in cases of exceptional good conduct and industry the Inspector General may except any prisoner wholly or partly from the operation of this regulation.

**P**URSUANT to the provisions of Section 40 of the *Firearms Act 1921* (12 Geo. V., No. 3136), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. The forms in Schedule A hereunder or forms to the like effect varied as circumstances require may be issued and shall be sufficient for the purposes of the said Act.
2. There shall be paid the respective fees set out in Schedule B hereunder in respect of the various matters therein mentioned.
3. Books of Particulars of Licences provided for by section 11 of the Act and Registers of Pistols provided for by section 23 of the Act shall be kept at the respective offices of the Police Districts or Divisions where a Superintendent or other officer above the rank of Sergeant of Police is stationed.
4. Registers of Gun Dealers' transactions shall be kept at the respective places of business for which gun dealers' licences are in force.
5. Forms of applications may be obtained free of charge from the Officer in Charge of any Police Station.
6. When the age of an applicant appears to be under eighteen years the issuing officer may require such proof of age as he may deem necessary. Any person wilfully misrepresenting his age or any other material particulars with a view to obtaining a licence permit or certificate of registration shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.
7. A pistol certificate or pistol permit shall not be transferred to another person.
8. An application for a permit or certificate of registration made by a person who has previously obtained a permit or certificate of registration must be accompanied by the production of the expired permit or certificate of registration or satisfactory proof that the same has been destroyed.
9. All expired permits or certificates of registration unless lodged with the application for renewal must within one month from the date of expiry be returned to the officer from whom they were issued or satisfactory proof furnished that they have been lost or destroyed.
10. When the pistol in respect of which a permit is required is to be purchased, used, carried, or kept by the proprietor, manager, or other employee of any bank, financial institution, or business concern for the sole purpose of protecting property of or in the possession of such bank, institution, or concern, either on the premises of such bank, institution, or concern or during the conveyance of property to or from such premises, such permit may be issued in the name of the proprietor, manager, or other employee of such bank, institution, or concern, and the pistol in respect of which such permit is issued may be purchased, used, carried, or kept by any other employee of such bank, institution, or concern for the purpose stated, notwithstanding that the name of such employee does not appear on the permit.
11. Any person convicted of a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF MELTON.

WE, James Henry Cunningham, William Whittington, Henry Collard Wraith, Alfred Smith, Michael Kerwin, Augustus Shebler, Isaac Robinson, Thomas Hornbuckle, John Francis Roe, John William Casey, James Frederick Minns, and James Greig, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve in township of Melton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and shall be held responsible for all damage done during their occupancy.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserve, or pollute any water therein, or remove any soil, sand, or manure from the Reserve.

5. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or any property in the Reserve, or roll or throw stones or other missiles thereon, or leave in the Reserve any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

6. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect any dwelling, booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article in the Reserve without permission, in writing, of Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall light any fires in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a cord or chain without the permission, in writing, of Committee of Management, and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Reserve may be liable to be destroyed.

10. No person shall place in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and an account thereof be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

11. No person shall carry on the trade, business, calling or occupation of a bookmaker without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only in and on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for the purpose.

12. No persons shall on Sundays engage in any games, sport, or dancing on the Reserve, or use bicycle track therein.

13. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, shows, or holiday amusements shall be as follows:—For the admission of every adult to the Reserve, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling. For the admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle to the Reserve, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated on the Murray River frontage at and near the locality locally known as Slab Hut, and in the vicinity of Carina and Pound bends, in the parishes of Liparoo and Wemen, county of Karkaroc, and is served by the Hattah and Annuello Railway Stations.

The land is made available for application only by discharged soldiers holding qualification certificates.

The land will be granted under selection purchase lease, and at the end of six years, if the residence, cultivation, improvement, and all other conditions have been complied with, the lease will be indorsed under the seal of the Board of Land and Works to the effect that such conditions have been complied with, and at any time within the remaining period of 14 or 34 years (as the case may be) a Crown Grant will be issued on payment of the full amount of the purchase money.

Where survey fee exceeds £10, a deposit of £5 will be accepted and the balance in equal half-yearly instalments extending over a term of six years, and shall form part of the rent or instalments.

The amount of loading for roads, &c. (One shilling and eightpence per acre) is to be collected in instalments of Two-pence per acre per annum over a term of ten years. Any portion of the loading not expended at the end of ten years will be refunded to the lessees.

The value per acre on each allotment set out in the Schedule hereto includes the amount of loading of One shilling and eightpence per acre.

The lease will contain (*inter alia*) conditions to the effect as follows:—

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land, if in the third class, to the value of Five shillings per acre before the end of the third year from the date of the lease, and the balance of Five shillings per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease. If in the fourth class, improvements to the value of Two shillings and sixpence per acre must be made on the land before the end of the third year from the date of the lease, and the balance of Two shillings and sixpence per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease.

That the lessee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sub-let, or part with the possession, or grant the use of the whole or any part of the allotment during the first six years of the term of the lease, and that after the first six years of the term of the lease the lessee shall not sell, transfer, assign, mortgage,

or sub-let the whole or any part of the allotment unless and until the lease has been indorsed under the seal of the Board to the effect that all the conditions and covenants of the lease during the first six years thereof have been complied with.

That a special condition shall be inserted in the lease and the Crown Grant, providing that the land referred to therein shall at all times be maintained and used for the purpose of residence or agriculture and grazing, and that no person will be permitted to subsequently acquire or hold, or have an interest in, more than 1,280 acres if the land be in class 1, 2,000 acres if the land be in class 2, 2,560 acres if the land be in class 3, 3,200 acres if the land be in class 4, and 8,000 acres if the land be in class 4A.

That the lessee or grantee or owner shall preserve the timber on, or plant an area of, not less than three per cent. of the total extent of his holding. (N.B.—Along the exposed boundary lines, viz., the western and southern, would be preferable.)

No person, unless specially authorized, will be permitted to clear timber from any portion of areas retained for the purpose of roads and wind-breaks.

Plans may be obtained at the Inquiry Office, Lands Department, Melbourne, and at Land Offices, St. Arnaud and Bendigo.

Intending applicants who hold qualification certificates may obtain warrants from any Land Officer authorizing the issue of a railway ticket free of charge for the purpose of inspecting the land.

## SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

## BY-LAW No. 31.

A By-law under the *Health Act* 1919 for fixing fees for the registration and renewal and transfer of registration of premises throughout the shire of Braybrook.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1919 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Braybrook, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers thereof, hereby orders and enacts that from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation—

1. The fees for granting or annual renewal of registration of premises shall be as follows:—

*Nature of Premises, Fees.*

Offensive trades premises—Five pounds.

Boarding-houses—Ten shillings.

Common lodging-houses—Ten shillings.

Eating-houses—Ten shillings.

Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings.

2. The fee for any transfer of registration shall be Two shillings and sixpence.
