PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 568 of the *Local Government Act 1915* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* declare that the provisions of Division 2 of Part XXII. of the said Act shall apply to and be of full force and effect in any municipal district from and after a date to be specified in such Proclamation not being within six months from the date of such Proclamation, and that, except in pursuance of a Proclamation under the said section, the said Act shall not have any force or effect in any municipal district: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, under the hereinbefore recited powers and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation declare that the provisions of Part XXII. of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall apply to and be of full force and effect in the municipality of the borough of Mentone and Mordialloc from and after the first day of October, 1922.
